The Rockliff Liberal Government will invest \$10 million to upgrade TFES volunteer infrastructure, including \$2 million to upgrade the SES vehicle fleet.

Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management, Felix Ellis, said the Tasmanian Liberal Government is committed to invest-

ing in contemporary infrastructure to support our dedicated SES and TFS emergency services throughout Tasmania.

"We know how critical it is to equip our volunteer fire and emergency workers with the infrastructure they need to do what they do best – protecting Tasmanians," Minister Ellis said.

"Today we are joined by the SES on the North-West Coast to showcase one of the upgraded vehicles as part of our commitment to supporting emergency services through infrastructure investments.

"The new vehicles are custom-designed and fabricated by DPFEM's talented Engineering and Fleet Services in Cambridge to suit the needs of the SES responders to provide first class rescue services to the region.

"Upgrading the SES vehicle fleet was identified as a priority in consultation with SES and TFS volunteers and this investment is assisting with fleet modernisation.

"SES volunteers primarily provide on-theground support in emergencies such as flood and storm, and these upgrades will allow our members to continue to provide that support.

"By upgrading the SES vehicle fleet, the Rockliff Liberal Government is ensuring our members have access to the best possible vehicles and equipment that allows them to continue helping our community when in need and supporting our emergency service partners.







TasWater

In mid-January 2024, TasWater will begin the construction of a new sewage pump station on the corner of Maria Street and Sebastian Rise, Swansea.

This section of Swansea's sewerage network often overflows following heavy rains, with the pump station quickly filling and backing up with stormwater to the adjacent manholes. The new pump station will include underground emergency storage tanks and new pumps to capture and better manage the stormwater inflows.

Tasmanian contractor One Earth Excavations will be doing the work for TasWater, which will continue Monday to Friday from 7am to 5pm until the middle of the year.

TasWater Capital Delivery office Project Manager Scott Burley said the new pump station would be an enormous improvement.

"We're going to significantly reduce the risk of overflows in this area," Mr Burley said.

"The old pump station was built when the area was quite different and has no emergency storage in it at all."

Locals should expect some delays due to temporary traffic controls during construction. Construction on the new Maria Street Sewage Pumping Station was previously expected in the first half of 2023, but was paused following a reconsideration of the design to ensure it continues to meet Swansea's needs into the future.

MAST has launched its new Summer Safety Campaign for 2023-24, based around the overall theme: "Be Boatwise – Don't Let The Next Trip Be Your Last."

That may seem a touch bleak, but we really want all watercraft users to understand that the decisions they make – on and off the water – are critical to their safety and that of their crew.

One of our focuses for the summer and beyond is the number of paddlers we are seeing on our waterways Statewide. We know that every Christmas and major holiday season like Easter, more and more paddlecraft are purchased.

Paddling – whether it be in a kayak, a ski or a stand-up paddleboard (SUP) – is great fun, a great sport and wonderful for general fitness.

But the reality is, boaters often can't see paddlers in the water, and can come dangerously close, particularly at dusk.

Paddlers must wear their life jackets – as well as to have a tether to their craft. MAST also encourages paddlers to wear bright clothing.

And if you're paddling in the early morning or at dusk – have the required lights – so you can be seen.

When you go paddling, tell someone where you're going and when you plan to be back; carry your phone in a waterproof pouch.

Too often we are seeing paddlers set off down the coast or a river with the wind at their back. On their return, paddling into the wind, they can run out of steam very quickly and get into serious trouble. This summer, we will be airing a range of ads across various media platforms, including television, radio, Facebook, Instagram and YouTube.

The ads are focused on:

- Make the Right Decision every time you go onto the water, you have decisions to make
- Should I go out? Is the weather ok not just now but in a few hours time?
 When I go out, am I wearing my serviced life jacket. Is my safety gear handy? Does some one know where I'm going and how long I will be?
- Boating Alone Many Tasmanians like to go boating alone

Tasmanians like to go fishing, pick up their craypots or just to take your boat out for a spin – on their own.

It's safer to take a mate with you. But

It's safer to take a mate with you. But if you go out alone - make the right decisions.

Wear a life jacket; clip on a safety harness if you are on a larger yacht sailing single handed; have your kill switch ready.

Check the weather; tell someone where you're going and when you plan to be back.

- Life Jackets wearing life jackets is compulsory in Tasmania.
- We all know life jackets can save your life."
- But we need to get your inflatable serviced, regularly
- It's not a life jacket if it doesn't work

All of these messages are fairly selfevident. But far too often, we see Tasmanian boaties making the wrong decisions, putting themselves and their families at risk.

At MAST, we want everyone to enjoy themselves on the water – and come home safely.


