

TASMANIA'S BUSHFIRE PREPAREDNESS 2022.

With the bushfire season now upon us, Tasmania is well prepared to respond and keep Tasmanians safe.

While the overall assessment for the 21/22 Bushfire Season is for a "normal" fire season, this means we will, and already have had, bushfires and Total Fire Ban days — because that is "normal" for our state during the summer months.

To better respond to bushfires, protect our communities and to support our hardworking and dedicated firefighters on the ground, the Government recognises the importance of having access to a sophisticated, flexible, aerial firefighting capability.

This is why our firefighting capacity has already been bolstered with the addition of our summer aviation fleet, through the collaboration of the Tasmanian and Australian Governments who jointly fund the aircraft through the National Aerial Firefighting Centre.

Tasmania now has an additional 12 specialised aircraft on hand to help fight fires from above, including a mix of firebombing, air supervision and aerial intelligence gathering aircraft. Eight are helicopters and four are fixed wing planes.

Importantly, the aircraft are strategically positioned right across Tasmania so that they can be moved quickly to respond to fires, with 20 local aircraft also available to call on to assist when required, taking our total firefighting aircraft available in Tasmania to 32.

This will ensure a rapid response to bushfires when they start, keeping fires small until our ground crews arrive.

The Tasmania Fire Service, Parks and Wildlife Service and Sustainable Timber Tasmania have also been preparing for this season through our Fuel Reduction Program, which is nation leading in its tenure blind, strategic risk-based approach.

This Government has already invested \$55 million in fuel reduction, and over the forward estimates we will deliver another \$48.3 million to reduce the risk of bushfires.

As we have seen from the recent Sisters Beach fire, fuel reduction burns greatly assist to reduce the impact of bushfires. The Sisters Beach fire was halted by three fuel reduction burns that had already been undertaken by the Parks and Wildlife Service and TFS.

The Government is also diversifying its approach to fuel reduction, with \$2.5 million provided through the Program to support mechanical clearing in places where burning isn't appropriate.

Our specialist remote area firefighting capability has also been bolstered, with 144 TFS Remote Area Firefighters trained and capable of supporting our partner agencies in remote and isolated areas, such as the Parks and Wildlife Service who have approximately 134 personnel trained to fight fires in remote areas.

While the TFS, Parks and Wildlife Service and Sustainable Timber Tasmania are well prepared for the bushfire season, we are urging the Tasmanian community to do the same, because we cannot afford to be complacent about the dangers of bushfire.

To help keep our community safe, Tasmanians are encouraged to complete their own 5-minute bushfire plan.

An easy-to-use template is available on the TFS website and is an excellent resource to get Tasmanians of all ages thinking about what you will need to do if a bush-fire occurs near you.

Being prepared can make it less stressful and may reduce the impact it has on you and your loved ones if a bushfire does occur near you.

Don't wait until it's too late, please go to fire.tas.gov.au to do your 5-minute bush-fire plan now.

The Tasmanian Liberal Government is committed to keeping Tasmanians safe from the threat of bushfires, which is why we are investing \$111.5 million over the forward estimates for bushfire prevention, response and safety measures.

COMMENTARY – ON THE DRAFT ANNUAL REPORT PRESENTED AT THE COUNCIL AGM IN DEC. 2021

A positive Report was presented but the "Elephant in the Room" was ignored. Other than a couple of remarks about "the difficult but responsible decisions made by Council" not a single mention of the pathetic lack of sound local governance. The Report goes on "We function as a best practice governance organisation. We are fit for the future! " Hopefully GSBC has learnt from its mistakes and this statement will come true.

In the middle of a pandemic Councillors accepted the advice, regarding the supposed "Financial Precipice", from the financial consultant and General Manager and then with no community involvement/consultation and a high degree of stealth voted to accept their solution of changing the rating methodology from AAR to AAV.

Councillors were told that the continuing usage of AAR was not possible as GSBC did not have a valid Annual Certificate from the Director of Local Government (to authorize AAR) and there was insufficient time to get that Certificate as well as complying with the extensive list of directives under The Local Government Act 1993 for using AAR.

Informal advice from a legal entity was used to validate the information despite there being no verbal transcript of that advice provided and certified by the General Manager – a legislated requirement . A hard copy of further advice from that legal entity, dated 31st May 2021, was finally produced but not shown to Councillors until it was printed in the Council meeting Minutes some 4 months after the

At the 14th December 2021 Glamorgan Spring Bay Council meeting Clr. 

voting took place and only then only in response to a "questions on notice".

That further advice was not definitive and the legal entity advised he needed copies of the original 2012 Certificate of AAR and details of the historical usage of AAR by GSBC. That information was not provided and hence incomplete advice was the result.

The Director of Local Government confirmed: The AAR Certificate for GSBC was a "one off" authorization Certificate to use AAR in GSBC, where the extensive requirements of The Local Government ACT 1993 had been previously met – 2012. It was not an annual renewable application/Certificate and GSBC was fully entitled and authorized to continue using AAR until they opted to change. Information from high level, experienced, Local Government financial experts confirmed GSBC was able to continue using AAR for that financial year and that any "Financial Deficits" could have been easily fixed by adjusting the rates under AAR. Doubts were raised that GSBC would need to carry out some minor "calculations" had it remained on AAR according to the General Manager. GSBC had 12 months since the previous setting of the rates to investigate and arrange for those calculations and under the rules of the LG ACT 1993 - "A Council can set its own rates as it sees fit", so adding a percentage increase across the AAR rates base was possible and no calculations were required unless additional AAR Localities were being considered.

Put simply there was no need to change from AAR to AAV other than to meet the wishes of the General Manager and/or the financial consultant. Brighton, George Town and GSBC were fully entitled to continue using AAR had they so desired.

George Town Council carried out an inde-

pendent financial review of AAR versus AAV and decided firmly in favour of remaining with AAR – that was good Governance (making an informed decision). Brighton has overwhelming ratepayer support for using AAR as did GSBC yet our councillors were coerced into changing to AAV with no ratepayer communication, consultation nor mandate. Do not dismiss the time, effort and communications that went into GSBC opting for AAR as their rating system in 2012 – a fair democratic result overturned now.

Councillors failed to carry out their own due diligence, relied upon advice provided without insisting on appropriate certification, did not carry out or arrange for an actual financial impact assessment across a broad base of ratepayers nor considered if "AAV - the definition as an indicator of a persons ability to pay a higher tax" was fair and equitable given the Local Government Act 1993 was written in 1993 Instead they relied on - "well 27 Councils out of 29 now use AAV so it must be a fairer option". What if three Councils were right and we were one of them? Some Councillors used their own perception of wealth/ability to pay (based on their own circumstances) and failed to consider who are the actual "wealthy" ratepayers. The result is that pensioners are now subsidising wealthy shack owners, Airbnb accommodation owners, property developers and interstate investors. Fair and equitable? No poor governance.

Council elections are due in 2022 and Councillors will be judged on their past actions. There are three Petitions tabled in Parliament awaiting response and a continuing requirement for ongoing reporting to the Director of Local Government so It would be unwise for GSBC to "pat itself on the back" just yet and forward planning for the budget should take this situation into account.

Having corresponded with both The State Grants Commissioner and State Treasury It is abundantly clear that there is no correlation between the allocation of Grants Funding and the system of rates employed by a Council - There was no "Financial Precipice" in the Grants allocation. The mystery - 10% annual reduction was a "safety cap" to introduce change steadily – something GSBC failed to comprehend when they set our individual ratepayer "safety cap" at a ludicrous 99% (unheard of anywhere in Australia).

It should be noted at this point that our Mayor attempted to downplay the validity of the 1000 + signatures on the Parliamentary Petitions by stating – in The Mercury - "some people thought they were signing a Covid 19 checkin". How dare he denigrate the hard working Clerk of the Parliament who spent many hours authenticating those very signatures. Excellent PR communications from a Mayor who couldn't even answer the simple question "how much did you rates rise Mr. Mayor" on the ABC.

This might be a good point to remind Councillors that they were elected to "represent" ratepayers – not to rule over them. The Mayor was elected to ensure those ratepayer wishes conveyed by the Councillors were considered and enabled if valid. The General Manager is an employee of the Council only. His role is to execute the decisions of the elected Council by providing either the funding or resources required.

Yes the decision made was "difficult" but was it really needed or could the AAR rate been simply adjusted and any revenue deficiency rectified without the community anger and divide?


