

STAMPING OUT ANIMAL CRUELTY IN STATE'S ABATTOIRS

The Tasmanian Liberal Government demands the highest standards of animal welfare in all our livestock processing operations.

Minister for Primary Industries and Water, Jo Palmer said this Government will accept no less.

"Significant work is underway to improve animal welfare outcomes in livestock processing, particularly in our abattoirs," Minister Palmer said.

"Biosecurity Tasmania immediately commenced an investigation when the footage was first provided in November last year.

"The footage has been reviewed by qualified animal welfare experts, including the Department's veterinarians.

"The footage has been discussed with the operators and a number of employees, together with facility owners, have also been interviewed, informing further inspections and lines of inquiry.

A detailed investigation is ongoing into the five premises shown in the footage and it is not appropriate for further comments to be made on the investigation at this stage.

"But I can advise that inspections, and unannounced visits into other processing facilities continue to be undertaken by Biosecurity Tasmania," Minister Palmer said.

The Tasmanian Government has also committed to make video surveillance mandatory in every processing facility.

"The Taskforce that I established in late 2023 and includes representation from the RSPCA, TasFarmers, Sprout, Dairy Tas and the Australian Meat Industry Council, is looking into regulatory mechanisms that will enable video surveillance to be mandated as a priority," Minister Palmer said.

"Biosecurity is looking at what legislative changes will be required to make video surveillance mandatory. This work will also consider the conditions of video surveillance, including viewing and quality requirements."

A Reference Group has also been established with industry to support the introduction of changes.

"Felicity Richards chaired the first meeting of the Reference Group last week and the practicalities of the introduction of video surveillance into even the smallest facilities was discussed at length," Minister Palmer said.

"I am advised that all but around nine of the abattoirs, slaughterhouses and knackeries in Tasmania have voluntarily installed video surveillance in their facilities," Minister Palmer said.

"This Taskforce is developing a new Tasmanian standard, guidelines and a strategy to achieve strong animal welfare practices and meet the expectations of both the Tasmanian livestock processing industry and the community."

The Taskforce is meeting fortnightly, with the next meeting scheduled for tomorrow.

1000 Hearts was started by Tasmanian Care Giver, Sarah De Jong. In 2016 Sarah hand stitched a thousand hearts to be given away in random acts of kindness. Little did she know the power of these little hearts which people carried as talisman of love, giving hope and comfort.

1000 Hearts is now a global movement as lots of people (now known as Heartists) started sewing and distributing hearts, creating a community of kindness, connection and healing.

Swansea resident, Lee Bennett, became aware of the 1000 Hearts project after a family tragedy which sadly saw her precious grandson badly injured. Motivated to do something to thank, and honour his care givers, Lee set a goal to sew a thousand hearts. Quickly realising she would need some help with this project, Lee soon recruited a group of eager helpers.

Swansea Heartists have so far sewn over 1,200 hearts that have been distributed to many organisations including May Shaw, St Johns Hospital Palliative Care, Ronald McDonald House Hobart, Austin Hospital Spinal Injury Melbourne and the Repatriation Hospital Rehab Unit.

Their hope is that the recipients of these little hearts will hold them in their hands when times are tough to give hope and comfort and to remind them that people really do care.



LETTERS TO THE EDITORIAL TEAM

Change !!! No one seems to like it, but in every aspect of life it is a given.

Disruption of habits and your everyday life is sometimes negative It doesn't have to be, and we always look at it as a positive!!

Saying this, I was somewhat surprised by the ill informed comments of the last edition of this publication.

In the last edition of the GOB Community news, the assumptions being made around the "sudden" closure of the Swansea Corner Store and other operational matters were unfounded, ill informed and so I feel compelled to address those matters.

The "sudden" closure was not sudden. This has been in the pipeline for a nearly 12 months. It is part of a longer term strategy to provide a redeveloped corner shop, but more importantly improve the retail offerings across the board.

This site is (in our eyes) no longer fit for purpose, and the people of Swansea and surrounding areas, <u>deserve better and more diversified</u> <u>shopping experiences</u>, as do visitors alike.

This is part of that long term plan. A mention of a Salamanca / Hill St type offering was mooted.... And that is exactly where the big picture is headed, and this is part of that process!!

It just takes a transitional change to work to that point, given the geographical and physical limitations Swansea has in relation to progressing matters forward.

Traffic: The Traffic will be no worse than it is today. There is extensive parking at Morris' to accommodate the increased patronage that will flow from Swansea Corner location, which has limited parking. Future developments on either site will have Council approved parking numbers, and the completely new supermarket earmarked for North Swansea will have extensive parking also.

The lack of communication is simply not correct. These are commercial in confidence matters, with considered decisions based on the long term vision of our company, our internal masterplan, and ensuring we meet all residents needs during any positions of change. We provided approximately a months notice, and raise the question of whether any shorter or longer period would change anything? I think not, given what we are replacing this with.

Community response has been very well received, and we are always welcoming to any discussion around genuine and legitimate concerns that may arise with the ongoing changes we make.

We are there to make the Swansea Community a better place, and that comes with change. We see this as positive change.

Swansea Corner will be covered with the new offering at Alimento at 2 Franklin St, which will cover off the Delicatessen aspect, rolls, sandwiches, coffee, papers bread and milk plus much, much more. Morris will extend its trading hours and its stock range, and will present rolls and sandwiches and many other things also. We already sell Valhalla and other items. Both venues will have roast chickens and a new premium range of over ready meals from our in-house kitchen and butchery!!!

Both open at 7am to fill that early morning void left with Swansea Corners change of use.

Again this is a long term vision to provide a substantially greater offering in the bottom of the original Morris' Store once we relocate to the new modern Supermarket.

To the writer of last weeks article specifically, we pride ourselves on transparency and consultation, but I am not a mind reader, nor have I never been directly approached about any of the concerns or claims raised, even after the notice of these changes were given. As such, I am somewhat miffed to how much more I can involve the Community, if we are not directly consulted ourselves outside of non factual claims.

I more than welcome any discussion around our visions and ongoing plans for the town, I only have to be approached!!!

As for Trevor, he isn't going anywhere far away and will head up our new reiteration of this site before the full long term development of the site, and Trev's team is part of the Red Panda Team, and we are retaining all staff.

We encourage you to get back to Trev's 'Hello" in the not too distant future at the new reiteration of the Swansea Corner site. It wont be "another Bottle Shop" but something vastly more interactive to showcasing Tasmanian, and local, wines spirits, and general produce!




