# CHANGES TO CHECK IN TASMANIAN APP REQUIREMENTS

FEWER VENUES NOW REQUIRED TO USE CHECK IN TAS QR CODES

From 6:00 pm Friday, 18 February 2022 only some businesses, venues and locations will be required to display Check in TAS QR codes and collect contact tracing information on behalf of the Department of Health.

The changes to Check in TAS are being made to better reflect Tasmania's current public health measures and in response to the ongoing pandemic.

Public Health have reviewed the Contact Tracing Direction and determined that lower-risk settings, where people spend less time and there is less risk of transmission, will no longer be required to use Check in TAS.

#### From 6:00 pm Friday 18 February, the Check in TAS app is still required to be used at:

- Gaming and gambling locations such as casinos and premises where there are gaming machines
- Gatherings approved under the Framework for COVID-19 Safe Events and Activities, for the duration of the event
- All pubs, bars, clubs, night clubs and hotels that are licensed premises or permit premises.

Which businesses, venues or locations should remove their Check in TAS QR code from display, and people no longer

#### need to check in to?

The locations no longer required to display their Check in TAS QR codes or have people check in to from 6:00 pm Friday, 18 February 2022 are:

- Accommodation locations Airports
- Tourist and tourism locations Cinemas, theatres, libraries, galler-
- ies, museums, historic sites, arenas, auditoriums and stadiums (unless required under the Events Framework), amusement parks, arcades, play centres, playgrounds, skate parks, zoos, wildlife centres, animal parks, petting zoos, aquariums, marine parks
- Fitness, sports and physical recreation locations such as gyms, health clubs, fitness centres, swimming pools, spas, saunas, ovals, sports fields/courts
- Restaurants, cafes and other food courts/businesses and outlets, mobile food vans (unless captured in an event under the Event Framework)
- Hair, beauty and personal care locations
- Health, medical and aged care locations
- Passenger transport services and locations Places of worship locations
- Retail locations

Businesses and venues that are no longer required to use Check in TAS, are asked remove signage from display including QR codes and any paper-based check-in used to collect contact information. The QR codes should be kept on hand in case they are required in the future.

Locations that are no longer required to use Check in TAS will also need to update their COVID Safety Plans to remove references to Check in TAS, and the need for patrons to check in.

BUSINESS & WORK-ERS STILL HURTING DESPITE GUTWEIN DECLARING TIMES ARE GOOD

More than 1,400 Tasmanian jobs were lost last month and workers continue to struggle to make ends meet as the Gutwein Government's lack of preparation for the fresh wave of COVID continues to bite.

Shadow Treasurer Shane Broad said in addition to the jobs that disappeared in January, Tasmania still had 2,000 fewer jobs today than before the pandemic and thousands of Tasmanian have given up looking for work, with the state's workforce participation rate down to 60 per cent - the same level as at the peak of the lockdowns in 2020 – and well behind the national rate of 66.2 per cent.

"Additionally, the latest ABS data shows the total number of hours worked across Tasmania fell by 5.1 per cent as people continue to lose shifts and struggle to make ends meet," Dr Broad said.

"The fact is Mr Gutwein is too distracted dealing with the chaos and disarray in his Cabinet to focus on the things that matter to Tasmanians – earning a fair wage and putting food on the table.

"Many businesses have been struggling to keep their doors open and provide hours for their employees.

"The government needs to act now and adopt Labor's Supporting Business, Supporting Jobs package which includes fundamental, workable solutions including providing eligible businesses a rebate of fixed network charges for their next power and water bills and a land tax rebate for those landlords who commit to passing this rent relief on to tenants.



As a relative newcomer to Swansea (7 years) I have been blown away by the services in Swansea, you certainly wouldn't be able to access all the assistance I have been given in Hobart.

Our small Community should be extremely proud. Thanks to everyone concerned.
