



AUSTRALIAN COUNCILS ALLOCATED \$500 MILLION IN FEDERAL FUNDING

The Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) has welcomed the fourth round of federal Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI) funding, which will provide \$500 million to Australian councils for community infrastructure and roads projects.

"These funding allocations will be welcomed by councils right across the nation and help them build and revitalise playgrounds, community centres, libraries and sporting facilities," said ALGA President Ĉr Linda Scott.

"The Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program has been extremely successful, and the direct delivery of funding to councils has ensured the quick and effective delivery of local projects."

Making the LRCI program permanent would enable councils to address the growing demand for new and revitalised community and road infrastructure and benefit every community.

However, Cr Scott said ALGA was concerned by the Government's intention to prioritise \$250 million in LRCI funding announced in the October 2022 Budget for regional, rural and outer urban area roads.

"All Australian councils are facing significant road maintenance issues, and ALGA will continue to advocate for the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program to be available to all local governments," said Cr Scott.

"Inner city and metropolitan councils are also facing road and infrastructure maintenance pressures, and ALGA's 2021 National State of the Assets report showed that \$17.8 billion of Australia's local roads are in poor condition.

"ALGA is seeking a \$300 million per year

increase in Roads to Recovery funding that would support all councils to address the poor state of our national road network.

"Recognising the additional challenges faced by disaster-impacted regional councils, ALGA has also proposed a new \$250 million per year fund that would support these councils to build back better.'





SWANSEA GENERAL PRACTICE **2023 COVID BOOSTER** VACCINATION

A COVID booster vaccination is recommended if you HAVE NOT had COVID infection or a COVID vaccination in the past six months. We will be holding COVID and Influenza vaccination clinics together in March or April depending on when the vaccines become available to us. If you wish to travel and would like a COVID vaccination prior to these clinics, they will be available at pharmacies in Hobart and Launceston. We will not be taking bookings; we will advise the community of the dates for "Walk-in" clinics via the local newsletter.

A 2023 COVID-19 booster dose is recommended for:

- all adults aged 65 years and over
- adults aged 18 64 years who have medical conditions that increase their risk of severe COVID

A 2023 COVID-19 booster dose should also be considered (and will be available for) for:

- all Adults aged 18-64 years without risk factors for severe COVID-19
- children and adolescents aged 5-17 years who have medical conditions or disabilities that increase their risk of severe COVID

COVID booster doses are not recommended at this time for children and adolescents aged under the age of 18 who do not have any risk factors for severe COVID-19.

Medical conditions that increase the risk of severe COVID include (but are not limited to):

- Patients with chronic disability
- Patients on immune suppression medications
- Patients receiving treatment for cancer Patients with leukaemia
- Patients with a cancer diagnosed in the

last 5 years

- Chronic kidney, heart, lung or liver disease
- Patients with diabetes
- Patients with neurological disease such as stroke or MS
- Patients with severe mental illness
- Overweight patients with BMI greater than 40

Remember, 2023 COVID booster is recommended ONLY if you haven't had a booster or a COVID infection in the past six months. If it has been less than 6 months it is recommended you wait until the full 6 months have passed before having this booster. There is no reason, however, to delay having your influenza vaccination.

AUSTRALIA'S CLIMATE IN 2022: WETTER AND WARMER THAN AVERAGE OVERALL

The Bureau of Meteorology has released its official record of Australia's climate and notable weather events for 2022.

The Annual Climate Statement for 2022 includes a full analysis and description of last year's rainfall, temperature, water resources, climate influences and more.

The report shows 2022 was a warm and wet year for most of Australia.

Australia's national mean temperature was 0.50 °C warmer than the 1961–1990 average, making 2022 the 22nd-warmest year on record (equal with 2006) since national temperature records began in 1910.

Annual maximum temperatures were above average for most of northern Australia, Tasmania and parts of the west coast but below average for New South Wales, southern Queensland and parts of South Australia.

Annual minimum temperatures were above or very much above average for most of Australia.

National rainfall was 26% above the 1961– 1990 annual average making 2022 the ninth-wettest year on record since 1900.

Rainfall was very much above average for the south-eastern quarter of the mainland, where persistent rain saw significant flooding affecting large areas, multiple times during the year.

Spring in 2022 was the second-wettest on record for Australia, and the wettest on record for the Murray–Darling Basin, for New South Wales and for Victoria.

Rainfall was below average for western Tasmania, much of the north of the Northern Territory, and the far south-west of Western Australia.

Water storage levels have been high across much of Australia during 2022, although some storages were still low for parts of central coast Queensland, western Tasmania, south-east New South Wales and western Victoria.

The high rainfall experienced across much of eastern Australia was consistent with a wet phase of natural climate variability for our region – namely a La Niña, a negative Indian Ocean Dipole in winter and spring, and a persistently positive phase of the Southern Annular Mode from midautumn.

The 2022–23 La Niña has been the third in a row. It is only the fourth time 3 La Niña events in a row have been observed in the Bureau record since 1900 (others were 1954–57, 1973–76 and 1998–2001).

The Bureau's official annual record of climate can be used by governments, businesses and communities to better understand the weather events that impacted them over the calendar year. More information is available in the Annual Climate Statement 2022 on the <u>Bureau's website</u>.




