

# INDEPENDENTS GOOD OR BAD?

Community independents are individuals who want to enter politics to represent their communities. They are called community independents because they are not aligned with any political party or other organisation, and ideally they have always remained distant from political parties or lobby groups who try to influence governments.

Genuine independents see that their responsibility is to pay attention to what their community wants and to act on this in Parliament.

Tasmanians are going to the polls a year early on Saturday, March 23 to elect a new state government. There will be candidates from both major and smaller parties seeking election or re-election, but there will also be a number of individuals who are standing as independents in each electorate. For the first time in ten years, each electorate will have seven people in Parliament instead of five and this has encouraged more people to stand as independents.

In the event that neither major party wins at least 18 seats to form a majority government, the party with the most seats will be given the opportunity to demonstrate that they will have sufficient support from other members of Parliament to be able to form government. This is called minority government. The other major party will usually form the opposition, and the rest of those elected are referred to as the crossbenchers.

When this happens, the government usually has to negotiate with the other parties or with independents to get their legislation passed. This kind of government is common in many European countries. In Australia, the Liberal-National party coalition is a well-known example of long-standing minority government. In fact, in the early days of state and federal government minority governments were not uncommon as political parties took some time to emerge.

Historically, minority governments have not made a government unstable, although some people think they do. They simply force which ever major party is forming minority government to negotiate with the independents and any others on the cross bench. This kind of government can often lead to more transparency and accountability.

In Tasmania, and to a greater extent in federal government, independents have been successful in introducing legislation or having legislation amended to provide a better deal in meeting the

needs of their electorates. Community independents believe that politicians should work together to develop good policy and make the best decisions for their state or country.
