NOT SWANNING ABOUT: LOCAL KNOWLEDGE KEY TO RESTORING INTERNATIONALLY SIGNIFICANT TASMA-NIAN WETLANDS

Over 8000 resident black swans know just how important Moulting Lagoon and the Apsley Marshes are to birds and other wildlife. NRM South are working with local farmers, vineyards and conservation land managers such as the Tasmanian Land Conservancy, to restore and care for these internationally significant wetlands on Tasmania's east coast. NRM South, the natural resource management organisation for southern Tasmania, has also partnered with environmental organisation Nature Glenelg Trust (NGT) and local land managers to assess how modified drainage on properties adjacent to the wetlands has impacted important wetland vegetation, and to put actions in place to restore these sites. As part of this Australian Government

funded project, local knowledge, historical data and modern technology have been woven together to create a picture of how the ecology and water flows at the wetlands have changed over the last two centuries. Armed with this information, NGT have been able to develop a plan for restoring the natural flows on two adjacent properties, which in turn will help to restore the health of these wetlands and give them the best chance of adapting to an anticipated future rise in sea levels. Laurel McGinnity, Senior Project Officer for NRM South, has been working closely with NGT and local land managers to coordinate the restoration works. 'Our primary aim is to 'knit' the system back together', explained Laurel. 'Once natural flows are restored, we'll see the landscape gradually returning to a more natural state, and the physical impacts of old structures like drains and levee banks will lessen.'

Restoration work will bring immediate benefits to five hectares of saltmarsh and open up broader opportunities for saltmarsh regeneration. It will also permanently remove ongoing eco-hydrological impacts to 80 hectares of saline grassland and saltmarsh. These restoration works are currently underway. Local knowledge has been critical to

building a complete understanding of the

drainage history of the wetlands and NRM South and their project partners would like to thank the landholders, University of Tasmania staff and the wider community who have all contributed their knowledge to the project. This project is supported by NRM South through funding from the Australian Government's National Landcare Program and runs until June 2023.

LETTERS TO THE EDITORIAL TEAM

YOUR COUNCIL RATES

Our Petitions to the State Government, regarding the actions of Glamorgan Spring Bay Council and last year's undemocratic implementation of a new method of calculating municipal rates, have finally been answered. I thank the Hon. Michael Ferguson for his response to those Petitions.

My summary of the response received: The Minister acknowledged our concerns but the matter was deemed "operational" and thus an issue between the ratepayers and the Council. Local Government is deemed "a separate sphere of Government" and one where State Government is reluctant to be involved let alone overturn a decision (the rates) made by a group of democratically elected Councillors, even if their deliberations were based on information proven to be false. In the words of the Minister "I am not satisfied that this operational matter justifies the establishment of a Board of Inquiry under the ACT 1993".

Council has been instructed to report to the Director of Local Government, on a six monthly basis, outlining their strategic, asset and financial plans including how these plans are informing current Council decisions. The reports are to also include advice on strategies and actions being taken to promote community confidence in Council, including consultation.

Given what has occurred it is clear that we, as ratepayers, can no longer sit back and place our trust in the elected Councillors to make important decisions on our behalf. The role of an elected Councillor is to consult with the ratepayers and bring the community concerns and ideas to the Council for consideration. We do not elect Councillors to "rule" over us but to "represent" us and to present our views to Council in order to steer current and future paths for Council.

The role of our Mayor is critical given he/ she is tasked with gathering community input, via the elected councillors, and instructing the General Manager in the desired outcomes. It is the General Managers role to enable those desired outcomes and to structure our business and finances accordingly. The General Manager is an employee of the Council and is not empowered to direct Council on policy issues or directional issues. He can advise on those issues, if requested by the Councillors, but is not the policy maker in the Glamorgan Spring Bay municipality.

The key failure has been "community consultation" or rather the lack of that said consultation. As ratepayers we deserve to have input into decisions that affect us and that input must be considered openly and fairly. Consultation is not a one way communication where the General Manager tells the ratepayers what is going to occur – like it or not

I recently met with the Council management team and was informed that Council was carrying out rates modelling for the new financial year and that three proposals for the new rates would be presented to the ratepayers before the Councillors voted upon them. Just a few weeks later and once again the goal posts shifted and the above will not occur according to the General Manager.

Given it appears very easy for the Council to run riot over individual ratepayers, now would seem an appropriate time to for a **municipal wide "ratepayers and residents" representative association** to form (as many other LGA residents have done previously). Please keep an eye out for further information as this association begins and I invite all to consider joining so that the future directions of our council can be set by true, representative information and guidance.

We see the ratepayers and residents association as a vehicle to aid the elected councillors in assessing the true community support/or otherwise for issues raised by Council and a method for the community to inform the Council of ratepayers wishes given it is our municipality and our money they are spending.

Are you prepared to accept further rates rises? Talk to your elected Councillor now, email the General Manager and put forward your position now, don't wait until it is too late.

Let us all join and "inform" council that we will not accept further rises without proper community consultation and input. WE ARE ALL ONE MUNICIPALITY SO LET US UNITE AND TAKE BACK CONTROL OF OUR FUTURE.




