To deliver on the expectations for both communities and visitors, it is important that a Master Plan is designed for the next 10 years that meets the requirements associated with visitor growth. East Coast Tasmania Tourism is seeking

way running parallel to the Great Eastern Drive providing a new cycling/walking experience. This ticks all the boxes of health and wellbeing, reducing carbon emissions and providing safe transport for both locals and visitors on the East Coast. The Great Eastern Drive requires urgent road upgrades (led by RACT). There have been many promises about improvement of our mobile coverage and internet connectivity and yet we still face the patchy/flaky connection. This is not good enough. There are signs along the Coast stating that it is coming soon... how many years is soon? Fast charging EV charging stations are the future. We need to develop a plan for future installations. East Coast Tasmania Tourism is seeking \$50.3 million over three years.

REGIONAL PRIORITY PROJECTS 2022 – 2025

In response to the Federal Budget process and the upcoming Federal Election East Coast Tasmania Tourism is seeking funds to launch our tourism industry for the next 10 years of innovation, solutions and placemaking for positive impact tourism in our region.

To return tourism on the East Coast to a healthy state, there will be considerable support required but integral to that recovery is the support to develop the Regional Priority Projects included in this document.

The Regional Priority Projects proposal is a combined investment of \$61,550,000 over three years*.

1. Master Plan for Placemaking

A Community Master Plan is required to meet the needs of East Coast visitors and locals alike – a strategy that allows for placemaking.

We know that with the increase in visitors likely arising from the new Spirits, coupled with the fantastic experiences on the East Coast, that our East Coast destinations will only increase in popularity.

Events, like the Dragon Trail Mountain Biking competition, and the Great Eastern Wine Week, are building on all that our region has to offer - white sandy secluded beaches, convict ruins, adventure activities and awesome wine and food.

\$300,000 over three years to deliver a master plan that is based on tourism but benefits our regional communities - a master plan for placemaking.

2. Housing helps to alleviate Staff Shortages

Short term solutions coupled with long term investment are required on Tasmania's East Coast to alleviate the pressure of affordable staff housing shortages. When we ask our tourism industry on Tasmania's East Coast what is a chief concern for their business - they tell us that staff shortages keep them awake at night.

As we recover from COVID and our borders open the tourism industry needs people to help our businesses to thrive. Without a place to stay and live, people that are attracted to work on our East Coast, simply will not be able to.

From rates relief grants for housing owners to co-investment grants for developers we require a sustainable plan to assist with staff housing. East Coast Tasmania Tourism is seeking \$8.6 million over three years to deliver these projects for our industry and community alike.

3. Experience Infrastructure

A mix of both new experiences and quality existing infrastructure are best placed to attract visitors and provide products that are innovative, safe and in keeping with the promise of touring in the region.

4. Innovative Solutions for Visitors and for our Planet

Sustainable tourism is a cornerstone for all East Coast Tasmania has to offer. The tourism industry on the East Coast is set to implement any number of solutions to work towards zero emissions – something that visitors to our region will soon demand.

The East Coast industry stands ready to be a pilot destination for implementing carbon neutral solutions. We can be the leaders in this era of sustainability and truly reach carbon neutrality for our visitors and the planet alike.

The East Coast is seeking funding to implement visitor solutions that do not involve bricks and mortar for experiences, instead we seek to implement virtual information centres and storytelling expertise that are held within the mobiles of our visitors.

East Coast Tasmania Tourism is seeking \$2.75 million over three years to be innovators for tourism implementing solutions for our planet and for our visitors.
