Special Climate
Statement 76 Extreme rainfall
and flooding in
South-East
Queensland and
eastern New South
Wales, FebruaryMarch 2022

The Bureau of Meteorology has released a formal record of the extreme rainfall and flooding that occurred in south-east Queensland and eastern New South Wales in February and March this year.

Special Climate Statement 76 outlines that several rainfall records were broken between 22 February and 9 March 2022, with more than 50 sites recording more than one metre of rainfall in one week.

In the last week of February, parts of south -east Queensland and north-east New South Wales had rainfall 2.5 times their monthly average with some regions recording more than five times their monthly average.

After two years of La Niña conditions, the rain fell on saturated catchments leading to flash and riverine flooding extending from Maryborough in Queensland to Grafton in New South Wales.

For many areas, this was the wettest week since at least 1900. Some areas of southeastern Queensland had their highest flood peaks since 1893, though the lower Brisbane and Bremer rivers and Lockyer Creek peaked below the levels of both January 1974 and January 2011 floods.

In parts of northern New South Wales, flood levels broke previous records. Wilsons River in Lismore peaked at a record high level, estimated to be 14.4 m on 28 February. The previous record was 12.27 m in February 1954.

The rainfall was the result of a combination of weather systems over eastern Australia and the Tasman Sea, where a large volume of humid tropical air moving onshore over eastern Australia was lifted in the atmosphere to produce heavy rain and thunderstorms.

In recent decades, there has been a trend towards a greater proportion of high-intensity, short-duration rainfall events, especially across northern Australia.

The Bureau's special climate statements provide detailed summaries of significant weather and climate events that impact Australians. This Special Climate Statement has been added to an archive of Special Climate Statements dating back more than 15 years, providing easy access to data and information.

ASTHMA AUSTRALIA LAUNCHES WINTER BREATHING SUP-PORT CAMPAIGNS

Residents of Tasmania who struggle to breathe well through the colder months can access support measures from Asthma Australia.

The cold seasons bring common asthma triggers like cold air, common viruses including flu, coronavirus infections, unhealthy heaters and smoke from woodfired heating.

Asthma Australia CEO of Michele Goldman is encouraging parents and those affected to give 1800 ASTHMA experts a phone call to cover all bases and visit the organisation's website for further helpful information.

"The colder weather at this time of year can really create difficulties and frustrations for those with asthma, leading to symptoms like tightness in the chest, breathing difficulties, wheezing, and in the worst cases, increased numbers of hospitalisations and deaths," Asthma Australia CEO Michele Goldman said.

Asthma affects around 66,000 adults and children in Tasmania, many of whom struggle to breathe comfortably through the colder months.

FIRST NATIONS HISTORY RECOGNISED WITH DUAL NAME FOR TASMANIAN AIR POLLUTION STATION

The Bureau of Meteorology's Cape Grim Baseline Air Pollution station in north-west Tasmania will now incorporate the area's First Nations name of Kennaook.

Kennaook (pronounced Ken-nah-ook) is understood to be the traditional name in the Aboriginal language once spoken in the north and north-west Tasmania. First Nations people referred to the area as Kennaook for thousands of years, although its precise meaning and origin remains unknown.

Bureau of Meteorology's Sam Cleland, who manages the Baseline Air Pollution station, said there is a rich history in the station's vicinity, evidenced by hut depressions and nearby middens.

"The Bureau sees enormous value in acknowledging the First Nations heritage in this area as a mark of respect," Mr Cleland said.

"The Bureau is committed to being a Bureau for all Australians and incorporating the original spoken language of the north and north-west Aboriginal nations from Circular Head is one way the organisation is delivering on that commitment.

"This is just one step on the bigger journey towards reconciliation, in line with the Bureau's Reconciliation Action Plan to build respectful relationships and opportunities with First Nations peoples."

Its use as part of the station's official name was endorsed by the Circular Head Aboriginal community to honour their ancestors and serves as a reminder of the area's rich First Nations history.

Acting General Manager of the Circular Head Aboriginal Corporation Dianne Baldock said renaming the Kennaook / Cape Grim Air Pollution station provides a stronger connection with her ancestors' land.

"I get a lot of people coming up to me to ask what Kennaook means, and it makes me proud to reply that it's from a language that has lived here for a very long time," she said.

"When I take people out to Kennaook, I always ask them to meditate on how they feel about walking in the steps of the ancestors there, and now we've got recognition of these ancestors in the place's name."

The station analyses air samples to record the composition of the pristine air from the Southern Ocean, unaffected by local pollution sources, to chronicle the driving forces behind climate change and stratospheric ozone depletion. It also records valuable weather and climate information such as temperature, rainfall, wind, humidity and solar radiation. Measurements taken at Cape Grim are particularly valuable as they define how the composition of the global atmosphere has changed, and how it continues to change.

The Bureau also maintains an online Indigenous Weather Knowledge platform providing education about, and preservation of, Indigenous peoples' relationships with the weather, water, oceans and climate.







Powerful cold front and low-pressure system to impact south-east Australia this week.

Much of southern and eastern Australia will be impacted by a strong cold front and associated low pressure system from Sunday and into next week.

Communities in Western Australia, south-east South Australia, Victoria, Tasmania and eastern New South Wales will likely be impacted by these weather systems.

The main effects will be a rapid transition into a wintry weather pattern just in time for 1 June, with below-average temperatures, showers, low-level snow and brisk winds.

Some communities will experience the coldest temperatures of the year so far.

The cold front may bring strong southerly potentially damaging winds, a drop in temperatures and snow to as low as 700 metres Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning.

Small hail and cold weather thunderstorms (mainly over maritime areas) are possible.

The Bureau is recommending communities stay up to date with the latest Bureau warnings through the Bureau's <u>website</u> and BOM Weather app and follow the advice of emergency services
