EAST COAST LEGENDS RECOGNISED FOR THEIR VOLUNTEERING

As part of National Volunteer Week celebrations, Community Transport Services Tasmania acknowledged the service given to the community by St Helens resident Graeme Chandler, and Cheryl and Bill Hodgetts from Swansea.

Graeme has provided 15 years' service, while Cheryl and Bill have given 10 years while transporting members of the community.

Graeme joined CTST in 2008 and knows firsthand the service that CTST provides the community. After a serious motorbike accident that put him out of the workforce, Graeme and his wife relied on CTST and taxis to get to rehab.

"At the time I was going through counselling, and it was recommended to me that I should volunteer in some area. My wife and I both realised how essential community transport was for us and I wanted to do something. I love it," Graeme said.

"We live in a small community ourselves and it's central to have access in a small

community. Getting older people out is essential for their wellbeing too."

"Volunteering is good for my mental wellbeing. I would stay home otherwise. I need it as much for myself as the people I help. It makes me feel useful."

Graeme regularly drives for CTST's group social outings program, 'Out and Abouts', which includes trips to locations such as Hobart, New Norfolk, and Launceston.

Graeme also helps with personal transport driving people to medical appointments, shopping, social events, and outings.

For Cheryl and Bill Hodgetts, who have each given 10 years of service to CTST, volunteering was a way to help older people in their community.

"It's good talking to older people and helping them out, because a lot of people would be completely lost without the service," Cheryl said.

"We thought by giving our time to CTST, that when we're too old to drive there might be someone around who could drive us too."

Chief Executive Officer of CTST, Lyndon Stevenson, believed it was important to recognise the service volunteers had played in their community and the organisation.

"We are grateful to have Graeme, Bill and Cheryl volunteer with us and they have provided a great deal to keeping their community connected," Lyndon said.

"Graeme, Bill, and Cheryl display all the characteristics we are looking for in being a volunteer – friendliness, commitment and a willingness to help their community stay connected.

"We thank them, and all our volunteers right around the state for the work they do. These awards are our way to reflect, acknowledge and thank them for the service."

Thirty CTST volunteers located around the state were recognised for giving five or more years' service to CTST and their community.

STATE GRANTS COMMISSION FUNDING AND GSBC'S BUDGET

We are a group of ratepayers who are concerned that Glamorgan Spring Bay Council (GSBC) is attempting to deflect blame for rate increases to the State Grants Commission (SGC). Our interpretation is that GSBC funds are misallocated due to skewed spending priorities. We would like GSBC to justify their disproportionate spending on planning and administration and explain why it is so much higher than the per capita rate of other councils in Tasmania.

We have sent an extended version of this summary to GSBC Councillors, State politicians and the States Grant Commission. For the community we offer this summary. In the last few years, we have been repeatedly told that GSBC has not receiving our fair share of the State Grants Commission (SGC) grants. We have been told that this is why our rates must be increased. Tables that highlight the apparent discrepancy in grants have been circulated by GSBC in this and other publications. These tables imply that the Commission has made errors or that their decisions are biased or unfair. We have been told that GSBC have repeatedly questioned the SGC and relevant ministers but still do not understand why our share of SGC grants is less than some other councils. As far as GSBC ratepayers and residents are concerned, this is the 'State of the Nation'.

Having read the information on the [SGC website](#), we disagree and conclude that:

- It isn't difficult to understand how the SGC grants are calculated.

The SGC grants are based on National Principles; there is nothing untoward going on.

The grant in question is a needs-based grant. GSBC receives less of this funding because sufficient rates are collected to provide services to the average standard of all other councils in Tasmania.

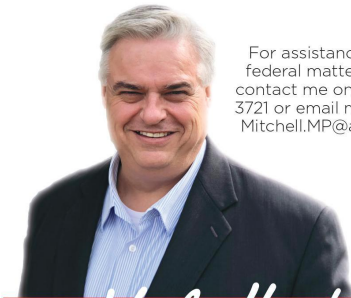

Council was not obliged to change to an AAV rating system. All we needed to do was charge enough rates to meet the average dollar charged for our AAV in Tasmania and we were able to do that under our old AAR rate system. We voted for that system a decade ago.

According to state-wide council averages, GSBC overspends on planning by \$2 million and administration by almost \$1 million and underspends on roads by over \$1 million.

The SGC website provides clear information to explain how grants are calculated (see [SGC methodology](#)). It doesn't take long to work through this information, nor any advanced degrees in finance. Anyone in small business could follow the methodology.

Each year the SGC provides an in-person explanation to council. It is unfathomable that, despite this, council financial and managerial staff are still unable to understand the calculations. We are concerned that this apparent misunderstanding is leading to poor budget decisions. Before Councillors vote on next year's budget, we have requested to be provided with detailed explanations about the administration and planning budgets. We also want to know why these services are prioritised while other services are slashed. We would like Councillors to consider how to better allocate our rate monies.

"Australia Post replied that if they had enough residents behind the change, they would consider a roadside service - so we pounded the pavement to get some signatures."
