

#### INTEGRITY COMMISSION RELEASES PROPOSED LOBBYING REFORMS

The Integrity Commission has detailed the information which would be made public under its proposed reforms to the framework governing lobbying in Tasmania. Under the new system public officials — both elected and employed — would need to disclose when they have been lobbied. They would also need to disclose the name of the person who lobbied them, when or how the discussion took place, and the topic of the lobbying.

Integrity Commission CEO Michael Easton said the reforms would be a significant win for transparency in Tasmania. "We are taking the opportunity to ensure lobbying of our State parliamentarians and senior officials is in keeping with good practice in other areas across Australia and internationally,"

Mr Easton said. "It is important that the public has access to information about lobbying activity, so that we can have confidence that decisions are being made in the public interest.

"The lobbying framework we are proposing will mean Tasmanians have better access to information about how lobbying influences decisions made by our elected officials and senior government officials, and politics more generally.

"Information about what lobbying activity has occurred would be made available on the Integrity Commission website, in close to real time."

Under the new system lobbyists would also have to declare if they have made a political donation, above the Tasmanian declaration threshold.

Finally, elected officials will be restricted from accepting meetings with lobbyists who have provided them with political advice during election campaigns. 



Dear Great Oyster Bay News,

Please see attached media release from Glamorgan Spring Bay Council in relation to Robyn Moore's open letter in the previous edition.

Dear Robyn

As General Manager I am responding to the questions on Council's behalf and with the permission of the Mayor.

Firstly, Council does fully understand the methodology for the State Grants Commission (SGC) base grants, the outputs are not in dispute. However, we firmly believe that the underlying formulas are flawed and should be reviewed to make them more equitable. This is clear by the distinct difference in funding allocation that Glamorgan Spring Bay Council (GSBC) receives compared to all other Councils. I am sure residents would agree that if this was fair, it would reduce the need for higher rate increases, and or improved service delivery. Whichever way one looks at the allocation of base grants to 29 Councils -Glamorgan Spring Bay Council is not getting its fair share.

Secondly in regard to your assertion of the overspending in Planning and Community Amenities, it is important to understand that category is made up of two distinct classes of expenditure. The first one being 'Community and Regional Development'. This incorporates the traditional planning, building and plumbing statutory requirements. The second class is 'Community Amenities' which covers outlays on administration, provision, operation etc of street lighting, crematoria, cemeteries, public conveniences and other public amenities. The break down of this expenditure is approximately 50% for each class.

Each Council has differing services within its municipal area and when completing the Consolidated Data Collection (CDC) survey may allocate expenditure inconsistently. This could be evidenced, by GSBC's allocation being higher for some classes, but lower for others. Furthermore the difference between the actual and adjusted figures you point out below, is not an overspend. This is just the allocation of expenditure the SGC uses to attempt to standardise the state spending for each expenditure category based on the 2021 census to determine population. It is not to be interpreted as like for like as some municipal areas would receive some expenditure allocation for services they do not provide. For example, Devonport received adjusted expenditure of \$1,267,985 for Health Housing & Welfare while we only received an allocation of \$235,840. Devonport does not support 3 medical

practices however, they receive a large expenditure allocation for this category based on the higher population of the area. Our actual 'health' expenditure including medical is approx. \$1.8M, where Devonport actual 'health' expenditure is approx. \$200K. When this actual cost is standardised' in the SGC formula, based on population from the Census 2021, this turns into GSBC health adjusted expenditure of \$200K and Devonport adjusted expenditure is \$1.2M. This inverse relationship is influenced substantially by the Devonport Census population of 25k vs GSBC of 4.7K. These adjusted expenditure estimates in turn coverts to a greater "need" for Devonport and subsequently results where Devonport receives more grant revenue allocation.

Therefore, we recommend that to gain a better understanding of Council's operating budget you view Profit and Loss statements for each department within the Information Briefing Documents found at <a href="INFORMATION BRIEFING DOCU-MENT - GLAMORGAN SPRING BAY">INFORMATION BRIEFING DOCU-MENT - GLAMORGAN SPRING BAY</a> COUNCIL (gsbc.tas.gov.au). We would recommend viewing the June 2021 document first as this matches the SGC document year you refer to below.

Why is our spending on planning so high? Why is it getting higher? What is this money being spent on? Please provide us with the breakdown of planning spending as per the SGC spreadsheet (approx. \$3 million).

Please refer to page 20 of the June 2021 Information Briefing Document mentioned above. This outlines that the total expense budget for the year was \$1,279,900 and the actual spend was \$1,449,433. The rationale for this overspend is outlined in the notes, which relates to higher level of contract planners to cover staff vacancies to assist with the higher level of development applications, the LPS and other planning matters. This also reflects that the development department outperformed the original budget by \$362,926 overall which is a positive result.

As you can see the spreadsheet used by the SGC groups different areas together and this should not be viewed as 'planning' alone

Why is spending on administration so high? Why is the difference between adjusted and actual spending in 2022-2023 almost double that for 2021-2022? In other words, why is the situation getting worse? What is this money being spent on? Again, please provide us with a breakdown of administration spending as per the SGC spreadsheet (approx \$3.5 million).

I refer to the issue of grouping above and refer you to the Information Briefing Document for further breakdown.

Why are planning and administration prioritised in terms of budget expenditure while other services are slashed? Have Councillors been given past spending details of these areas to review in their budget deliberations. Why is GSBC paying for accountants and other financial advisers who cannot understand the SGC methodology?

Council has statutory requirements in relation to planning and as you would recall a 'Performance Improvement Directive' was issued to Council in 2020, which required Council to ensure statutory obligations are met and to improve the overall organisation. However, as outlined above, the assumption that planning is allocated \$3m is incorrect. As you are hopefully aware, the PID identified serious issues with Councils financial performance, exacerbated by a lack of financial resources within the organisation.

Councillors are provided with the Information Briefing Documents quarterly and a monthly budget update. As part of all budget discussions, Council is provided with all financial information. The assertion regarding the SGC methodology has been answered above.

#### How do Councillors think that GSBC's revenue could be better allocated?

Council decisions around revenue expenditure and budget are governed and informed by the Long Term Financial Management Strategy and Asset Management Plans. It is critically important that Councils renews its infrastructure assets in accordance with sound asset management practices to ensure we don't leave a legacy burden of underfunded assets for future generations and that we continue to provide an acceptable level of service for our community.

You are encouraged to peruse Council's Strategic Plans.




