
20 YEARS of COMMITMENT to the GLAMORGAN-SPRING BAY MUNICIPALITY



LA NIÑA ENDS WITH POTENTIAL RETURN LATER IN 2022

The Bureau of Meteorology has announced an end to the 2021-22 La Niña in the tropical Pacific, with the status changed to La Nina WATCH.

Whilst the 2021-22 La Niña has ended, there is around a 50 per cent chance of a La Niña event forming again during 2022.

Most of the observations and surveyed climate models of ocean temperatures and winds over the tropical Pacific Ocean indicate neutral El Niño–Southern Oscillation (ENSO) levels – neither La Niña nor El Niño – are likely to persist during the southern hemisphere's winter.

The Bureau of Meteorology's head of long-range forecasting, Dr Andrew Watkins, said the Bureau has been monitoring this trend of a weakening La Niña over several weeks.

"A La Niña WATCH does not change the outlook of above average rainfall for most of Australia over coming months," Dr Watkins said.

"The Bureau's long-range outlook remains wetter-than-average, consistent with model outlooks from other global forecast centres, reflecting a range of climate drivers including a developing negative Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD) and warmer-than-average waters around Australia," he said.

"Sea surface temperatures are currently warmer than average for much of the Australian coastline, particularly to the north and west. This pattern is likely to increase the chance of above average winter-spring rainfall for Australia."

Currently, the IOD is neutral. But all climate model outlooks surveyed suggest a negative IOD is likely to form in the coming months.

Rainfall across eastern and southern Australia is typically above average during winter and spring during a negative IOD.

AUSTRALIAN LOCAL GOVERNMENTS STAND IN SOLIDAR-ITY WITH UKRAINE

PRAY FOR UKRAINE

Today councils from across Australia have come together at the 2022 NGA in Canberra to support the people of Ukraine, unanimously passing the following motion:

"We the delegates of the 2022 National General Assembly of Local Government stand in solidarity with the people of Ukraine and its legitimate elected democratic governments in seeking peace, security and stability within the State of Ukraine."

The motion followed an address to the Assembly by the Ukraine Ambassador, His Excellency Vasyl Myroshnychenko.

ALGA President Linda Scott said the Ambassador was warmly received by almost 1,000 councillors and local government leaders.

"Councils around Australia – and the world – are committed to local democracy, and we have been horrified by the images we have seen and the reports we have read coming out of Ukraine."

"As we gathered in Canberra today, we

wanted to send a powerful and united message of support to the Ukraine people, and their democratically elected governments."

Speaking to NGA delegates, the Ukraine Ambassador said he had been pleased by the support he had received from local governments.

"I have travelled extensively and met many mayors and lord mayors and I am amazed by all the people I have met. I have received many letters of support from local governments across the country," Ambassador Myroshnychenko said.

"We need more support; the level of destruction is enormous. Hospitals, schools and important infrastructure have all been destroyed. It will take one to two generations to re-build."

"Local governments can help mostly by connecting local services to those Ukrainians who have relocated into your communities, and by raising money to help Ukrainians rebuild critical infrastructure such as schools and hospitals."

MAJOR GREAT EASTERN DRIVE **UPGRADE COMPLETE**

Our investment in Tasmania's visitor economy continues to deliver with the completion of upgrades to another section of the Tasman Highway on the East Coast.

New improvements to the highway between Diana's Basin and St Helens are part of the Government's \$30 million upgrade of the Tasman Highway between Orford and St Helens.

This section of highway forms part of the Great Eastern Drive, one of Tasmania's five self-drive touring journeys aimed at encouraging visitors and Tasmanians to explore the regional parts of our State.

The Great Eastern Drive upgrade is funded under the Tasmanian Liberal Government's \$72 million Roads Package to Support Tasmania's Visitor Economy.

The upgrades between Diana's Basin and St Helens were completed by proud Tasmanian company Gradco with a construction cost of \$8 million.

They included road widening, improvements to the condition and alignment of the road, and two new dedicated overtaking lanes, one in each direction.

The improvements provide greater safety, safe passing opportunities and a better driving experience.

It makes one of the world's best driving tours even better for visitors and locals alike and will help support local businesses by getting even more tourists into our regional communities.

A further 37 individual improvements have previously been completed under the funding. These include stopping bays, overtaking lanes and upgrades to intersections at popular tourist sites.



- Step 2. Thoroughly comb sections of the hair with a fine-tooth head lice comb.
- Step 3. Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue.
- Step 4. Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs.
- Step 5. Repeat the combing for every part of the head at least 4 or 5 times.
 - Step 6. If lice or eggs are found, the person should be treated.

AUSSIE MEN WITH ADVANCED **PROSTATE CANCER** DENIED ACCESS TO **INNOVATIVE TREAT-**MENT ON MEDICARE

Almost 20,000 Australian men diagnosed each year with prostate cancer are being denied access to an innovative treatment on Medicare for the nation's most common Each year almost 20,000 Australian men cancer in men.

Two treatment options - low dose rate brachytherapy (LDR-brachytherapy) and external beam radiation therapy - are approved to treat prostate cancer in Australia by the medical regulator, the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA). However, the combination treatment is not covered by Medicare for locally advanced cancer which has begun to spread outside the prostate.

According to Dr Joseph Bucci, Radiation Oncologist at St George Public and Private Hospitals, Sydney, Australian clinicians want to be able to offer this treatment option to their patients.

"In 2017, a landmark clinical trial investigated LDR-brachytherapy and external beam radiation therapy in men with locally advanced prostate cancer. The results revealed the largest tumour control, or 'cure rates' ever seen in radiotherapy.

"Within 24 months of the data being published, medical organisations around the world updated their clinical guidelines to broaden access to this treatment, making it the standard of care across USA, UK, Canada and throughout Europe. Yet four years on and Australian men still can't access it on Medicare," said Dr Bucci.

"As clinicians, we want to offer our patients all available prostate cancer treatment options approved by Australia's regulatory body and implemented globally as a standard of care."

Local Brisbane resident Ken Hurling, OAM (74) was among the first 100 Queensland men to receive brachytherapy for prostate cancer almost 15 years ago, and can't believe the combination therapy still isn't available on Medicare.

"It's really important men have access to different treatment options for their prostate cancer. What's right for one guy might not necessarily be right for another.

"I discussed a few different treatment options with my doctor, including active surveillance of the cancer and hormone therapy, but I wasn't comfortable with any of the options. That was when I was first told about LDR-brachytherapy, and I knew it was right option for me," Ken said.

"I feel like one of the lucky ones as I was able to access the treatment. I know other blokes aren't as fortunate," said Ken.

Low dose-rate brachytherapy (LDRbrachytherapy) for prostate cancer is a minimally invasive, targeted treatment option which helps to reduce the risk of damage to surrounding healthy cells. It involves the insertion of permanent radioactive 'seeds' directly into the prostate, which give off localised radiation over a number of months to kill cancer cells.

ABOUT PROSTATE CANCER

Prostate cancer is Australia's most commonly diagnosed men's cancer, with approximately 20,000 men diagnosed each year. Prostate cancer is also Australia's third most common cause of cancer death, claiming the lives of more than 3,300 Australian men each year. Early detection of prostate cancer widens the available treatment options to patients, helping to improve outcomes reducing potential adverse side-effects.

ABOUT PROSTATE CANCER TREATMENTS

Treatment for prostate cancer depends on the stage of disease, symptoms, location and a person's general health. Treatment options include active surveillance (close monitoring by a doctor), surgery such as prostatectomy (removal of prostate gland and surrounding tissue), low dose rate or high dose rate brachytherapy (internal radiation inside the prostate only), external beam radiation therapy (directed to the prostate from outside the body), a combination of radiation therapies or hormone therapy.

About low dose rate brachytherapy

Low dose rate brachytherapy (LDRbrachytherapy) is a minimally invasive prostate cancer treatment involving 'seeds' being placed directly into the prostate to limit radiation to any surrounding tissue. LDR-brachytherapy is approved by Australia's regulatory body, the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA), and has been used to treat early-stage prostate cancer for more than 20 years in Australia.

ABOUT EXTERNAL BEAM RADIATION THERAPY

External beam radiation therapy uses one or more beams to deliver high energy xrays to a cancerous tumour. External beam radiation therapy is also TGA-approved

and has been used to treat a variety of cancers in Australia such as prostate, breast, lung and brain tumours.

ABOUT THE COMBINATION OF LOW DOSE RATE BRACHYTHERAPY AND EXTERNAL **BEAM RADIATION THERAPY**


In countries such as USA, UK, and Canada, LDR-brachytherapy is being used in combination with external beam radiation therapy to treat locally advanced (higher risk) cancer that has begun to spread outside the prostate. Leading clinical research has shown LDR-brachytherapy in combination with external beam radiation therapy to be a safe and effective treatment option for higher-risk prostate cancer.

Although both treatments are TGAapproved, LDR-brachytherapy with external beam radiation therapy is not available on Medicare for higher-risk prostate cancer. This means that only those men able to afford the treatment can access it.




