JEN BUTLER MP BACKS SENIOR OF THE YEAR'S FIRST AID DRIVER COURSE

Val Dempsey has been a tireless volunteer in her community in Canberra, as a volunteer for St John Ambulance Service for over 50 years, starting as a cadet volunteer when she was in primary school. Since being named 2022 Senior Australian of the year Val has taken her passion on to road, advocating across the country for compulsory first aid training for learner driver.

Val's passion for first aid education stems from personal experience and tragedy. Val's advocacy started after her daughter was involved in a car accident in which a friend of hers was killed. Val recounts that people at the scene wanted to help but didn't know how to administer lifesaving first aid.

Labor Member for Lyons Jen Butler MP recently met with Val when she visit the state and heard firsthand about the importance of bystander first aid in preventing deaths in those vital minutes following a car accident and before an ambulance arrives.

"Val is a most deserving of her appointment as Senior Australian of the year," Ms Butler said.

"Val's passion and commitment should inspire us all to serve our communities and fight for the things that we know can make a difference."

Val was in Tasmania advocating to make first aid training mandatory for new drivers, a move that Val believes would help bring down the states shocking road toll.

"Tasmanians' Road Safety Strategy identifies that, on average, 92 young Tasmanians aged 25 or below are seriously injured or killed on our roads every year and that is 92 too many." Ms Butler said

"The Tasmanian road toll is devastating. Action needs to be taken and all ideas need exploring.

"This is a positive initiative, that is already in place in a number of European countries."

Jen Butler has written to the Minister for Infrastructure in relation to the concept.

St Johns Tasmania have requested the Tasmanian Government to commit to including basic first-aid competency training as a pre-requisite to obtaining a driver's licence,

Rethinking the approach to post-crash management to be one that incorporates members of the community as part of the solution, is a step towards improving outcomes for victims of road crashes in Tasmania.

Under this initiative learner drivers will be required to complete an online test module on the principles of 'DRABC' (Danger, Response, Airway, Breathing and Circulation) before obtaining their probationary driver's licence (similar to hazard-perception tests).

The St John Ambulance Driver First Aid is an online course which takes approximately 30 minutes to complete, it is free, and issues a certificate of completion.



WATER UPGRADES FOR TRIABUNNA

Works have commenced at Triabunna to improve water security and the delivery of essential water services in the area. The project includes the construction of a new reservoir and water mains.

TasWater's Capital Delivery Office (CDO) Project Manager Nathan Toomer said these improvements will provide great benefits to the community.

"We are constructing a two megalitre storage reservoir and new water mains which will be installed on Selwyn Street, Tapner Court, Ryan Place, Howells Place and Roberts Street," he said.

"This project will improve water pressure for residents and provide better fire protection capabilities for local emergency service personnel to better protect the community.

"Once complete, it will also support future development and growth of the town while ensuring the infrastructure is compliant with current guidelines."

The scale of the project includes the construction of the new six-metre-high reservoir and drilling under the existing road to install 800 metres of water mains.

"We would like to thank our customers for their patience while we undertake this important upgrade work," Mr Toomer said.

This project is part of our commitment to delivering new and upgraded water infrastructure improvements in the Glamorgan

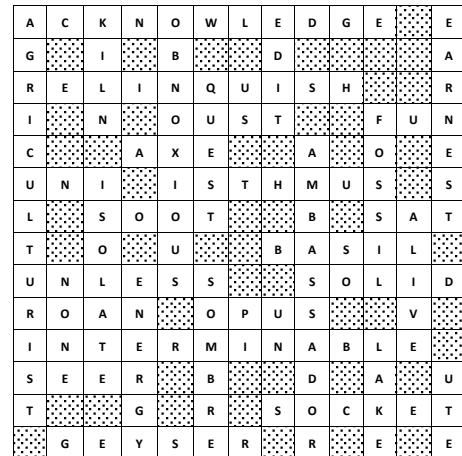
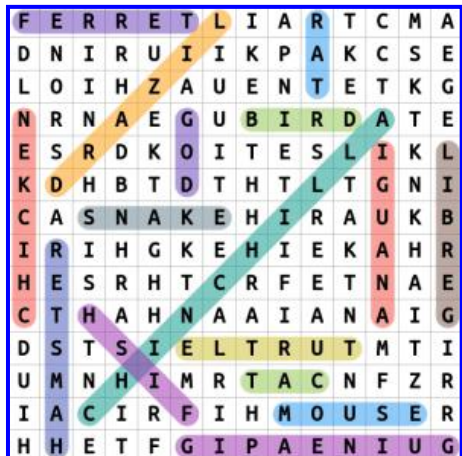

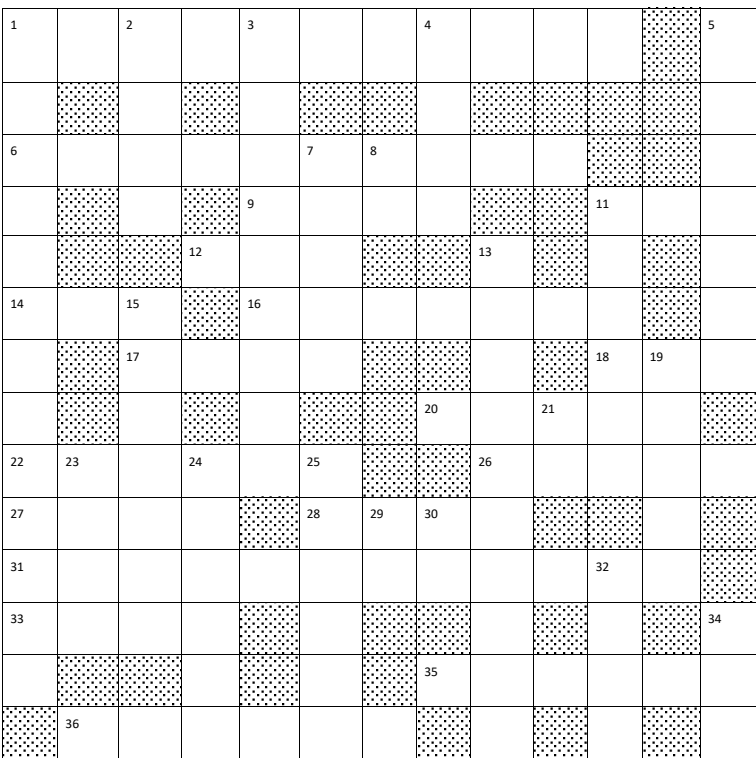
