TASMANIAN MANUFACTURER BRINGS NEW MEANING TO SURF AND TURF WITH METHANE BUSTING LIVESTOCK FEED

- *Australian manufacturer Sea Forest grows seaweed business to reduce global methane emissions*
- *Co-investment project supported by the Federal Government's AMGC develops local manufacturing processes to take novel emissions-busting livestock feed to the world*
- *Novel livestock feed has the potential to reduce livestock methane emissions by up to 98 per cent*
- *At capacity, Sea Forest will remove emissions equivalent to 300,000 cars from the atmosphere*

Tasmanian manufacturer Sea Forest is ready to take the equivalent of hundreds of thousands of cars off the road and help the red meat industry meet its net zero goals through support from the Advanced Manufacturing Growth Centre (AMGC) and a unique Australian species of seaweed.

The seaweed *asparagopsis armata* has been known to have giant methane-busting potential when added in tiny quantities as a supplement for ruminant animals. Thanks to a collaborative project led by Sea Forest and aided by \$675,000 in co-investment from AMGC, the com-

pany now boasts a state-of-the-art manufacturing facility at its Triabunna headquarters.

“This is a great Australian idea that has now been turned into a successful commercial business via manufacturing. Through the commercialisation process, Sea Forest has developed a local product with global potential, while generating jobs and supporting global moves to reduce emissions,” said Dr Jens Goenemann, Managing Director, AMGC.

The \$3.2 million project took just over 18 months to complete and has created nine full-time roles and upskilled a further eight staff at Sea Forest, which has been growing seaweed at Triabunna, Tasmania since 2019. Over the coming years, the project has the potential to create over 50 new jobs in Triabunna where the company focuses its manufacturing and market development.

As a result of the project, Sea Forest has systems and practises in place for industrial-scale processing and packaging of *asparagopsis* extract, which is delivered to beef, milk, and wool producers in an oil-based solution.

Specifically, the extract's compounds change the enzymatic behaviour in the final chamber of animals' stomachs. Thereby, reducing methane emissions with just 0.2 per cent of Sea Forest's product needed in ruminant feed to reduce emissions by up to 98 per cent.

Methane is a greenhouse gas 28 times more potent than carbon dioxide, and a significant contributor to the 15 per cent of Australia's greenhouse gas emissions that come from the agricultural sector.

Overall, *Asparagopsis* provides a triple benefit. It cuts digestion-related emissions from animals, grows and sequesters carbon more rapidly than a land plants, and increases the rate at which livestock grow.

“AMGC has greatly assisted Sea Forest in reaching its commercial outcomes as the funding allowed us to fast track the completion of our commercial-scale processing plant which has enabled us to meet our ambitious supply targets,” explained Sam Elsom, CEO of Sea Forest.

“The process of detailing each project milestone, together with its associated budget and regular reporting has also been very helpful and ensured that project costs were largely contained, limiting the risk of budget overruns and timing delays.”

Sea Forest is one of a handful of companies using *asparagopsis*-related IP licensed from FutureFeed, a commercialisation company based on IP developed by CSIRO, James Cook University, and Meat and Livestock Australia.

THE MAYORAL MOMENTS FOR AUGUST 2023



At the Council meeting on Tuesday 22nd August the usual statutory matters appeared on the agenda as well as two planning matters dealt with under the planning authority section.

Councillors were pleased to support the Freycinet Challenge for 2023. The Freycinet Challenge has traditionally provided significant financial injection to the Coles Bay Community and by all reports this year will be bigger than ever. Council wishes the organisers and community every success for the 2023 Freycinet Challenge.

Council is always pleased to support our volunteer groups and this month provided funds to the Freycinet Volunteer Marine Rescue Association to enable them to have their Stormy Seas Lifejackets serviced. This group provides a valuable service to our boating community and their equipment must be certified periodically as complying with current water safety regulations.

The Director of Works and Infrastructure always provides comprehensive reports of the many projects happening across the municipal area. It was particularly pleasing for me to see that the Bicheno Skatepark is finally coming to fruition. This has been a project in the making for more than 20 years and the Bicheno community is to be congratulated for their tenacity and the enormous amount of work done by such a dedicated group of people to get the project to this point.

Outside of the Council meeting, on Wednesday 23rd August and again on Friday 25th August I attended the Book Week festivities at both Orford and Triabunna schools and presented some copies of Jane Teniswood's book 'Triabunna by the Sea' for their library.

On Wednesday morning, I was presiding officer for the Federal Government and conferred Australian Citizenship on seven members of our community. Council held a ceremony in the Triabunna Hall that saw conferees from our jurisdiction area receive their Citizenship Certificate in front of family and friends. As well as organising gifts for the conferees and setting up the hall in a very Australian theme, Eliza and Jazmine from the Council office had organised a lovely morning tea complete with Tim Tams and laming-tons! I was assisted in the ceremony by

the General Manager Greg Ingham who very ably announced each conferee's name.

Did you see the media release by the State Government about a proposed East Coast Regional Partnership that will cover from Orford to St Helens? It follows on from one that is being progressed on the West Coast. The Government see this as an opportunity to support Council, our communities, industry and other stakeholders in a collaborative manner that supports the needs and wants of future generations. I very flippantly suggested to the member of the Premier's staff who rang to tell me about the announcement that it looked rather like a new Greater East Coast Council that has been proposed by some. By the time this paper is printed, Council will have appeared before the Future of Local Government Reform South-East Hearing. The process still has some way to go before the Board's final recommendations are published in October. Council is committed to remaining in the process but have made it clear that we will require some solid evidence to put to our communities to enable an informed vote to be done by residents and ratepayers if there is to be any reform of Glamorgan Spring Bay Council.

Sea Forest is one of a handful of companies using asparagopsis-related IP licensed from FutureFeed, a commercialisation company based on IP developed by

CSIRO, James Cook University, and Meat and Livestock Australia.

Sea Forest aims to hit its current capacity within five years, representing 7,000 tonnes per annum of asparagopsis – enough to mitigate the equivalent of 1.2 million tonnes of CO2, equivalent to removing 300,000 cars from the world’s roads.

Sea Forest currently has a number of trials underway in Australia, The most notable with burger chain Grill’d that began offering a “Gamechanger” burger in February.* The Gamechanger pattie is made of black angus beef fed asparagopsis supplements as well as grass which reduces livestock emissions by almost 70 per cent.

The many years of Australian research into asparagopsis will be an important contributor to meeting the Australian red meat industry’s goal of carbon neutrality by 2030 (CN30.)

ULURU STATEMENT FROM THE HEART

We, gathered at the 2017 National Constitutional Convention, coming from all points of the southern sky, make this statement from the heart:

Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander tribes were the first sovereign Nations of the Australian continent and its adjacent islands, and possessed it under our own laws and customs. This our ancestors did, according to the reckoning of our culture, from the Creation, according to the common law from ‘time immemorial’, and according to science more than 60,000 years ago.

This sovereignty is a *spiritual notion: the ancestral tie between the land, or ‘mother nature’, and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples who were born therefrom, remain attached thereto, and must one day return thither to be united with our ancestors. This link is the basis of the ownership of the soil, or better, of sovereignty.* It has never been ceded or extinguished, and co-exists with the sovereignty of the Crown.

How could it be otherwise? That peoples possessed a land for sixty millennia and this sacred link disappears from world history in merely the last two hundred years?

With substantive constitutional change and structural reform, we believe this ancient sovereignty can shine through as a fuller expression of Australia’s nationhood.

Proportionally, we are the most incarcerated people on the planet. We are not an innately criminal people. Our children are alienated from their families at unprecedented rates. This cannot be because we have no love for them. And our youth languish in detention in obscene numbers. They should be our hope for the future.

These dimensions of our crisis tell plainly the structural nature of our problem. This is *the torment of our powerlessness.*

We seek constitutional reforms to empower our people and take *a rightful place* in our own country. When we have power over our destiny our children will flourish. They will walk in two worlds and their culture will be a gift to their country.

We call for the establishment of a First Nations Voice enshrined in the Constitution.

Makarrata is the culmination of our agenda: *the coming together after a struggle.* It captures our aspirations for a fair and truthful relationship with the people of Australia and a better future for our children based on justice and self-determination.

We seek a Makarrata Commission to supervise a process of agreement-making between governments and First Nations and truth-telling about our history.

In 1967 we were counted, in 2017 we seek to be heard. We leave base camp and start our trek across this vast country. We invite you to walk with us in a movement of the Australian people for a better future.

-Vote YES to alter the Constitution to recognise the First Peoples of Australia.

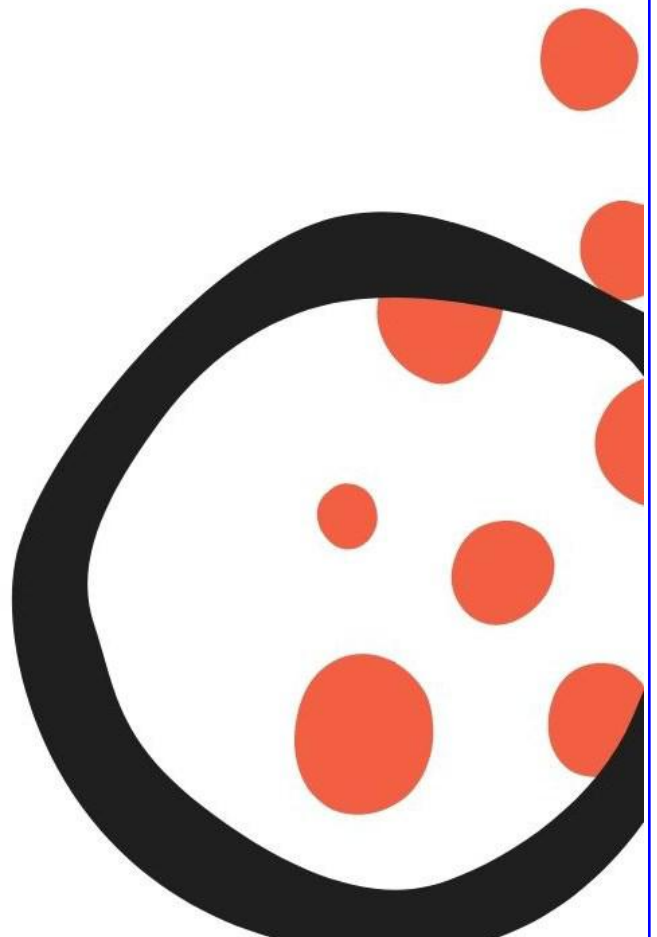

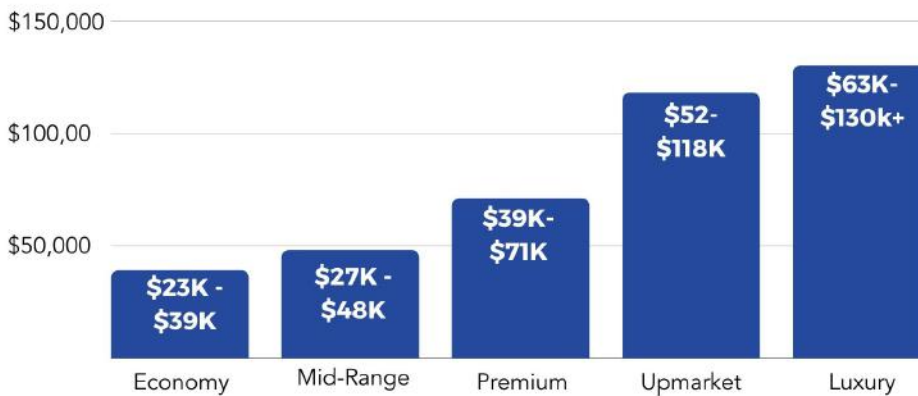

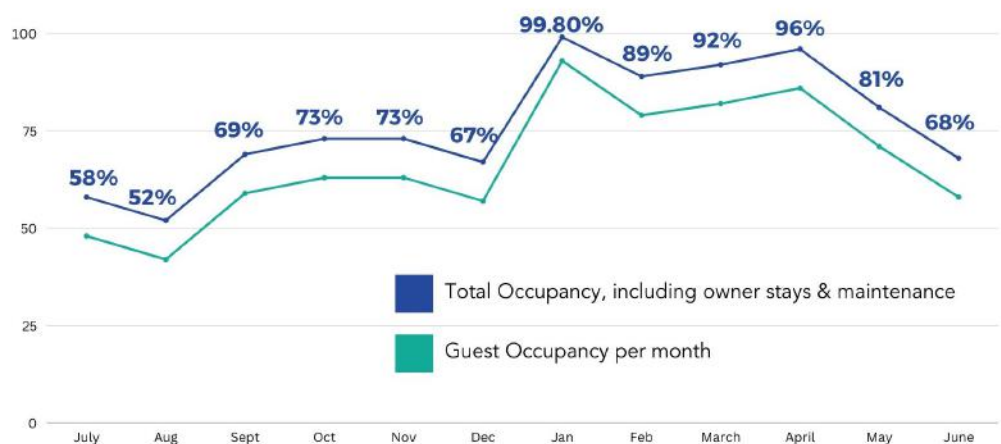
Owners yearly NET revenue by category

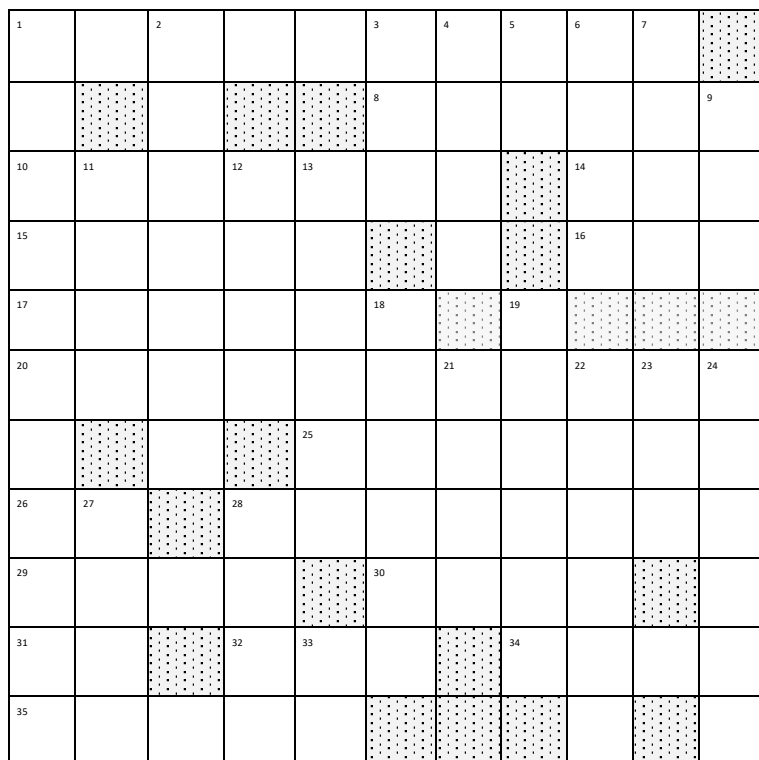
