

WORK BEGINS ON **COLES BAY RESER-VOIR UPGRADE**

A project has begun to double the capacity of Coles Bay reservoir to better serve our current customers and help meet demand for the future. The current reservoir is not big enough to meet the needs of the area and demand data and projected annual growth rates show it will not meet a third of demand 30 years from now.

Once complete, the project, which forms part of our \$1 billion capital works program over the next four years, will deliver a reservoir capable of storing one million litres of water.

Rachaelle Downey, Capital Engagement Specialist, said work was expected to take six months to complete and thanked the Coles Bay community for their patience during this time.

"We have communicated with residents with display notices on appropriate noticeboards throughout the area, as well as with messages and updates on our social media and web page. We will continue with those updates as the work progresses. We will also drop a notice in your letterbox if your property will be directly affected at any stage."

Ms Downey urged residents to take care and avoid the area where works were

being undertaken.

"There will be more heavy vehicle traffic along the gravel access track which leads up to the water treatment plant and out to Friendly Beaches, especially during the first couple of months of work.

Those who can avoid the road during business hours have been advised to do so.

"While there will be some short-term incon-

venience, the result will have long-term benefits for all those who live in, and love, Coles Bay," Ms Downey said.

WETTER THAN **AVERAGE SPRING** FOR AUSTRALIA'S EAST

The Bureau is expecting a wet spring for most of the eastern half of Australia where there is a high chance of above average rainfall.

The Spring 2022 Climate and Water Outlook, released yesterday, reflects several climate

influences including a negative Indian Ocean Dipole event to the west and the chance of a La Niña returning this spring increasing to around 70 per cent.

Bureau of Meteorology senior climatolo-gist Dr Lynette Bettio said, "where soils and catchments are wet, and stream flows are high, further rainfall this spring will increase the risk of flooding for eastern Australia."

"In northern Australia, the first rains of the wet season are likely be earlier than normal for much of Queensland and the Northern Territory."

October is the official beginning of the

wet season across northern Australia.

Further, Dr Bettio said a positive Southern Annular Mode (SAM) is also likely, which pushes weather systems south, bringing wetter easterly winds to NSW and fewer cold fronts to western Tasmania.

Dr Bettio said parts of Western Australia and western Tasmania are likely to experience below average rainfall this spring.

Almost all of Australia is likely to experience warmer than average nights, while cooler days are likely for large parts of the mainland except the tropical north.

We encourage communities to keep up to date with the official forecasts and warnings on the Bureau's website and BOM Weather app.



The first step in gaining control over your allergies is by preventing them from occurring in the first place. Ideally the best prevention is to identify what is triggering your allergy and take steps to avoid exposure to it.

First, find out what could be triggering your allergic symptoms. You could be allergic to dust mites, mould spores, pollen, animal dander, or something else. It may take some time and research to identify all the substances which you are allergic to. It may be helpful to keep a diary to help you better understand your triggers. Then, try to have as minimal exposure to your trigger. If you're not exposed to the substance to which you are allergic to, you won't have an allergic reaction. This is much easier said than done, however you can take steps to limit your exposure and reduce your allergy symptoms.

Boost your immune system by eating plenty of fresh fruit and vegetables and keep a well balanced diet, and take supplements if required.

If you suffer from hayfever, you may be able to better predict when your allergies will begin. Thus, you can use certain medications a couple of weeks prior to high pollen seasons.




