Glamorgan Spring Bay Council will officially transfer management of the two medical practices on 16 October to not-for-profit, cohealth, for a period of three years, with an option to extend a further two years.

Chief Executive, Nicole Bartholomeusz, says cohealth wants to help create healthier communities in Bicheno and Triabunna.

"We're looking forward to combining our 50 years' experience in delivering primary health care with the knowledge and expertise of local health practitioners," says Ms Bartholomeusz.

"Our philosophy is 'care for all' and we believe everyone has the right to timely and accessible health services, regardless of where they live or their income."

"Patients will still be able to see their regular GP, nurse or allied health professional, and over time we hope to introduce a greater range of services and better ways of working through team-based care."

NATION-LEADING HEALTH INITIATIVE TO BENEFIT AGED CARE RESIDENTS

A nation-leading pilot program will enable pharmacists to prescribe medication to Tasmanian aged care residents in collaboration with their general practitioner.

Implemented in coming months, this nation-leading pilot program is a key recommendation from the independent Pharmacist Scope of Practice Review commissioned by the Rockliff Liberal Government, to provide a comprehensive assessment of the role of pharmacists in

Tasmania.

Minister for Health, Guy Barnett, said the initiative would improve the medication safety of residents and lead to a better quality of life, helping prevent hospital presentations.

"We know many GPs spend valuable time reissuing prescriptions for residents, rather than spending that time addressing residents emerging health needs," Minister Barnett said.

"I am confident that pharmacists working collaboratively with GPs and prescribing within the safeguards of a treatment plan approved by the GP will significantly improve patient care.

"Our Government will continue to work with pharmacy, medical, and residential aged care facility representative groups as we pilot this nation-leading change in several sites."

An implementation plan for the recommendations from the independent review by KPMG is being developed.







MAYORAL MOMENTS FOR SEPTEMBER

At the Council meeting on Tuesday 26th September there were two s.40K planning reports that were debated and motions passed to send the matters to the Tasmanian Planning Commission for determination

Several Council policies were due for review under the corporate calendar as well as a review of the Delegations Register. The Delegations Register is an important part of the overall operations of Council and requires regular review to ensure that we are providing transparency and procedural fairness in all aspects of our business. If there is a complaint to a higher authority, the first stop is the Delegations Register to ensure that the officer(s) involved had the appropriate delegation to deal with the matter.

Council is fortunate that we have some very passionate volunteers across the municipal area. The Bicheno Hall Committee, Marine Infrastructure Committee and Triabunna Recreation Ground Committee all provided reports for this meeting, and we thank their committee members for their continued support.

Landcare is running their State Conference in Triabunna and Council was pleased to support some event funding for them. The conference is a significant event not only in showcasing Triabunna but also our wider East Coast and Tasmania as a whole.

The Triabunna Tivoli Theatre was supported in the community small grant program. This will see a welcome return of cinema to our area.

The Draft Natural Resource and Climate Resilience Strategy was accepted by Council. This is a wonderful body of work compiled by Landscape Recovery Tasmania and the East Coast Catchments Steering Committee. The document will provide guidance for many stakeholders for managing natural resources. It is a comprehensive document that offers the opportunity for all to get involved to help build resilience within the community and this magnificent area we call home.

The Director Works and Infrastructure and Director Planning and Development both presented comprehensive reports on the various aspect of the operational arm of Council they deal with. In addition, we receive monthly financial reports from the

Director Corporate and Community.

I was very pleased to welcome Councillor-Elect Richard Parker to the Chamber gallery for

the Ordinary Council Meeting and to advise that he will be inducted on Tuesday 10^{th} October. Like everything in life, there is some paperwork that must be received and completed before he can take his seat at the table!

I would like to thank Greg Luck for sitting as a Councillor for almost a year. I take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Annie Browning and Mr. Kenneth Gregson for demonstrating their commitment to our communities and agreeing to be part of the recount for the vacancy.

On other matters not specific to the meeting, it is pleasing to note that cohealth (no, it doesn't have a capital C!) will be taking over the East Coast Health arm of Council's operations in mid-October. It was not connected to that change of management, and it was with much regret that Council accepted Dr. Ashton Kelly's resignation. Dr. Kelly has been a valuable member of our medical practice in Bicheno, and we wish him well for the future as he joins his family overseas. East Coast Health Bicheno has some strategies in place to ensure a smooth transition and continuity of care for Dr. Kelly's patients.

Council has completed the slashing and mulching of fire breaks at Coles Bay on the Brooker Street reserve (behind the community hall), the Rita & Doris reserve and behind houses on Freycinet Drive, Jetty Road and Percy Street. This is in line with the council reserve management plan and had been planned for some weeks. Staff are pleased that the fire breaks have come up very well and will convey this information to the local volunteer fire

members. The fire breaks have now made a clear access track for some of the emergency services equipment if needed.

Dealing with the media is always a bit harrowing and even more so when there is a fire emergency, but those calls were quickly forgotten with the ones I received from far and wide about the Friendly Beaches fire, including from the East Gippsland (Victoria) Mayor. We had the most amazing support from our wonderful volunteers in the Coles Bay area, Federal and State Ministers and politicians, the local government sector and community members from Coles Bay and further afield. Everyone was concerned for the welfare of the area and offered assistance or comforting words if they were too far away to come and help. Council staff were kept busy in a variety of roles in line with the Municipal Emergency Management Plan. There is no doubt that some lessons could be learnt from this fire and concerns will be discussed and debated with the stakeholders. The Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Services Felix Ellis is very keen to see debriefs with all stakeholders that gives better outcomes for not only Coles Bay but every community that could face a bushfire risk.

Thank you does not even come close to the gratitude we feel for the wonderful work of all involved during the fire event. Noone expected a fire of this magnitude in September, and it is probably a lesson to be learnt that we should all have a bushfire plan in place.

MAST

MARINE and SAFETY TASMANIA

Most people remember the popular ABBA song "SOS". They also remember SOS is the international distress signal for ships and all other maritime craft.

"SOS" was chosen as the preferred signal as the three short, three long, three short signal was easily recognisable. It was later that "SOS" was interpreted as Save Our Souls or Save Our Ship. The first recorded use of "SOS" was on 10 June 1909 when the Cunard liner RMS Slavonia was wrecked off the Azores. Two ships heard the distress signal and went to the aid of the passengers and crew and it is reported that all on board were rescued. Three years later the Titanic used it to signal her own sinking.

It is this same technology that is the basis of the new Electronic Visual Distress Signal (EVDS).

MAST has introduced this option instead of the two red and two orange hand flares Tasmanian boaties are required to carry in sheltered waters if they are carrying a GPS enabled EPIRB and a VHF radio.

Hand flares last for 60 seconds. An EVDS must operate for at least six hours and be

visible up to five nautical

miles.

Flares have to be replaced every three years and since MAST has taken over the disposal of old flares, around \$30,000 has been spent every year in disposal costs. Most EVDS models operate on standard alkaline batteries and the boat owner can test the unit before heading out to

Once the unit has been purchased it is only a matter of replacing the batteries annually to be compliant with MAST By-Laws.

With the introduction of EVDS, boaters will need to familiarise themselves with the old Morse code signals in case they spot an odd-looking light signal on the water.

MAST believes that the sixhour operational life of an EVDS is a superior option to 60 seconds for a pyrotechnic flare.

With the requirement to carry a GPS-enabled EPIRB and a VHF radio, for daytime signalling, along with your EVDS, we also think safety

bases are well and truly covered.

Boat and yachting clubs around the Tasmania will soon receive a document that has been a collaboration between Australian Sailing and MAST.

For many years MAST has worked closely with Rowing Tasmania to improve the safety outcomes for rowers operating within designated port areas. Sailors from clubs around the state regularly interact with commercial vessels whether it is pilot boats, cruise ships, tugs, fishing boats or the Bruny Island ferries.


This work has been a development of the regular meetings that MAST facilitates between Hobart-based yacht clubs and TasPorts.

The result of these meetings has been a greater understanding between TasPorts staff, pilots, the VTS radio room and the race management teams from the yacht clubs.

The Sailing Safely in Tasmania document will give yacht clubs around the State information about safety equipment, navigation light requirements for coach boats and sailing dinghies, and the rights of piloted vessels and pilot-exempt vessels.




