Glamorgan Spring Bay Council - Local Football Clubs - Curfew Reply

In response to the anonymous article published on the front page of the Great Oyster Bay Community News on the 3rd October, the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council would like to state the following:

Council fully acknowledges and absolutely agrees with the writers points regarding the multitude of benefits of our local sporting clubs and the social functions and events associated with these clubs. The social, physical, mental and economic benefits are without question.

The letters to the clubs that are referenced by the author were sent based on discussions with and a request from Tasmania Police. There were a series of incidents that prompted the Police to contact Council's General Manager and make this request. The incidents were deemed serious enough by the Police in relation to public safety, that the request was acted on.

The series of events being described by the author took place in July this year and after the initial letters to the clubs, Council convened a meeting with Tasmania Police and the Presidents of the football clubs. Sitting around the table with Council, it was agreed with the Presidents that the curfew would continue with some minor changes to make this workable for the clubs.

Since this time, Council has not been alerted to any dissatisfaction or concerns from the local football clubs themselves.

Although the author of the article does not wish to be identified, the Editor of the Great Oyster Bay Community News informs us that it was not written by a member of either of the local football clubs. We are unsure as to why it has been raised at this time when the measures to ensure the best possible outcomes for all involved have been implemented.

Social, physical, mental and economic benefits only come when there is no great risk to public safety due to the behaviour of a very small few. The curfew appears to have minimised this risk.

Council is more than happy to review these measures with the football clubs should there be any new concerns or difficulties that have become apparent 3 months since the measures were first implemented.

Editor's Note: I was approached by the contributor of last week's article in July and I advise them that we hold it back, due to the need to view the minutes from the council meeting in July, which were not published until after the August meeting, which is GSB Council's normal procedure. The contributor requested and I honoured that request to not attribute the article at this stage. Since I have been the editor, I have received many anonymous articles for publication, some under nom de plume, and have advised the author, that if they are not willing to at least supply their name, then the article will not be published.

In my email to council during this last week, I wrote that:: "...I can advise that the person is not a committee person of the Swansea Football Club, nor are they an employee of Glamorgan Spring Bay Council...". I should also have included that the contributor was not a committee person of the Triabunna Football Club. (Triabunna Football Club have submitted a reply to council. Please see Page 5). I apologise to both the Council and Triabunna for this oversight. I originally wrote to the council and all the councillors on 13th July with six questions that I wished answered. My email referred only to Swansea and I was advised that a reply would be issued after the council met with the clubs. No further correspondence was received by the newsletter in relation to this matter until after the article in last week's newsletter. Bill Fry





We feel the need to view our feelings regarding the article published on the front page of the Great Oyster Bay Community News on the 3rd October, regarding the curfew placed on our trading hours earlier this year, as the article in our opinion suggests that the footy club may have issues with the curfew, or any of the processes regarding it's implementation, or explanation.

This in fact is not the case.

We would like to dot point some of the facts regarding our clubs position in regards to the sale and consumption of alcohol.....

- Over the last few years our club has deliberately set out to reduce the sale of alcohol to a point whereby it is simply a social offering as part of attending a local football match at our managed venue.
- We have backed alcohol sales related revenue out of our annual fiscal budgets, and have successfully replaced, and even increased our overall revenue, via the generosity of local businesses (sponsorship), and the family groups who support our club, and for this we thank them sincerely.
- The fiscal year of 2017 has witnessed an even greater reduction in alcohol sales revenue for our club, to deliver a 35% reduction vs F2016, and this is in no way connected to the curfew, bad management, or by accident, as it is a deliberate policy of our committee, and this policy is fully supported by the large parent group who assist us manage the club from year to year.
- Our club has chosen a 'local youth' policy this last few years, and no person managing our club believes that increased alcohol sales are in any way a contributing factor towards increased performance on the field, and we also agree it is socially unacceptable to mix youth and alcohol off the field, therefore, as a result, we have hosted less than five functions at the club this last two years since entering the ODFA competition....with our local youth policy.
- Our club holds a Restricted Club Alcohol License, for six months of the year, allowing us to operate for up to 15 hours per week. We would have used our full 15 hour entitlement less than three weeks during the past two years.
- Our club holds the highest level of Good Sports Accreditation, and has passed with flying colors every random visit / audit that the State Licensing Commission have conducted on us.
- The curfew placed on us is not an issue, as it is simply another level compliance that we must manage our way through as a responsible provider of alcohol related services.
- The club has produced the best 'underage' player in the ODFA for the last two seasons, and this is our focus, extended parenting, extended education, helping our local youth make good life decisions, as well as giving them the best preparation we can to deliver the on-field success that we all collectively strive for.







The coaches awards was won by Issac Palmer, who had a very impressive season, only missing training and games when he was away working.



After the presentations were completed, Paul Wright thanked the players, volunteers and committee for the work throughout a long and difficult season.


The elders then retired for the evening and the young, and young at heart, kicked up their heels for the rest of the evening.





