

GALA KIRK. HISTORY BEING SOLD OFF

Gala Kirk anchors its rural landscape. Steadfast and resolute on the East Coast pastoral lands, the Kirk has centred events in the hamlet of Cranbrook since 1845. Its walls have welcomed, conjoined, and farewelled many local residents. Built by John and son James Amos despite insufficient funds gathered by a whip-around through Tasmania, its whitewashed and rendered walls cover brick construction; the mortar was made from processed oyster shells retrieved from Great Oyster Bay.

Built to centre worship and community vitality, the kirk provided a vestry and schoolroom. It has been purposed for emergency assembly, meetings, and elections.

The Kirk cemetery holds generations of Quinns, Castles, Webbs, Pooles, Pykes and Gambles beneath the soil, having toiled above it during their lives. Within earshot of the Kirk's bell and alongside Glen Heriot Lane the Amos family cemetery headstones extend unevenly in a nearby paddock. A saunter between the sandstone and granite markers reveals a story of immigration from Scotland, perinatal, infant and child mortality, military service, accidental death, and senescent demise. This East Coast hamlet is the story of small community; Gala Kirk is our provenance as surely as Freycinet Peninsula.

These days the Kirk hosts the Harvest celebration, Easter and Christmas services that are well attended by East Coast residents and visitors. It is a perfect venue for Weddings in conjunction with a vineyard reception. Its cemetery holds local historic interest. The vestry and schoolroom lend to small workshops, and the yard would be prime position for a village market. These are a few ideas; and community input would be welcomed for others.

Any offer of assistance including financial is essential if the Kirk is to remain a community asset.

This community heritage is threatened by the Kirk's current owner, the Uniting Church of Australia, who is preparing to divest this cultural icon that was gifted to them and maintained by the community. The UCA will be calling for Expressions of Interest in October (this month). There are fears it will be sold to the highest bidder. This story is one of many being repeated around Tasmania. Bicheno Community Church is under similar scrutiny. The fragmentation of our village communities is ignored by Church organisations in their rush to sell community landmarks. A campaign is underway to purchase the Kirk for the community. An incorporation process is underway to legitimise this.



LETTERS TO THE EDITORIAL TEAM

Dear Editor

In response to Mr Pedro Camus' challenge I provide the following 'honest' answers as an incumbent candidate on the Tassal, Cambria and rates matters he mentioned.

My decisions are all a matter of public record. The Prosser Plains Raw Water Scheme (aka the Tassal pipeline), Cambria and the rates increase were all made after receipt of a s.65 qualified advice report on an agenda and in accordance with the Local Government Act and other legislation that governs Councils. I note I did not support the move to AAV rating and the subsequent massive rates increases.

Put simply to 'lead and govern within the mandated boundaries of Council' requires all elected members to receive and consider s.65 qualified advice reports before making any decision. It is a fact of life as a Councillor, and if you stay in the office for any length of time, at times and often years later, it is identified that a particular s.65 report was deficient in its format and may have changed how a Councillor would have voted if that information was available or included at the time of the agenda item. This is particularly so with planning matters where a current planning officer has an opposing view to that of the officer who wrote an original report.

I do very few letterbox drops and I refuse to put up a multitude of Vote for Me signs. I rely on the candidate statement in the voter booklet. Reality is there is not a great deal that a candidate can promise they will do. Anything beyond acting in accordance with the prevailing governance requirements at any given time is a promise that is unlikely to be achieved when you are one vote in the Chamber. There is not a matter that is dealt with by Council that can be

achieved by one person; not even the Mayor. Every decision requires a majority vote and in some case an absolute majority, particularly finance matters.

People can say what they like about me but please don't question my integrity or commitment to the principles of good governance and community consultation.

Dear Len

Thank you for your email below regarding the pensioner remission on rates. I note Mayor Youngs response.

The pensioner remission is currently calculated as a percentage of rates with a fixed maximum remission amount, the percentage is 30% plus an additional 20% for the fire levy component. Like many rate payers you are probably hitting the maximum amount, which is why it may seem like a fixed amount. The rules and regulations regarding the pensioner remission, including the percentage rate and fixed amount is wholly set with the State Government.

Council is working hard to get into a financial sustainable position, which will take a number of years. For more information I strongly encourage you to refer to Council's Long Term Financial Management Plan which can be found on our website. This Plan, adopted by Council, will enable Council to continue to operate with local representation; and to provide services and infrastructure to the community to a satisfactory level. Whilst we understand that rate increases can be hard for many ratepayers, they are reviewed every year to ensure that they are as fair and equitable as possible.

Council does offer payment arrangements for any ratepayer who prefer to pay fortnightly or monthly. If you would like more information on payment arrangements, please feel free to contact Council's Director of Corporate Elysse Blain on 6256 4777.

Glamorgan Spring Bay Councils financial position and performance up to when it was served with a Performance Improvement Direction in July 2020 is well known and documented. I would be happy to discuss this with you in detail at your convenience, or alternatively I can forward you important pertinent information.

Mayor Young makes a valid point in regard to the inequity of the Federally funded base grant allocation to GSBC. We are a glaring outlier compared to the other 28 Councils in Tasmania. I am pleased that you have copied the Hon. Jane Howlett MLC into your email as we have not had a favourable response or understandable explanation as to the grant funding from the government. If Council received its fair share, there would be a significant positive impact on our financial positions and rates generally.



Average Area Rate (AAR) to Assessed Annual Valuation (AAV) for residential properties is particularly hard for a municipality that has an elderly population with fixed incomes, either government pensions or self-funded retirees, where recent property prices have increased exponentially.
