

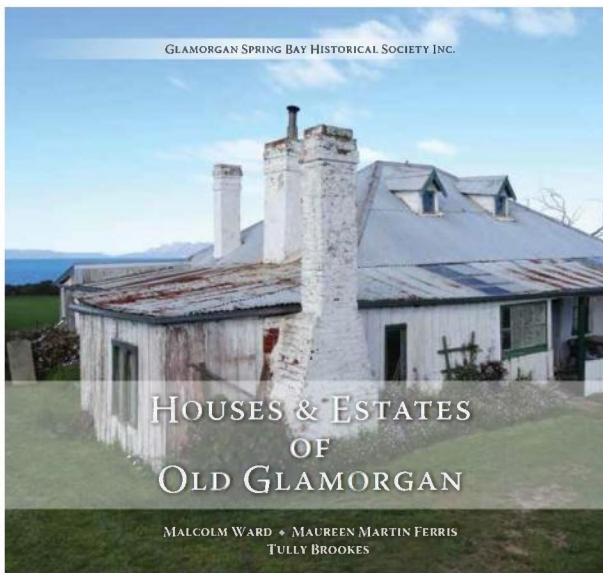

These organisations collect, exhibit and preserve the history Glamorgan Spring Bay Municipality for future generations. Larger organisations such as the Tasmanian Museum & Art Gallery and the Queen Victoria Museum & Art Gallery are envious of our facilities, exhibitions and collections. Many are amazed that Swansea has this on their doorstep, we should be proud of what we have achieved and continue our high standard.

The Historical Society has some exciting news with the launch of their new book *Houses & Estates of Old Glamorgan* on 11th December in Hobart and 12th December at the museum in Swansea. This book showcases approximately 30 properties from the Glamorgan area in photographs (past & present) and in many cases untold stories. The museum will present a new exhibition to coincide with the book launch – *Houses & Estates of Old Glamorgan* on the 12th December at the Swansea.

Shortly, we'll be announcing a new award for Glamorgan Spring Bay Municipality school students (Primary & Secondary) – The Ray Lewis Perpetual Photographic Award. The award will be given for the best original photograph by a student representing the history of the Glamorgan Spring Bay area. Dates and exhibition times will be announced in 2018, so stay tuned.



Recently History Professor Hamish Maxwell-Stewart from the University of Tasmania visited and asked us to participate in the project 'Founders & Survivors'. <http://www.foundersandsurvivors.org/>. Founders & Survivors is a partnership between historians, genealogists, demographers and population health researchers. It seeks to record and study the founding population of 73,000 men women and children who were transported to Tasmania. Many survived their convict experience and went on to help build a new society.

Over the past 20 years the society has had many volunteers who have enjoyed a passion for local history, meeting new people and learning new skills. We would love you to be part of our group and join in with some interesting and fulfilling projects. If you are interested please drop in for a coffee and talk to see what we do and how you can become involved. Some projects you can do from the comfort of your home. Computer skills are helpful but not essential. We would like to encourage students with computer skills to help us preserve our history.

Letter to the Editor

Dear Sir, I wish to express my gratitude to an exceptional councillor and former resident of Glamorgan Spring Bay, Bertrand Cadart. Bertrand Cadart has been a councillor for 12 years and much of that time he served as mayor. Mr Cadart's dedication to the community and his commitment to his Council duties have been exemplary. He worked long hours and when he was mayor always attended as many events and community occasions as he could fit into a day. He didn't only attend but also prepared thoughtful, relevant and always entertaining speeches applicable to the occasion. His love of the east coast of Tasmania shone through and resulted in media attention both nationally and internationally. His respectful attitude and warm rapport extended to all people regardless of age or status. Events as they have occurred over the last few weeks have been particularly traumatic for Mr. Cadart and he has had to resign his position on the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council. It is even more unfortunate that we as a council were not able to support him fully in his request for leave of absence due to the actions of three councillors. As councillor, Mr Cadart requested an extended leave of absence due to illness because he wished to finish his term and in this technological age, it is still possible to carry out most councillor duties remotely. Cr. Cadart was still following up on ratepayers' requests via email up until his resignation. Not only has Mr. Cadart continued to fulfil his responsibilities as a Councillor but he also continued to represent Council on several committees, and has gone to extraordinary lengths to maintain his participation and make a very worthwhile contribution despite his personal circumstances. Considering Mr Cadart as councillor, contributed deep and sincere level of service to his community over many years, it strikes me that it is extremely lacking in compassion and good judgement when we refuse a request that is within the legal determinants of the Local Government Act and use it to score political points. Despite the increasingly desperate attempts on the part of some councillors to call the entire council into disrepute I am convinced that the majority of Councillors are fulfilling their roles in a responsible and professional manner and are making a huge and positive difference to our municipal area and dealing with all decisions regardless of how difficult they may be.

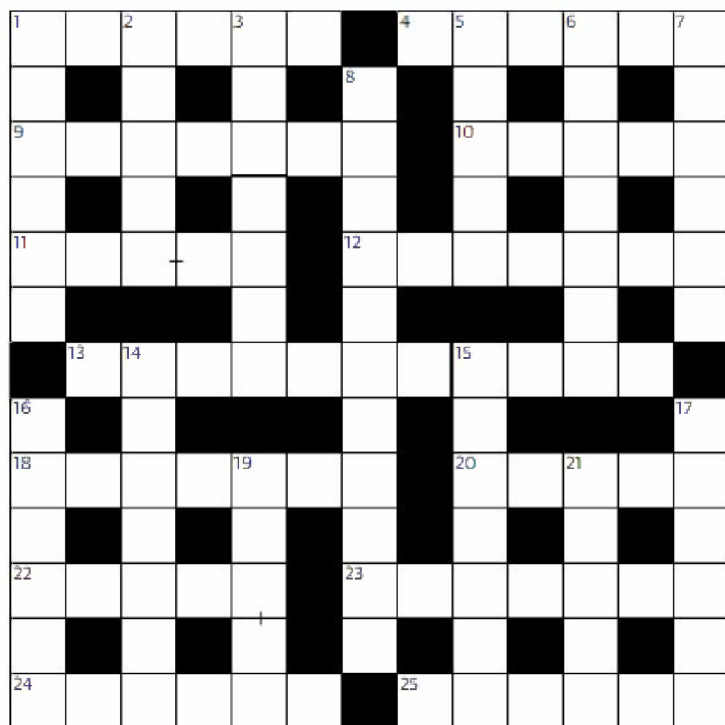

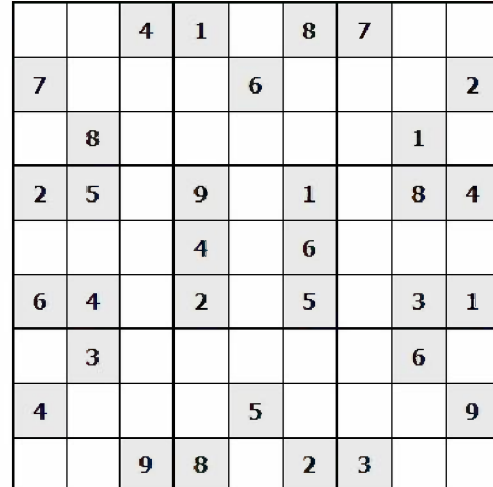
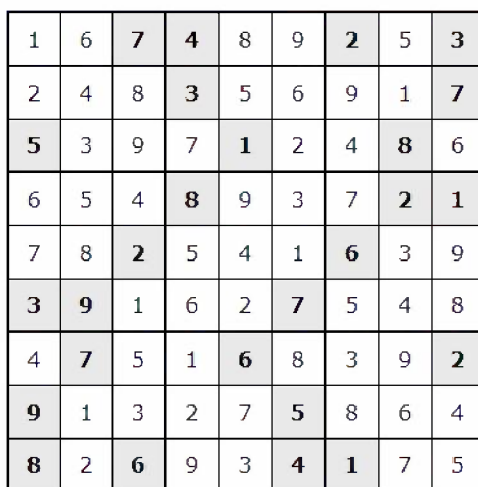
