The cheerleaders need to be very proud of their achievements as they have worked extremely hard in the lead up to the competition.

The cheerleading program at Swansea Primary School ticks many boxes and has been running for three years, the program is so much more than the routine, I have seen so many students grow and become leaders as the program continues to grow: the program focuses on the following: Co-operation, non-gender specific, trusts and resilience develops co-ordination, team work, and gymnastic dance and sports all rolled into one.

Swansea Primary has added another level to the program joining forces with Sorell School and having high school students come with the cheerleading coach to be part of the mentoring program. The power in this component of the program is amazing. Arriving at our competition on Saturday we had a group of students straight up to us wishing us luck. Being a small school we can't field a football team or a netball team, however we can put a group of children from different grades together and create a cheerleading team.

This is another way of showing rural and remote students can give anything a go.

We have been very lucky to source an awesome coach Loren Russell from Sorell Spirit Cheerleading, plus have had many helpers along the way, Chelsea Browning, Beth Rowlings and Melissa Quinn. This year Rikki Murray has also come onto the team to help, Loren and Melissa with the cheerleaders.

OnFriday night 15th Melissa show cased our Cheerleading Program to the ICPA State Forum, putting it out there for this program to continue we need sponsorship or donations, as cheerleading doesn't fit the sporting schools criteria

regardless of the sport heading to the next Olympics and it's an international sport. We are lobbying sporting schools to change this at the moment. The program also needs to source gymnastics mats, for our cheerleaders to be safe we need the correct matting. The school needs three of these mats and they are roughly \$1000.00 each with over \$600.00 for freight. The school is trying very hard not to levy this program to students as we are wanting everyone to be involved and don't want it to come down to a cost issue for families.

Our cheerleaders are busy practicing for the next competition on the 11th and 12th of November. *Warm Regards Melissa Quinn*





### An Update on the Restoration of All Saints Anglican Church

In recent weeks we have been advised by the Tasmanian Heritage Council that we are now permitted to re-roof the church using long length sheets of Colorbond. There is, however, a condition placed upon the profile of these sheets. Instead of having a profile of the usual 16.5 mm, sheets with a profile of 21 mm deep are to be used. This will of course make whole project more expensive. We are now waiting for advice from the building contractor regarding this extra cost and are very pleased that a starting date of "sometime" in February has been mentioned.

We appreciate the support that we have received from this community and will keep you up to date when a more definite starting time is known.
