

SALMON EXPANSIONS OK'ED IN DRAFT TASMANIAN SALMON INDUSTRY PLAN

The release of the state government's Tasmanian Salmon Industry Plan today signals an enthusiastic green light for expansions into both state and commonwealth waters.

"The Draft Salmon Plan released today outlines just how far the Tasmanian government is willing to bend over backwards to allow the now multi-national owned salmon companies expand and increase their profits at the expense of the Tasmanian community and pristine public waters." says Rebecca Howarth, Marine Campaigner at Environment Tasmania.

"Not only are offshore Commonwealth Waters up for grabs but State waters too. This is particularly shocking as not long ago the government was keen to reassure the public that the industry would expand no further in state waters. It seems the Tasmanian public have had the wool pulled over their eyes. Expansion by any means possible seems to be the remit, even swapping out zombie leases for new areas of coast."

"Community consultation has been replaced with "outreach" that aims to understand community attitudes. This sounds like an exercise in 'figuring out how to silence the public' rather than actually a genuine consultation of the communities who have connections to Tasmania's coasts. The consultation period is ridiculously short and spanning the Christmas holiday period. We urge the government to extend this period by at least 6 weeks to allow time for thorough engagement of a wide cross-section of the community to be carried out."

"There is no mention of when pens will be removed from inshore fish farms that are "sensitive, sheltered and biodiverse areas" as per Recommendation 3 on the government's own Fin-Fish Inquiry report."





ARTICLES of INTEREST

MAYOR ARNOL ABOUT THE COUNCIL MEETING

At its meeting on Tuesday 22nd November, Council dealt with the usual statutory agenda items as well as some excellent questions on notice by a resident of Coles Bay and the Bicheno Community Development Association. There were no planning matters to be dealt as a planning authority. Some highlights from the agenda include -

The proposed schedule of meetings for 2023 were listed and agreed to by an absolute majority which is a statutory requirement. All meetings in 2023 will be held in Triabunna to facilitate the live streaming that has proven very popular via the YouTube platform. Interest has been expressed by some Councillors to return to a quarterly meeting in each major centre to increase the interaction between the community and Council. Throughout 2023 there will be some assessments done by staff around the ease of facilitating live streaming when meeting away from the Triabunna chambers with a view to initiating a change to the meeting schedule in 2024.

An exciting project coming up is the Dog Management Policy Review and the establishment of the Working Group to undertake the community consultation and produce a Dog Management Policy that is consistent with the requirements of the Dog Control Act and meet the needs of the broader community in dog ownership. Look out for the advertisement calling for representatives on the Working Group and lodge an Expression of Interest. Alternatively, engage with the Working Group during the consultation period to capture YOUR thoughts on a new Dog Management Policy.

Staff continue to produce excellent asset management plans that will enable sound decisions to be made on the future funding of our municipal assets and the Bridge Asset Management Plan on the November agenda was no exception.

Are you part of a community group that could do with an injection of funds? Check out Council's Community Small Grant program where grants of up to \$1,000 are available for the many worthy projects local community groups undertake. Council was pleased to support two grant applications from Bicheno Bowls Club and the Bicheno Community Church Committee at the last meeting.

LOCAL HONEY A WINNER

Swansea bee keepers scored an unexpected win recently. Amateur apiarists Rob Curran and Michael Tyquin were awarded a Silver Medal at the 25th year of the Royal Tasmanian Fine Food Awards for their Dolphin Sands Honey. This event brings many judges from all over Australia - local and interstate.

Their honey was judged second from 200 entrants in the; Extracted Liquid Honey light amber; category, scoring 100 points for flavour. The pair were delighted with their award, the first year they entered the competition after only three years keeping hives.





The Bureau of Meteorology has released its long-range forecast for the summer

It's likely to be wetter than usual along Australia's east coast - particularly coastal New South Wales, most of Victoria, large areas of Queensland, and northern and

eastern Tasmania.

In contrast, drier than usual conditions are more likely in large parts of Western Aus-

In eastern Australia, any significant rainfall has the potential to lead to widespread flooding where rivers are already high, dams are full, and catchments are wet.

Above-average rainfall also increases the risk of landslides and tree falls in areas of steep terrain and very wet soils.

This summer there is a high chance that nights will be warmer than usual across the tropical north and in some southern areas including Tasmania.

Summer days are likely to be warmer than average across most of Western Australia and the Northern Territory, north and central Queensland coastal areas and parts of the south including Tasmania.

Cooler days are likely for most of New South Wales, part of southern Queensland and into Victoria.

Bushfires are always a risk in southern Australia in summer. Vegetation growth after above-average rainfall can lead to a risk of grass fires. AFAC will release its Summer Bushfire Outlook on 29 Novem-

Ocean temperatures around northern Australia are well above average, increasing the risk of tropical cyclones and heavy rain events from systems drawing moisture from the Coral Sea.

This summer there is also an increased risk of:

- prolonged heatwaves with higher humidity in southern areas
- an above average number of tropical cyclones and tropical lows
- coastal flooding in the east and north with unusually high tides forecast around 23 January and 20 February
- marine heatwaves with warmer than average waters around Australia
- thunderstorm asthma events in the south while pollen counts are high in early summer.

Michael Tyquin A range of climate drivers around Australia are contributing to the wet outlook in the east, including a La Niña in the Pacific Ocean, a positive Southern Annular Mode and warmer ocean waters around Austral-

> The negative Indian Ocean Dipole event is weakening and will likely come to an end by early summer, while the La Niña in the Pacific Ocean may start to ease in early 2023.



Roadworks Report Friday, 25th Nov. -Friday, 09nd Dec. 2022

ELEPHANT PASS ROAD GRAY UPDATED

Elephant Pass remains open to all road users with a reduced speed limit and a short section that has been **reduced to one lane**. Elephant Pass is our recommended detour during the closure of St Marys Pass.

Work on longer term repairs started this week. The repairs include a retaining wall to shore up the cracked section of the road, and repairs to the road surface to keep it in a safe and driveable condition.
