About El Son Entero.

El Son Entero is one of Cuba's finest traditional bands. They are the headline band at the Casa de la Trova in their Provincial City of Camaguey in central Cuba. Their music encapsulates the full spirit of Cuban dance music. Son, meaning rhythm, is the central musical force in Cuba. Their sound dives deep into the heart of son via the complex paths handed down through the music of Nigerian slaves. Deeply embedded in all Cuban music, these origins are inseparable from the history, culture, politics and daily life in Cuba. Led by the galloping tres (guitar with three double strings), full Afro-Cuban percussion, dizzying trumpet and tight vocal harmonies.

El Son Entero are truly, as their name implies, "The Full Sound". The sound is a dedication to the most famous and irresistible of Afro-Cuban dance rhythms. Be prepared to swing with chacha, son, danzón, danzonete, mambo, rumba, salsa and bolero. Do as the Cubans do and dance like no one is watching.

Since 2011 the Glamorgan Spring Bay community has been involved in an aid program with Cuba, sending much needed fine timbers, strings and luthier tools to instrument makers in the Camaguey Province. In conjunction with the music-focused aid group the Cuba Cultural Alliance (see their web site), some local folks have worked directly with the Cuban Ministry of Culture to develop a cultural exchange program and as a result, El Son Entero will travel outside Cuba for the very first time. So be proud folks – you deserve it.

The cycle is a fund raising bike ride from Sydney to Hobart beginning on 28th Feb and ending on 14th Mar.



What is happening with The Orford Odeon?

Our intention is to continue to run The Orford Odeon as an incorporated, not-for-profit, community Association, and our objectives have not changed:

To provide a quality cinematic experience that is accessible to the communities of Orford, Triabunna, Buckland and their environs. To promote the cinema and related performing arts activities to the community of the East coast of Tasmania. To involve and educate the community in a diverse range of entertainment, media and theatre. All proceeds to benefit the youth of Glamorgan Spring Bay.

In response to the Media Release being circulated by the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council (GSBC) and Orford Primary School (OPS): The decision to 'separate' and seek incorporation of The Orford Odeon was motivated by opposing views between Council's Manager Community Development (and her assistant) and the volunteer team who were actually running The Orford Odeon. The team wanted to formalise the operation due to the ineffectiveness of the original 'committee' and a lack of accountability for distribution of funds. The decision to incorporate occurred after consultation with, and agreement of, the Principal, OPS and the General Manager, GSBC. Both agreed in writing that existing arrangements would continue while The Odeon's incorporation process was being progressed. Both reneged on this agreement: access by The Orford Odeon to the OPS building was denied by the Principal OPS; personal property of David Kirk & Gavan Barber was not returned and remains held by OPS; the film hire account and the booking for the 2014 Christmas film were cancelled by the Manager Community Development, GSBC.

Furthermore, Council demanded that all references to GSBC and OPS be removed from The Orford Odeon website and all documentation. In addition GSBC removed references to The Orford Odeon on the GSBC website. Fundraising has always been an objective of The Orford Odeon. Through the generosity of the local population and sponsors, funds far greater than expected have been raised to support OPS and Youth Projects in Glamorgan Spring Bay. Sponsorship funding, initiated by David Kirk, has also allowed The Orford Odeon to provide a free bus service for our elderly patrons and keep the overall cost of The Orford Odeon experience to an absolute minimum.

"Movies have continued..."; The Orford Odeon has gone from strength to strength over 4 years but only due to the significant contribution of David Kirk & Gavan Barber through their vision and donation of considerable personal time, effort and money. We are at a loss to understand why any council or school would oppose, rather than support, volunteer members of their community who are operating a successful and multi award-winning social enterprise that not only brings the community together but raises significant and much needed funds to benefit its youth. *The Orford Odeon Public Office*



Ghosts of Morris' Store and the Hairpin Hill Mystery



Who was 'Hairpin' Hill? Swansea's Morris' Store chimney stack, constructed circa 1830, bears testimony to the fact that 'Hairpin' Hill was kicked out of the Swansea pub on May 18th, 1942, by Trooper Button. 'Hairpin's' resentment was so great he recorded the scuffle for posterity on the Morris' chimney cowling - adding a threatening postscript 'RIP' for the benefit of Trooper Button. But 'Hairpin' seems not to be known to the extant Hill family, despite intense enquiry.

Morris' chimney has become a record of Swansea folk history. Employees and the Morris family members themselves have been inscribing their names and remarks since Albert Morris and Arthur Chappell scrawled their signatures across the hardwood covering on 4th August, 1882. PC Mitchell signed on the 28th day of a month in 1882 followed by a pencilled scribble of names and dates faded and ghosted by time.

Legible momentos include: JS Pyke 1864; Alexander Morris 10th August 1928; L Chappell (grandson of Arthur Chappell?) 5th May 1932; KF Pyke, 1942; Charles James Pyke, 1942; N Bender, December 1942; K Cotton 1952; Samuel P Quinn on the 9th day of an illegible month and year.

The advent of felt pens encouraged bigger, more careless graffiti-like signatures and commentary. "Hi there! My name is Leigh Watson (Wombat) and I am a Great Guy," the immodest Texta scrawl declared on 31st May 1987. Charmaine Webb Texta'd her name on the chimney on Wednesday 18th January 1977, as did Anne Housege on 10th February 1976. Wendy C writes that she "was here in 1999" then in 2004 informs us that she was "still here".

Janet Skeggs added her signature on 8th July 1981 and Anne Barden said: "I was up here with Sally Pyke on 30th January 1980". Jacquie Hine tells us:




