ENSURING RECRUITMENT AT TASMANIAN COUNCILS IS MERIT-BASED

The Integrity Commission has warned the Tasmanian local government sector is exposed to perceptions of nepotism and cronyism in recruitment.

In a report tabled in State Parliament to-

day, the Commission recommended that the Minister for Local Government develop a model recruitment policy aimed at addressing the issue.

The report also recommended that the Local Government Act be amended to reintroduce a provision obligating councils to appoint employees based on merit.

"This was removed in 2005 and while we are unsure of the government's intention at the time, the Commission is of the view this is an important legislative measure to protect the public interest," Integrity Commission CEO Michael Easton said.

"However, legislation without clear policy guidelines on how people should administer the law leaves both individuals and organisations exposed.

"Therefore, we have recommended that the Minister for Local Government develop a model policy for all councils in Tasmania to adopt."

A recent investigation titled Investigation Smithies examined recruitment processes involving alleged misconduct at a Tasmanian council.

Several of the jobs in question were awarded via a process called direct appointment which means the roles were not advertised – internally or externally.

"There was also no policy governing recruitment processes at the council and therefore no requirement to disclose any conflicts of interest," Mr Easton said. "In this investigation we found there was a failure to recognise that a professional association – where two people have worked together before – was a potential conflict of interest.

"This was followed by a failure to ever declare that potential conflict which in turn led to a complaint and these issues being investigated.

"Having a clear legislative and policy framework alongside thorough training which ensures people understand those policies, protects the reputation of the people and organisations involved, and promotes workplace harmony.

"And getting the right people into the right roles benefits not just the council itself but also ratepayers who receive better public services as a result."

The Commission's finding comes after a 2021 report by the Tasmanian Audit Office recommended appointment processes for council general-managers also be conducted on a merit basis.

Key failures identified in the investigation included:

- no selection reports or documentation showing why a selected applicant was the best one based on merit
- professional relationships leading to bias and different treatment of applicants, at times favourable and at times not favourable, and
- no documentation of the reason for using a direct appointment process rather than an open and competitive one

MAYORAL MOMENT FOR FEBURARY

At the February meeting, Council was pleased to support a community event sponsorship for Coles Bay Triathlon and a community small grant for Maria Voic-

Asset Management Plans (AMP) are an important part of Council's financial planning process. The Coastal Infrastructure AMP, Buildings AMP and Hydraulic Infrastructure AMP were all approved at the meeting. There are three other AMPs that were approved in October 2022. Council's Audit Panel commended the work that had been undertaken and acknowledged 'the increasing maturity of the asset management planning, and that this will be work that continues to be refined over time'.

Council requested the General Manager to establish a robust consultation process with our communities leading up to the budget discussions. As a result, the staff presented a Community Engagement Plan for endorsement at this meeting. Check out the 2023 Community Budget survey on the website www.gsbc.tas.gov.au. Throughout April there will be Community Connect sessions across the municipal area.

Another matter that was not dealt with at the February meeting but a very pleasing outcome is the recently released Integrity Commission report that dealt with concerns around the process of recruitment of General Managers and other direct appointments over recent years within Tasmanian local government. Page 12 of the report highlights the GSBC recruitment policy and states 'Ideally, to avoid the high and inherent risks in undertaking direct appointments, all Tasmanian Councils should adhere to these aspects of the GSBC policy'. It is gratifying that the Integrity Commission made special mention of GSBC and that we have a sound recruitment policy and procedure.



It probably goes without saying that it is very difficult to avoid accusations of nepotism in a small community when you are a major employer!

Council officers continue to field questions about a myriad of issues across the municipal area after the weather events of recent months. They are a small but dedicated team who do their best to answer all questions and provide solutions within the financial constraints of a small rural council. Don't forget there is a process to lodge complaints on the Council website.

A DRY AUTUMN FORECAST FOR MOST **OF AUSTRALIA**

The Bureau of Meteorology has released its <u>long-range</u> forecast for autumn 2023 and it indicates coming months are likely to be drier and warmer than usual across most of Australia.

Warmer than usual daytime temperatures are very likely this autumn for much of Australia, while warmer nights are also likely in coastal areas of the mainland and particularly Tasmania.

Bureau of Meteorology Technical Lead Extended Prediction Dr Andrew Watkins said drier than average conditions have emerged in some areas over summer, including parts of southern Queensland, western Tasmania and south-west Western Australia.

"Australia's key climate drivers are easing and expected to be neutral over the coming months. When our climate drivers are more neutral, autumn rainfall in southern Australia has generally been lower than average over recent decades," Dr Watkins

AREA CONNECT IS HELPING PEOPLE LIKE TAYLOR ON THE EAST COAST

Do you, or someone you know, need transport to get to work or training? If so, contact Area Connect to see if they can help.

Area Connect is a statewide free and flexible transport option for people to get to work or training in regional areas where access to private or public transport is limited or unavailable.

Since Area Connect began seven months ago, 785 trips have been completed on the East Coast.

Stephen Woolfe is the local coordinator based on the East Coast. Stephen works with clients, Break O'Day Employment Connect, employment and training providers, employers, and other organisations around the area to help people connect with training and employment opportunities.

Taylor from St Marys is one of the many people who Area Connect has helped. She found employment at the Beachfront Hotel in Bicheno but was unable to get there without regular transport or a driver licence.

"Area Connect has been absolutely brilliant. They have helped so many people and Steve has been awesome transporting a small group of us to and from work at the hotel each day," said Taylor.

"There's not a lot of places to work in St Marys so getting to work in Bicheno and having Area Connect take us there has made a big difference."

Taylor was put in touch with Area Connect by her job provider, Asuria. "I feel like some people look at Area Connect and say it's not for me. But we need services like these to get to work. I'd encourage people to use this service because it is the difference between having and not having a job.

"If I didn't have Area Connect I wouldn't be able to get to work, it's as simple as that. It's been brilliant and we couldn't have asked for a better driver." Area Connect is delivered by Community Transport Services Tasmania (CTST) and supported by the Tasmanian Government through Jobs Tasmania.

"Area Connect is a new initiative in flexible transport and we are here to serve smaller and more remote communities like those found on the East Coast," said Lyndon Stevenson, CEO of Area Connect and CTST.

"Our service doesn't duplicate any existing services but rather expand the services available so that people can connect with training and employment. We work closely with Break O'Day Employment Connect, training, and employment providers to break down the barriers to access.

"We strongly encourage people to contact us to find out how we can help. If you know of a friend or family member who needs transport for work or training, we can help."




