HONOUR THE DEAD, FIGHT FOR THE LIVING

As we look back over the past 16 months and turn towards the future, it's more important than ever to pause for reflection this Anzac Day.

Anzac Day means so much to so many people.

For some, it's a day to remember family and friends long gone.

For others, it's a day to cherish those who remain, to hold a loved one close.

Tasmania has a strong history of involvement in Australia's Defence Force and military engagements.

In WWI approximately 15,000 Tasmanians went to war, from a small population of just over 200,000 people.

Today, that would be like 37,500 Tasmanians signing up, the combined populations of all the men, women and children in the towns of Sorell, Brighton, Longford, St Helens, New Norfolk, Deloraine, Bridgewater, Prospect Vale, Campbell Town, Sheffield, Westbury, Swansea, Cressy and Richmond.

Some Tasmanians will today pause to reflect on the sacrifices made by the Anzacs who fought so bravely in that terrible conflict.

Others may look to the troops who defended Australia and democracy during WWII.

Even more may take a moment to remember those who served more recently in subsequent conflicts and peacekeeping missions – Korea, Vietnam, East Timor, Kuwait, Afghanistan, and Iraq among them.

Not one of us is without thanks for the bravery of these servicemen and service-women. But it is not enough to remember those who died on the battlefield.

We must also honour those who returned and do more to provide the support and care required to confront the rate of veteran suicide in Australia.

Since 2001, at least 400 returned service personnel have taken their own lives.

That figure continues to rise, and a royal commission can no longer be delayed.

I addressed the parliament last month on the need for a royal commission because I wanted to be able to look the veterans in my community in the eye and say that when the opportunity arose, I spoke up for them.

The national parliament has now voted for a royal commission to be held but we are yet to receive a commitment from the Government that it will implement one.

It is those people – veterans, friends and families affected by suicide – who must not be forgotten when we come together on April 25.

Many readers will recall how Anzac Day could not be commemorated at public gatherings in 2020.

I remember waking before dawn to stand at the end of my driveway and listen to the live-streamed memorial service and

Last Post.

I know many other Australians also woke up early, lit their candles and laid their wreaths.

Millions of Australians stood alone but as one to commemorate Anzac Day last year and now, in 2021, we can again come together, in both body and spirit.

I will be there at dawn again and, like so many others, I won't be alone.

Drawing on local knowledge to restore internationally significant Tasmanian wetlands

Looking into the past is providing clues for future management of important wetlands in Tasmania's south east. A four-year Australian Government funded project is working to improve the ecological condition of Apsley Marshes and Moulting Lagoon – two internationally important wetlands that serve as critical feeding areas for migratory birds and nursery grounds for commercial and recreational fish species.

Led by NRM South in collaboration with local farmers and landowners, on-ground works in the wetlands are underway.

Planned works include removal of stock from sensitive saltmarsh areas, weed control and vegetation restoration and, in some areas, attempting to restore natural water flows

In late March, one of the key partners in this project, environmental organisation Nature Glenelg Trust (NGT), made their first visit to the wetlands to meet with local landholders. Weaving together historical data, community knowledge and modern technology, NGT will be attempting to create a picture of how the ecology and water flows of Moulting Lagoon have changed over the last two centuries – which will provide insights to help guide future management strategies for the wetlands.

Dr. Rosie Hohnen, Senior Project Officer with NRM South and project lead, commented on the value of having expertise from NGT in developing this project. "Nature Glenelg Trust have a great track record when it comes to collaborative work between farmers, public land managers and scientists on complex wetland issues across public and private land" she said. "We were very interested in partnering with them as they have successfully restored wetlands with farmers and land-owners at many sites across south-eastern Australia."

The first part of this task has involved talking to local landholders - some of whom have lived in the area their whole lives. Mark Bachmann, Principal Ecologist with NGT believes that the importance of local knowledge in developing project plans cannot be overstated. "The only way we can accurately piece together the drainage history of an important site like this, where incomplete records exists but we know some changes to drainage date back as far as the 1800s, is by listening to local land-owners, as well as the local fishing and hunting community, and incorporating their knowledge into our work. Building our understanding of the wetlands' history is absolutely critical to the scientific investigation we will also undertake."

Dr. Hohnen also reiterated the value that community members would bring to the project. "The involvement and on-ground actions of local farmers is critical to conserving the wetlands' values," she explained. "And we're also interested in speaking with anyone that may have historical knowledge or maps and images of the area in and around Moulting Lagoon and Apsley Marshes."

The "Improving the Ecological Character of Apsley Marshes and Moulting Lagoon Ramsar Sites" project is supported by NRM South through funding from the Australian Government's National Landcare Program and runs until June 2023. RUTH HAZLETON COMES TO SWANSEA

One of Australia's most highly regarded folk singers, Ruth Hazleton is a multi-award-winning instrumentalist, singer and songwriter (Kate Burke & Ruth Hazleton/Dev'lish Mary). In a career spanning over twenty-five years, she has recorded and toured nationally and internationally and been privileged to work with some of the world's most iconic folk & roots musicians including Andy Irvine (IRE – Planxty), Nancy Kerr & The Sweet Visitor Band (UK – 2015, BBC Folk Singer of the Year), James Keelaghan (Canada) & Bruce Molsky (USA).

Equipped with an electric guitar and an open-back 5-string banjo, Ruth began her solo journey in 2019, releasing *Daisywheel*, produced by acclaimed Tasmanian musician and composer Luke Plumb (Shooglenifty). The album was recently nominated for 'Best Folk Album 2020' at the Music Victoria Awards and has been described as "...compelling and intimately fierce" (Living Tradition – UK).

The Long Tradition of Game-Taking on The Moulting Lagoon

Recently, there has been quite some controversy regarding the shooting of ducks on Moulting Lagoon, with some seeking the end of the practice. The Greens MP, Rosalie Woodruff, is wrong in her claim that duck shooting is not a Tasmanian tradition [1]. This article discusses the history of shooting on the lagoon and demonstrates through historical evidence that hunting there has long been a traditional practice for the folk of Swansea and the Glamorgan region in general. Conversations with Swansea locals who have ancestry here, reveal oral histories that only confirms to be true what the following account relates. That is, the taking of game on the Moulting Lagoon is part of our community's connection to place and any ideas of outlawing it represents an oppressive denial of traditional land-use rights.

For example, The Hobart Tribune newspaper on the 4th of February 1878 [2] reports: "On the Moulting Lagoon there is excellent swan, duck and teal shooting to be had" [2] and as early as Thursday the 30th of January 1873 - just over 40 years since the first European settlement in Glamorgan - The Mercury newspaper [3] Swansea correspondent reports: "The first day of the shooting season found several boats [on Moulting Lagoon] ... There were many more birds than usual (thanks to the game laws), and a good

day's sport was the result". The mention of 'game laws' already in those early days hints at efforts to balance what nature can give and what people could take. However, nature was not then considered a separate post-modern aesthetic 'other' - to be locked up and only to be appreciated from afar, like a painting. It was a landscape to be lived in and to gain nourishment from. The early Swansea community had already a responsible sense of stewardship of what the Lagoon could give as demonstrated by the 'game laws'. This relationship with the lagoon only deepened and became more sophisticated over the generations. The community had to work together to successfully reap the bounty of the lagoon, as so eloquently described by E.S. Emerson in 1909 in the magazine 'Lone Hand' Vol 5 No. 25 (1st of May) page 106:

The opening of the shooting season at the lagoon is known as "The Swanning," ... Sir William Lyne, who was born within sight of the Schoutens, seldom misses it, and the people roundabout look upon it as the event of the year? Indeed, on the eve of the opening, the whole adult male population of the locality seems to be attracted to the lagoon. Arrived there they bivouac for the night, and at the break of day numbers of them, armed with rifles and shot guns, form a cordon across the narrowest and shallowest stretch of the water. Others, wading or working up to the head of the lagoon in boats, endeavour to close in on the swans and to make them take wing across this line of fire. Of the thousands that do, perhaps, on a "good" day, 500 falls; and this is "the swanning." But the residents of the district are good sports, and the custom is, whether with rifle or shot gun, to shoot only at swans in flight to inter-

fere with a bird in moult, or with cygnets, or with young birds not fully fledged, is an unpardonable crime, and no young man could earn a worse reputation than to become known as a "butcher." As a matter of fact, there is one flock of Albino swans on the lagoon which has never been fired at by any of the local residents. The flesh of the birds taken on the lagoon is delicately flavoured, but highly coloured and coarse in texture...

These are but a few snippets of the scores of references in newspapers and magazines during the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, to the taking of game on the Moulting Lagoon which are made available to the public through the National Library of Australia. Although 'the swanning' has long since ceased and the Black Swan is now fully protected, the game-taking tradition of duck shooting continues until this day and the attempted outlawing of it would be to deny the local Swansea community a core part of their cultural identity and practice.




