

WHERE ARE TASMANIAN COUNCILS' **"CONSULTATION** PACKS"?

Today the ASU, representing council workers, stood outside the Government Executive Building to demand Minister for Local Government Nic Street stop with his plans of forced council amalgamations.

Labor is firm in our position: we do not support forced council amalgamations.

The Liberal Government lacks any sort of transparency, as Tasmanians wait for their opportunity for consultation.

People from across Local Government were expecting their consultation packs as part of the Liberals' Local Government Review on Monday.

Now they're being told to expect them at the end of the month.

As one Mayor told me, "the goalposts have moved again".

It was all well and good for Minister Street to buckle to pressure when he announced the latest extension last week.

That time extension was supposed to help councils do proper engagement, not cover up how unorganised the Minister is.

Minister Street has held up the latest round of Local Government Review engagement at every turn, including taking three weeks to read the report before releasing it to councils and the public.

It is becoming clear that the latest delay was to buy the Minister more time rather than give councils appropriate time to do their work.

PHARMACISTS TO **PAY FOR ILL-FATED DISPENSING POLICY**

There is only one way to describe the Labor Government's ill-conceived 60-day dispensing policy - a wolf in sheep's clothing that will inevitably leave pharmacists and patients out-of-pocket and out of options.

It was clear from their reaction that pharmacists across the country were blindsided on the eve of the Federal Budget when Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and Health Minister Mark Butler made the announcement of a policy measure touted as "cheaper medicines".

However, the reality is that this will lead to anything but cheaper medicines. What it will lead to is pharmacy closures, shorter opening hours, exacerbated medicine shortages and less services provided by community pharmacies, which ultimately impact the patient.

How do I know this? Because pharmacists, their staff and their clients are contacting my office every day, pleading for help, explaining their very real concerns. They are worried; and their calls, emails, flyers, and petitions are going unanswered and ignored by a government that boldly declared it would "leave no Australian behind" when it took office 12 months ago.

Tasmanian pharmacists like Judy at Railton, Bel at New Norfolk, or the larger partnerships across the state, are begging to be heard about the impact this will have on their businesses - they are saying categorically that this will push them to the brink, and they will have to make the hard decision to shut up shop, introduce charges for previously complimentary programs, or drastically cut services, all at the expense of the patient.

These people are educated professionals; they are small business owners who are savvy about the financial viability of their business. But, when you cut to the heart of it, they are carers; they care deeply for their patients and their patients care for them.

And let's not forget, pharmacists were essential workers who worked diligently through the darkest days of the pandemic and kept the lights on in their pharmacies to provide medicines, vaccines and antivirals to patients who contracted COVID-19 at a time when most other small businesses were shut.

They are rightly worried about the impact this policy will have, not just on them, but on their patients. They fear they will have to close, which in towns that only has one pharmacy will have an incredible impact on their communities.

One pharmacist even told me she was worried about 60-day dispensing because it would mean she wouldn't physically see some of her chronically ill patients for 60 days. If a dosage is not right, or a medicine is no longer appropriate, a lot can go wrong in that time.

And how does the Albanese government treat those who dare to raise concerns, or those who ask for more consultation on these changes that will have a huge impact on their business?

They characterise them as scaremongers, and accuse the Pharmacy Guild, the peak body that represents the interests of the industry, of running a scare campaign against the policy.

Concerns that halving their dispensing budget will impact their ability to deliver crucial programs and services is not scare mongering. It is a genuine attempt by an industry to have their concerns heard. But they are continually being ignored.

The reality is that the Albanese Labor government is looking for government savings at the expense of pharmacists.

I am all for reducing the cost of medicines

for consumers, however this is an illconceived policy that will reduce services, push pharmacists to breaking points and has the potential to create healthcare deserts - towns that are no longer catered for by either a permanent GP, a bulk-billing GP or have a pharmacist in their town.

Regional communities need their pharmacies, they depend on them every day, and they are playing a crucial role in the health care chain in keeping people healthy and well. Abruptly stopping consultation and hurling insults is not the way you treat such an essential service.

The Albanese Labor Government have failed in this important test of transparency. Labor have failed to engage meaningfully with pharmacists about how this will impact them and be transparent about how it will impact the broader community.

Tasmania's Labor MPs should stand up for the regions they represent and back away from this dangerous policy. I call on them to engage meaningfully in transparent discussions with their local pharmacists and take their concerns to Canberra, instead of hiding behind the party position on this illthought-out policy.

Making medicines cheaper should not be at the expense of pharmacists.

THE MAYORAL MOMENTS FOR MAY 2023

From the Mayor's desk.....

It is really worrying how quickly time is going these days. It hardly seems possible that a month has gone by since the last Mayoral Moment. Is it because I am ageing or that we all lead such busy lives these days? Perhaps a combination of both.

The Council meeting held on Tuesday 23rd May dealt with the usual statutory matters and Officer reports. Dog Management and Environmental Health Fees and Charges were a separate agenda item this month due to the statutory obligations to have those set to enable licence renewal forms to be developed and distributed. The balance of the fees and charges will be included on the next agenda with the rates resolution and other budgetary matters.

There was only one planning matter on the agenda and Council supported the recom-

mendation of the planner to refuse the development. Council is generally supportive of development across the whole of the municipal area but being part of the Statewide Planning Scheme imposes certain criteria that is not always able to be met even by the most well-intentioned developers.

The Community Small Grant program attracted an interesting application from Families Tasmania to provide Baby and Child First Aid Sessions in the municipal area. One of Council's key foundations is Our Community's Health and Wellbeing and elected members had no hesitation in supporting this application for what will be valuable First Aid for Infants and Toddler information sessions to build confidence in parenting of the precious younger members of our community.

Aside from the Council meeting, Councillors have been heavily involved in budget workshops and developing the rates resolution. Both staff and elected members are mindful of the community's capacity to pay and the ever increasing cost of living pressures we are all under so robust discussions have been held in workshops.

our minds is the poor treatment of Glamorgan Spring Bay by the State Grants Commission (SGC) in the base grant. Below is the breakdown of the grants received by similar councils to us. It is sobering reading and has been going on for years because of the methodology used by the SGC. Our conservative estimate is that we have missed out on untied grants of around \$7.5million in the last 5 years alone. What is an 'untied grant'? Basically it means that Council can use it for whatever they require to fund, operational or infrastructure. I did tell someone recently (tongue in cheek) that it could be used to pay a bonus to staff or buy the Mayor a Ferrari! Any opportunity that you get to speak to a politician (State or Federal) then please mention it. People power just might win the dav.

Until next time, stay safe and enjoy this wonderful part of Tasmania that we call home.






