BOAT RAMP FIASCO CAUSES ECONOMIC DISASTER FOR SWANSEA.

During a 'normal' summer day upwards of fifty visiting recreational boats would be launched at Swansea. Counts of over 100 being not unusual. Mostly for fishing but some just to enjoy time on the water. Each of these boats and their occupants would conservatively have spent of \$200 each in Swansea on Fuel, Refreshments and Food. Those staying overnight considerably more. During our recent cool but calm autumn days, it was to be expected that 10 boats would still be out on the water. What have we seen: one boat with the owner struggling ankle deep in water, 200 metres from the shore with his small boat stuck on the sand

It is easy to calculate that boating fraternity, both local and visitors, would contribute in excess of \$5,000,000 to the local economy over a year; if they could actually launch boats at Swansea. Maybe that's not a lot. Perhaps 40 direct jobs, 100 people supporting the local services including our fantastic health care team, 20-30 children keeping our school viable: 100 people helping to retain a choice of shopping and catering facilities: 100 people helping to retain local sporting facilities. Shall we go on.

HISTORICALLY: Prior to 1950, boats were in the main, heavy things made of wood. There were two hanging on davits from the jetty: That short piece between the original stone abutments. These could be lowered by hand winch into around 6 ft. of water. There were also a number stored under the 'jetty shed' (the warehouse long gone), from where they could be dragged over a short wooden slipway into the sea. The commercial fishing boats were moored at the end of the 500m long jetty. With the advent of trailer boats in the late 1950's, volunteer workers of the Swansea Tourist & Progress association, under the direction of Doug Lewis, built a concrete ramp beside the jetty abutment. Initially this was fine (provided you could avoid all those pesky boys who persisted in diving/jumping into the sea from the top of bathing shed. It was only 9 metres above water level with over 2 metres of deep water to land

But in came the sand.

Over the years since, many attempts have been made to extend concrete ramps at ground level, into deeper water. All these have done is trap more sand. So now we have 200 metres more beach to play on. The latest building of a new ramp on piers was a good idea, to little, to late.

SAND MOVEMENT:

In the 1960's, the Glamorgan Council commissioned a hydrological study and dye tests into current flows in Swansea region of Oyster Bay . The objective being to prove that waste water from the sullage outlet would flow out to sea and not back into the bay. Proved. The study showed that the prevailing current movement came up the bay and on hitting 9 mile beach, split with a flow going East towards the Swan River mouth and another flow swirling West past Jubilee Beach and back into deep water, taking with it the effluent and any drifting sand.

As every practical engineer knows and as has been proven worldwide, to trap sand and build a beach what is needed is a solid structure at right angles to the shore line. Just what the ever expanding solid concrete ramps are. Which is why we now have a nice wide beach and no useable boat launching facility.

SOLUTIONS:

Abandon the existing site and build new launching facilities elsewhere. Gull rock is an obvious although strongly opposed site. It has been there 'for ever', has moderately deep water and some degree of shelter from the prevailing swell. Gordon Street could be substantially improved but needs a breakwater which may result in similar silting problems. If the present site is to be retained, then continued building into deeper water is futile. The only solution is to bring water back by the removal of all the solid structures and promoting water flow under the pier and high level ramp. Perhaps a breakwater, parallel to the land, would in addition to providing sheltered water, promote a tunnelling effect clearing the sand build up?
