# PAINT THE TOWN RED WHAT & WHY IS IT?

Some of the buildings in Swansea are displaying red lighting on their exteriors, to celebrate the Winter Solstice in the Southern Hemisphere.

The winter solstice marks the beginning of astrological winter when the length of "daylight" is at its shortest for the year "At the summer solstice, the Sun travels the longest path through the sky, and that day therefore has the most daylight. When the summer solstice happens in the Northern Hemisphere, the North <u>Pole</u> is tilted about 23.4° (23°27′) toward the Sun. Because the Sun's rays are shifted northward from the Equator by the same amount, the vertical noon rays are directly overhead at the Tropic of Cancer (23°27' N). Six months later, the South Pole is inclined about 23.4° toward the Sun. On this day of the summer solstice in the Southern Hemisphere, the Sun's vertical overhead rays progress to their southernmost position, the Tropic of Capricorn (23°27′ S)." #### EAST COAST HEALTH CENTRE UPDATE

9 June 2021

Glamorgan Spring Bay Council has been working closely with our medical providers in our municipality to identify how we can best provide medical services to our community.

Council and the Swansea General Practice have reached a point where we would like to explore opportunities for a external organisation to deliver health care services at the Triabunna, Swansea and Bicheno Practices.

This means that we are wanting to ask for expressions of interest's from medical providers to run the three centres in our community.

Whilst we have excellent staff and medical practitioners, we want to see if there is another model which will improve this service. As part of the EOI, we are making it clear that we especially want to see our fantastic medical practitioners and staff remain at each location, but look into other options on how the overall business in managed to make sure residents can access a wide range of affordable medical services. The first step in this process is that we will release an Expression of Interest (EOI) document which service providers can respond to. Once the EOI's are received we will then evaluate the submissions through a panel of senior staff and medical practitioners. The submissions that are able to address the criteria will then be invited to submit a more detailed tender. This way we can ensure we are meeting our requirements under the *Local Government Act* and also achieve the best possible outcome for our community.

This process will take several weeks, and Council will keep the community informed of the outcomes.

# 100 YEARS OF ROTARY IN AUSTRALIA

In a year when we mark 100 years since the formation of the Royal Australian Air Force, the creation of the iconic Chanel No. 5 perfume and the important medical discovery of insulin, Rotarians around Australia are celebrating a centenary of service.

Rotary clubs were founded in Melbourne and Sydney in April 1921 and May 1921, respectively. This started a service movement that today numbers around 1100 charter Rotary Clubs with 30,000 members throughout the country.

As a past president of the Rotary Club of Central Launceston, I was pleased to be able to co-sponsor Senator Dean Smith's motion in the Senate, which acknowledged that Rotary Australia was celebrating its centenary anniversary and first 100 years of service this year.

To this end, Rotary clubs have been undertaking community projects as part of the Centenary of Rotary Campaign. These include the Australasian Centenary Project, in partnership with UNICEF, called Give Every Child a Future. This project sets the goal to protect 100,000 children from rotavirus, pneumococcal disease and cervical cancer across nine South Pacific Island countries over three years.

Australian clubs have also visited schools to speak about Rotary and its work and participate in the R100 Centenary Baton Relay, while others have invited schools to visit the Canberra Rotary Peace Bell or plant Centenary Peace Poles with special messages to promote world peace, as part of an international peace movement.



# Council Response to Article 'Free Green Waste Removal for Cambria Drive and Dolphin Sands Resident' of GOBN Issue 22.

With reference to the article by Steve Barrett entitled 'Free Green Waste Removal for Cambria Drive and Dolphin Sands Resident' in last week's GOBN, we thank you for the focus on removal of fire hazards around dwellings.

Please be aware that a permit is required from Council for the clearing of native vegetation in excess of that specifically referred to in the article. Please also be aware that clearing any vegetation and the associated soil disturbance can leave exposed soil susceptible to invasion by weeds. Council officers have recently observed some infestations of serrated tussock in open areas on roadsides as well as on private properties along Cambria Drive and Dolphin Sands Road.

If you think you have seen this weed on your property or need advice about controlling it, please contact a GSBC Weed Officer, Amanda or Terry, on 6256 4777.



Australian Rotary clubs are part of a larger international network of around 1.2 million business, professional and community leaders who seek to make the world a better place through practical efforts at a local community level. All members commit to follow the Rotary motto of "Service Above Self" in personal, business and community life, as well as follow Rotary International's strategic plan goals to support and strengthen clubs; focus and increase humanitarian service; and enhance public image and awareness.

Lawyer Paul Harris formed the first Rotary club in Chicago in 1905, with Australia's first club following 16 years later in Melbourne. Rotary Club of Melbourne secretary Walter Drummond and member Professor William Alexander Osborne later came to Launceston with the idea of forming a club in Tasmania.

The Rotary Club of Launceston website says the Melbourne Rotarians initially "received little encouragement for several weeks until they met (Sir) Dr John Ramsay in Launceston", with the inaugural meeting of Tasmania's first Rotary club held at the Brisbane Hotel on 18 February 1924. Dr Ramsay was elected president of the newly formed Rotary Club of Launceston. The club's 25 members chose the platypus as its emblem, which remains on the banner still.

Tasmania's North-South divide reared its head even then, with Sir Henry Jones sending a telegram to the first meeting "forgiving Launceston for robbing Hobart of its birthright". After their Launceston visit Professor Osborne and Mr Drummond travelled to Hobart where Tasmania's second Rotary club was formed. Sir Henry was elected the Rotary Club of Hobart's first president. Launceston and Hobart were Australia's fifth and sixth Rotary Clubs respectively.

Launceston's club quickly became very active, reaffirming its service commitment to the community within months. Money was donated to the Salvation Army to distribute Christmas dinner to the city's poorer residents in December 1924 and the club was appointed to organise and collect clothing for flood victims after Northern Tasmania's 1929 floods.

The Rotary Club of Launceston subsequently sponsored a number of other clubs in Tasmania, including Devonport in 1928, Burnie in 1941, Beaconsfield (now West Tamar) in 1952 and South Launceston in 1962. Many others followed, including my own - the Rotary Club of Central Launceston – which was formed in the early 1980s.

There are now 47 Rotary Clubs in Tasmania with 1200 members continuing to commit to the principle of Service Above Self set out by Paul Harris in 1905. There are many ongoing Rotary projects Tasmanians would be familiar with, including RYLA (Rotary Youth leadership Awareness) and RYDA (Rotary Youth Driver Awareness), Food Plants International, plus Tasmanian Rotarians can be seen volunteering at COVID-19 vaccination clinics and Second Bite food banks, building bus shelters, providing emergency food relief, helping children learn to read and running mental health forums.

More than \$2 million has been raised for disaster relief and numerous community projects completed and supported by Tasmanian clubs over the past decade. Rotary Tasmania believes that it is important for all Rotarians to feel welcome, respected and valued for the contribution they make to their club as well as support the community.

When founder Paul Harris visited Tasmania in 1935 he planted friendship trees in Launceston and Hobart. Launceston's tree was a Himalayan cedar, which still flourishes near the Cenotaph in Royal Park. I see this as a fitting testament to the organisation's longevity in this centenary year.






