"Andrew has been involved over the years with the PCYC (including as President for several years), Little Athletics, and after school sport with the local primary school. Camilla has always had a passion to ensure all kids become water safe and works with the school to make sure all ages can receive water safety lessons.

"As a dedicated equestrian, Camilla is also the state representative for medical safety in equestrian sport in Australia.

"Andrew is a keen kayaker and mountain biker, and is in final preparations for a kayak crossing of Bass Strait.

"We warmly congratulate Camilla and Andrew on this highly-deserved award."

Dr Grove said that receiving the Award was a

"wonderful surprise".

"Camilla and I work well together, and our different skills complement each other's" he said.

"Camilla's scope is more concentrated on women's and child and adolescent health, whereas I see most of the men's health issues. With an elderly population we both see significant chronic health disease. Palliative care is part of our everyday work and we find this a challenging but rewarding part of our practice. Camilla's past training in anaesthetics and obstetrics gets us out of trouble when the heat turns up!

"The 24/7 on-call has its challenges but, being a GP couple, we find a flexible system works better than a roster. We choose who of us attends the hospital after-hours by determining who is most appropriate for the presentation or the patient. We try to always see our own patients.

"On winter evenings, whoever doesn't have their PJs on will be the one to attend the hospital if called – and given Camilla is a Queenslander and hasn't acclimatised to Tasmanian weather yet, I usually get the short straw.

"The pace of life on the East Coast is slow - everything happens in 'Swansea time'. This suits us, and it would be very hard to leave the Swansea community to live in a city after all these years.

"It is the variety of cases, and never knowing what might walk in the door next, that's attractive to us in rural practice – and looking after a small community offers continuity of care at a level

that is not replicated in any other medical job. Looking after 4 living generations of the one family is also a regular practice and very rewarding.

"Our practice has gradually expanded from a one person equivalent practice to now needing a third doctor to permanently join the team, so if you are interested in working in a wonderful rural community please get in touch!"

Swansea-based rural doctors, Dr Camilla Byrne and Dr Andrew Grove, have been announced as the joint recipients of the Rural Doctors Association of Tasmania (RDAT) Rural Doctor of the Year Award 2021 in recognition of their devoted service to their community over many years, and their wider service to rural medicine.

"Camilla and Andrew have been the sole GPs in Swansea for 17 years, and are known for their high standards of care and their amazing support of medical student teaching in Tasmania" RDAT President, Dr Eve Merfield, said.

"They run a general practice, are on-call 24/7 for the hospital urgent care centre, and use their Accident & Emergency skills regularly as the nearest major hospital is two hours away. They also look after patients in the 5 acute beds and 55 nursing home beds of the local aged care centre, and they support rural GP registrar training and medical student placements.

"They are now fundraising to build more consulting space in their community-owned practice, which will benefit not only their patients but also the many medical students who train with them.

"Their ambition is to improve their already excellent practice by accommodating visiting specialists and allied health workers, and they are also keen to train more junior doctors and/or GP registrars in Swansea – this will benefit the local community as well as increasing the capacity of rural medical training in Tasmania.

Breathe Better in Cold Weather this Winter

Winter is upon us and this can be a difficult time for people with asthma.

Before the seasonal change blasted through, Asthma Australia reached out to the community to find out what impacted their asthma most in winter. By far, their biggest concern was the cold air impacting their breathing.

One person said "the cold air makes my lungs feel like there are razor blades running up and down" while others reported "usually my asthma symptoms worsen during the winter months. Especially when I get sick. I do not look forward to the colder months of the year."

During winter, cold air can affect the airways and lead to the muscles tightening. The colder and less humid winter air can dry out the thin layer of protective fluid in the airways and increase the risk of inflammation. These factors can lead to asthma symptoms or more sensitivity in the airways.

Consistent and controlled asthma management reduces inflammation inside the airways and is the best way to make sure people with asthma are less affected by cold air. To help you breathe better this winter, Asthma Australia has put together some important steps to take:

> Take your prescribed preventer, even when well Visit your doctor for an asthma review and get an up-to-date written Asthma Action Plan Practice good winter hygiene Stay up to date with vaccinations Learn the steps of Asthma First Aid

Taking these steps towards having good asthma control means fewer asthma flareups, doctor visits, time off work or hospi talisations. Rate Model Change

Glamorgan Spring Bay Council is considering adopting a fairer rates model based on the value of residential properties in the coming financial year 2021-22.

General Manager, Greg Ingham, said Glamorgan Spring Bay Council is currently one of the only municipalities in Tasmania to use the outdated Average Area Rate (AAR) model for residential properties. "Under this model every residential property in the same town pays the same amount in general rates regardless of property value," Mr Ingham said.

"It has become increasingly apparent that with the large variation of property prices within areas the AAR system is not fair or equitable for our residents and rates income has not kept pace with the growth of the region.

Glamorgan Spring Bay Council rates are currently among the lowest in the state, yet we face distinct challenges in servicing a decentralised municipality with a small number of permanent residents and a large, seasonal population of tourists and shack owners.

Moving to an Assessed Annual Valuation (AAV) model, based on the valuation of individual properties, will help put Council on a sustainable financial footing and better serve the needs of our community." Mr Ingham said the impact of the change would vary across the municipality, depending on property values assessed independently by the Valuer General.

"More than half of residential ratepayers will see their general rates decrease, or increase by less than \$3.85 per week," Mr Ingham said.

"A smaller proportion of ratepayers with high value properties will experience higher increases, however they will still be in line with similar valued properties in neighbouring municipalities.

The rate model change has been recommended to meet the objectives of the Council's Long Term Financial Management Plan, which was adopted in March. We have also adopted new asset management plans which place an emphasis on the things we know people care about most – ensuring that core infrastructure like sealed roads, parks and sporting facilities are maintained to a higher standard." Glamorgan Spring Bay Council offers financial hardship assistance for individuals experiencing genuine and serious financial hardship. The Council also offers rates remissions for concession card holders, as well as community groups. For more information about assistance programs, please contact the Council.
