FAIRER RATES MODEL ADOPTED BY COUNCIL

Glamorgan Spring Bay Council has approved its budget for the 2021-22 financial year, including an \$8.5 million capital program that invests in the future of the municipality.

Council has also agreed to the adoption of a fairer rates model that will better meet the needs of the community and help put the Council on a sustainable financial footing.

General Manager Greg Ingham said: "The Council had faced significant challenges, including the financial impact of COVID-19, which have contributed to a projected operating loss of \$787,000 in the coming financial year.

Importantly, our Long Term Financial Plan provides a roadmap to deal with these challenges and get back on a path to sustainability.

I wish to thank Councillors for making the difficult but responsible decisions to ensure the Council can better meet the needs of residents into the future.

The Assessed Annual Value rates model that has been adopted is fairer, more equitable and reflects the growth in the region. Under the old system a flat rate was applied to all residential properties in each town.

Moving to a system that is based on the value of individual properties means a significant number of residents will see a reduction in their rates, while others with high value properties will see their rates increase. Even where rates increase, however, they will still be in line with rates charged in neighbouring municipalities. Glamorgan Spring Bay Council offers financial hardship assistance for individuals experiencing genuine and serious financial hardship. The Council also offers rates remissions for eligible concession card holders, as well as community groups."

Mr Ingham said: "Capital works priorities had been guided by new asset management plans.

Projects include but are not limited to, \$1 million for road renewal projects across the municipality, \$1 million for Swansea main street footpath renewal, \$1 million for the Coles Bay foreshore walkway and

\$1.5 million for works at The Gulch in Bicheno."

From Hero to Zero

Congratulations to our Glamorgan Spring Bay Council. I recently attended the "Council Connect" meeting here in Swansea and, after listening to the Mayor and various new council management staff, left feeling that the era of secrets, lies and innuendo was finished and lessons had been learnt.

Well that lasted less than two weeks! Not one mention was made of the need to increase municipal rates nor the change to Assessed Annual Value (ANV) rates rather than the fairer existing method where every property (in a zone) pays the same rates. Instead Council voted to both increase the rates and alter the assessment method.

The ANV method will allow both undeveloped and properties of low value to pay a lower municipal rate whilst those that have invested in improving their properties for their own purposes and in improving the towns vista and appeal will be stung for the "privilege". Surely this is a disincentive to investment and improvements in our municipality.

Given the major change in assessing rates I feel that the "Community Connect" session was where we would have been informed, re. council's considerations, and at least been given some chance for input. I support a modest increase in rates to get us back on a firm financial footing but can't help feeling that we are in the current position because of extremely unwise "investments" by our previous council i.e the Prosser RAW scheme which, it could be argued, was built to support a fish farming enterprise with a dubious environmental impact.

Can council please explain, to us mere morons, why it costs more to provide/maintain gutters, footpaths and roads for a

block with a new house on it as opposed to a one with a run down shack. Extra water and sewage - agreed but that is provided through Taswater not council. Garbage? No we all pay a garbage levy. Increased costs of assessing building plans and approvals? Yes BUT developers/ builders are already carrying that burden! Animal control? No as we get more dog issues coming from campers (on their own blocks) and shack residents bringing their unrestrained pooches up for holidays. Must be the increased cost of mowing the nature strips? No as owners of more expensive properties take pride in their properties and the nature strips adjacent – can't say the same for vacant land and some shacks so council has to pickup the slack. To me it looks like a money grab – everyone knows property values have increased dramatically post Covid and council wants to milk the cash cow quicker by changing the rating method.

Re:- Glamorgan Spring Bay Council a Council on Rates Steroids!!!

I was interested to read in your issue of the 22nd June (page 5, "Rate Model Change"), an item which was in effect a copy of a media release from Glamorgan Spring Bay Council (GSBC) announcing that it intends to change the basis of municipal rating in the Shire from Average Area Rate to Assessed Annual Valuation. The media release was issued on the 18th June.

No doubt you and many of your readers would have seen the ABC News report which on the same date (18th June) detailed a proposal by GSBC to increase the municipal rates by 15% next year, 15% the following year, and 12.5% the year after that! A cumulative increase of just on 150% in 3 years!!!! If you didn't see the news item, here it is:-

What we are witnessing in GSBC is Local Government "rates" madness on a massive dose of steroids.

What this Council and its Mayor propose (a three year increase of 48% in rates) is just plain, downright ridiculous. And the Mayor says in the ABC News report "We can be trusted"! Trusted to do what? Deliver ratepayers into a financial hell hole? Can the Mayor and his fellow Councillors and staff imagine how long a Swansea or Triabunna local trader would last if it told "customers" it's going to put prices up 15%, 15% and then 12.5% over the next three years? If the Mayor doesn't know, I

do! The trader would be out of business quick smart!

Glamorgan Spring Bay Council (GSBC) has been at the forefront of some seriously questionable decisions for the past three or so years the Council funding a water supply system for a major aquaculture company capable itself of funding the project, and the real estate development of golf courses and resorts etc., has been at the core of this Council's financial disaster. In the process, this Council, by acting as a "lender of last resort", has run up a staggering debt of over \$6.3 million! To now propose to solve it by handing the burden on to ratepayers as an almost 50% rates increase is simply not facing up to the consequences of the past.

No, thanks, this has to stop, and stop now. It's gone on far too long, unchecked and unhindered. It's high time for the State Minister for Local Government to act, and to act quickly and decisively.

It's more than high time a very competent administrator was appointed to manage the affairs of this Council. For as long as it takes. And that needs to be appointed by the State Government, and quickly. To expect ratepayers to bear a burden of +50% rate payments over the next 3 years is intolerable, and administrators need to be provided with the most sweeping available powers to deal with this situation. If that includes complete reassessment of the services portfolio delivered by Council, and a root and branch reduction of type and frequency and cost, then so be it. And, sadly, if that includes staff reductions, then so be it if necessary. It also includes powers to dispose of any and all assets surplus to requirements in order to reduce debt, the introduction of administrative efficiencies, and it also includes requiring this (and other?) Councils to cease immediately dabbling in the business of being lenders of last resort, AND the universal provider of "goodies" to companies seeking inducement to undertake the so-called "god" of "economic development".

And I also have to say that if this mess is of such proportions as to require the scope of proposed rate increases, then it is clear that this Council may well have sunk beneath the waters of financial viability. The price of this is just too high! It's high time this Council was put into mothballs, perhaps permanently, and professionals were appointed to fix this mess. I appeal to the Minister for Local Government to act decisively and quickly in this matter. There has to be an accounting, and that time is now!

UPDATED EDITORIAL FROM THE GOVERNMENT FOR COVID-19 VACCINATIONS PROGRAM.

On a global scale, COVID-19 has already claimed the lives of over 3 million people. Getting the jab when it is available to you will help protect you, your loved ones and the community.

All Tasmanians need to have accurate information to help them make an informed decision about getting a COVID-19 vaccine. Below are answers to Tasmania's most frequently asked questions. Which COVID-19 vaccines are available in Tasmania and how do they work? There are currently two COVID-19 vaccines available in Australia: the Pfizer vaccine and the AstraZeneca vaccine. Both vaccines require two doses. For the Pfizer vaccine you will receive two vaccinations approximately three weeks apart. For the AstraZeneca vaccine you will receive two vaccinations approximately 12 weeks apart.

Both vaccines are highly effective at reducing the severity of COVID-19. Both vaccines work by training your immune system to recognise and respond to the virus that causes COVID-19. The Pfizer vaccine is an mRNA vaccine and the AstraZeneca vaccine is a viral vector vaccine.

What about vaccine side effects and the blood clotting issue?

Over two billion doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been delivered globally to date. The COVID-19 vaccinations available in Australia have been approved by our expert regulatory body, the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA). Once approved, the TGA and the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) monitor data within Australia and from around the world to ensure that the vaccines remain safe.

All vaccines can have side effects, and the COVID-19 vaccines are no different. After vaccination some people experience no side effects at all and some experience mild side effects. Serious side effects are very rare.

Common side effects of vaccination may include redness at the vaccine site, a sore arm, muscle aches and fatigue. Some people may also experience a mild fever or headache. These symptoms usually start within 24 hours of vaccination and last for 1-2 days. These symptoms are not of concern unless severe or persistent. If you experience side effects that worry you, contact your GP.

A rare but serious side effect called thrombosis with thrombocytopaenia syndrome (TTS) has been associated with the Astra-Zeneca vaccine. TTS occurs when there are blood clots (thrombosis) and low platelets (thrombocytopaenia). This syndrome generally occurs between 4-30 days after the first dose of the vaccine. Global

data suggests that while the overall incidence of TTS is low, it is higher in those under 60 years of age. This newly described syndrome is different from more common clots, such as deep vein thrombosis. These more common blood clots can occur in around 50 Australians every day separate to vaccination and are not related to the rare TTS clotting disorder. TTS has not been seen after the Pfizer vaccine. As a result, the Pfizer vaccine is the preferred vaccine for people under 60 years of age.

If you have already received your first dose of AstraZeneca without complication, there is no reason to delay or miss your second dose (even if you are under 60). This is because reports of TTS following the second dose of AstraZeneca vaccine are extremely rare. Both doses of the vaccine are required to be protected against COVID-19.

If you have any concerns about getting vaccinated, speak with your usual health care provider.

Which vaccine should I get?

Pfizer is preferred over the AstraZeneca vaccine for adults under the age of 60. In people aged 60 years and over, AstraZeneca is recommended. The benefits of vaccination far outweigh the risk of the rare but serious blood clotting complication for people in this age group. This is because the risk of serious outcomes from COVID-19 infection increase with age. Decisions about which vaccine to administer are based on the best medical evidence available.

Will the vaccine stop me from ever getting COVID-19?

Clinical trials and real-world studies have demonstrated that the COVID-19 vaccines are very effective in preventing severe outcomes from COVID-19 infections. For example, trials have shown the Pfizer vaccine has 95% efficacy. Less is known about the impact of the vaccines on transmission, however early findings are promising.

Why should I get vaccinated?

Vaccination is an important way to protect you, your family and your community against COVID-19. You will be protected from severe COVID-related illness and will have the peace of mind of offering another layer of protection to your loved ones and the people around you. High levels of vaccination against COVID-19 is a key tool for fighting the pandemic. If most of the adult population gets vaccinated, this will reduce the health, social and economic impacts of the pandemic. Every dose of vaccine makes a difference.




