WILD SHELLFISH HEALTH ALERTS

CURRENT WARNINGS

Toxic algal blooms (also known as harmful algal blooms or HABs) are currently known to be present in Tasmania. Elevated levels of algal toxins have been detected in shellfish from the regions listed on this page. Recreationally harvested shellfish should not be eaten because the algal toxins are harmful to humans. Seek medical help if you get sick after eating wild shellfish.

DO NOT EAT RECREATIONALLY HARVESTED MUSSELS, OYSTERS, CLAMS, PIPIS, COCKLES, WEDGE SHELLS ABALONE AND SCALLOP ROE FROM THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

WILD SHELLFISH

Wild shellfish include:

- Oysters, mussels, clams, pipis, cockles, wedge shells, abalone and scallop roe
- Intestines and livers (tomalley) of rock lobster can also be affected when toxic algal blooms are present.

SYMPTOMS

Symptoms can occur within minutes to hours after eating shellfish. Cooking or freezing shellfish does not destroy the toxins that cause shellfish poisoning. Shellfish poisoning symptoms include:

- tingling or numbness
- weakness
- blurred vision
- difficulty breathing
- Vomiting
- diarrhoea

SEAFOOD IN RESTAURANTS & SHOPS IS SAFE

Seafood in shops and restaurants is safe to eat because the Tasmanian Shellfish Market Access Program (ShellMAP) monitors the safety of commercially grown shellfish.

SUPPORTING CUSTOMERS THROUGH PRICE INCREASES

TasWater prices will rise by 3.5% from 1 July as approved by the Tasmanian Economic Regulator (TER) in May 2022, allowing for continued investment in its water network.

The independently assessed and approved four-year price and service plan gives Tasmanians certainty on their water and sewerage bill increases.

General Manager Customer and Community, Matt Balfe, said while price certainty allowed customers to prepare for the modest increase, supporting customers facing hardship had never been more important.

“The 3.5% increase is well below inflation, seeing an average household’s water and sewerage bill increase around \$11 a quarter – prices in line with the national average.

“We know that parts of the community are doing it tough, so our customer support program is more important than ever”.

“For those customers requiring support, it’s as simple as calling us on 13 6992 or dropping into one of our Customer Information Centres in Devonport, Launceston or Moonah.

Mr Balfe explained that TasWater is facing rising costs associated with its operations and maintenance of 170 treatment plants and over 11,500 km of pipeline. “Well managed water and sewerage underpin community well-being.

TasWater is investing \$1.4 billion in water and sewerage services over the next five years, delivering further customer and environmental benefits.

TasWater’s prices are regulated for a four-year period, with its last Price and Service Plan (PSP4) coming into effect on 1 July 2022. As outlined in PSP4, the TER approved a price increase of 3.5% each year until 30 June 2026.

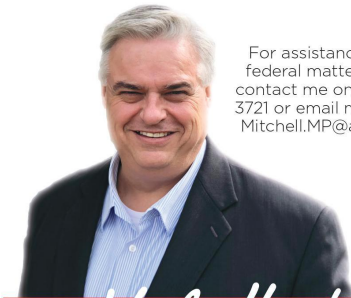

NEW LEGISLATION – SECOND HAND BOATS

Every day boats are bought and sold in Tasmania and what MAST is focused on is ensuring that boats on the water are safe and that recreational boaters come home safely from Tasmanian waters.

MAST has introduced new legislation to improve the transfer and registration process for recreational vessels.

The changes are centred around ensuring the vessel is **not unsafe**.

Many older vessels may have been modified since their construction, which could affect the safety of the boat itself. Common modifications might include: new larger engines, brackets and fixtures being screwed into the vessel, additional weight being added with pot haulers, larger fuel tanks and auxiliary motors.

Under new legislation, you will be required to declare **that your boat is not unsafe** when registering or selling a vessel. In addition, the person buying the boat must also declare that they are satisfied the vessel being transferred to them is not unsafe. Both the seller and purchaser must notify MAST of the transfer within 14 days.

For the purposes of registration and transfer, an unsafe vessel is due to one or more of the following circumstances:

(a) the structural condition of the vessel, or a component of the vessel, that renders the vessel unfit to undertake a voyage for

which the vessel is otherwise designed and would be, if not in that condition, capable of undertaking;

(b) the engine power rating of the vessel, as recommended by the manufacturer or recorded on the ABP, is being exceeded;

(c) the engine mass of the vessel, as recommended by the manufacturer or recorded on the ABP, is being exceeded;

(d) the absence of, or condition of, materials or items comprising the reserve buoyancy, or part of the reserve buoyancy, of the vessel

Many vessels are advertised for cheap prices on various platforms. There is no such thing as a cheap boat!

The best advice MAST can give any buyer of a second-hand boat is to take someone along who knows about boats when you go to look at your prospective purchase.

There are a few basic tips on what to look out for with respect to the hull of a second-hand boat.

Aluminium Hulls

The two areas that can be problematic in aluminium boats are electrolysis and fractured welds. Electrolysis causes the aluminium to corrode and is due to the presence of dissimilar metals.

Fibreglass Hulls

The two problem areas in fibreglass boats are delamination and rotting of the core material and fractures in the glass laminate. The most common failure is in the transom.

THE MAYORAL MOMENTS FOR JUNE 2023



The budget presented to the June Council meeting is the result of robust discussions during our budget sessions or individually with staff over the past few weeks. It has been a collaborative coming together of minds that have had the best interests of the community at heart especially in the light of CPI running at just under 7% and the never-ending cost of living pressures we are all facing.

One of the issues identified in the budget is the proposed reduction in mowing service that raised concerns in the elected member group and the broader community.

It is not clear in the agenda papers that this service reduction will be undertaken as part of a one-year trial. It will be subjected to intense scrutiny by the Director Works and Infrastructure through the number of complaints received and/or requests for assistance from our less abled community members or reports from outside work staff. Council has a robust complaint logging system that will inform staff and councillors as we go forward. The community can be assured that the matter will be reviewed once we have sufficient data to analyse.

There was further robust debate in the council meeting around issues in relation to potential insurance problems as well as ability for people to mow verges. As part of an amended motion, staff will review the questions asked by councillors in relation to risks in insurance and other matters relating to the trial reduction of verges mowing.

A more positive note in relation to the budget is the recommended increase in rates. Council and the community will remember that the Long-Term Financial Management Plan forecast a 12.5% increase in this coming financial year. This budget recommends an average increase of 9%. It is very close to the local government rate increase index of 8.5% and approximately 2% above CPI. Coupled with this is a budget that will see our asset renewal move to 100% in accordance with the various asset renewal plans. It is a move towards ensuring our assets are renewed within their predicted life span. Council recognises that there are cost of living pressures affecting everyone including those sitting in this Chamber and we have been mindful of that when setting this budget and the rates resolution. I believe it is a responsible budget in the current economic climate for the future sustainability of this Council.

One matter we dealt with was the submission of a representation to the Tasmanian

Planning Commission in relation to the planning policies. As a Council we have a responsibility to protect our unique area. We need to be sure we have taken every available opportunity to ensure the future of GSBC under planning provisions and give our communities local representation as well as the opportunity to grow. The planning policies should not be implemented without professional comment from this planning authority.

Council was pleased to support the Lunch with Mates program run by an amazing group of volunteers out of the Spring Bay RSL rooms. It is a vital program that enables those who may be alone or isolated to enjoy a meal and a chat.

Whilst not dealt with at the council meeting, what about council amalgamations. No, that's right we are not being amalgamated. We may be boundary adjusted which really is only a nice way to say forced amalgamation. What are your thoughts? I'm hearing that some people have contacted our neighbouring councils to the north and south urging boundary adjustment, but I've had no contact from anyone! As a council we need to know do you want to see this Council split. One scenario put forward is that Bicheno would go to a northeast council and the balance to the southeast. Does that include Coles Bay? The map is unclear in those community catchment papers. We've been through several attempted amalgamations over the years that have all failed mostly because there have been no identified benefits to the residents and ratepayers. Has that landscape changed? We haven't had any consultation yet with the community because put simply we don't know what to tell you in relation to potential benefits in a larger or so-called super council. It would be helpful for our submission if you feel really strongly about it to get in touch. Please email council@freycinet.tas.gov.au

ENDORSEMENT OF 2023/24 BUDGET ESTIMATES AND RATES RESOLUTION



Glamorgan Spring Bay Council unanimously endorsed its 2023/2024 Budget and Rates Resolution at its 27th June 2023 Ordinary Council Meeting. The Budget has been developed and produced during a period of economic turmoil and there has been much Council deliberation on the budget over the course of this calendar year.

Council has taken into account the affordability of daily expenses on our community exacerbated by a Hobart Consumer Price Index CPI at 6.9% and persistent reserve bank increases to interest rates. A year ago we were working with a 3% CPI. In addition to these unforeseen charges, next financial year will see an unprecedented increase in waste costs including contract variation in the order of \$0.6 million. State Government waste management levies for the mandated use of facilities, as well as increases to waste collection charges totalling \$0.6 million, for no change in service.

Through prudent and responsible financial management, in keeping with Council's Long Term Financial Management Plan, Council has been able to absorb the aforementioned unforeseen costs in the 2023/2024 budget. While the general rates have remained in-line with our Long Term Financial Management Plan rates revenue forecast, we have been able to limit the average general rates increase on our non-vacant residential properties to 8.8%. Under the circumstances an exceptional result. This budget focuses on the necessary cost to continue core services and to provide funding as broadly as possible to minimize impact on residential ratepayers. To achieve this, costs that can be reduced have been reviewed or deferred and all funding sources assessed to contribute to this outcome.

The budget responds to the Asset Management Plan reviews that have taken place over the last year, asset valuations as required by the Tasmanian Audit Office and market forces for contracted works. A Council commitment to ensuring that Council maintains its assets at 100% renewal is reflected in the budget. This is critically important to ensure that a growing backlog of renewal works within the municipality is addressed and is in line with sound and responsible asset management practice.

In addition to the above, the 2023/2024 includes \$7.3 million of capital works mainly in roads and stormwater projects. It allows for a \$1.5 million Covid loan to be repaid as well as building a small unrestricted cash balance.

There have been no increases in excess of CPI to the Council fees and charges. The only exception is the marina berth fees that have only increased by half of CPI approx. 3.5%.

A very pleasing outcome for Glamorgan Spring Bay Council, especially given the ongoing inequity of the State Financial Assistance Grants.

munity shed, where the team built the table in two sections.

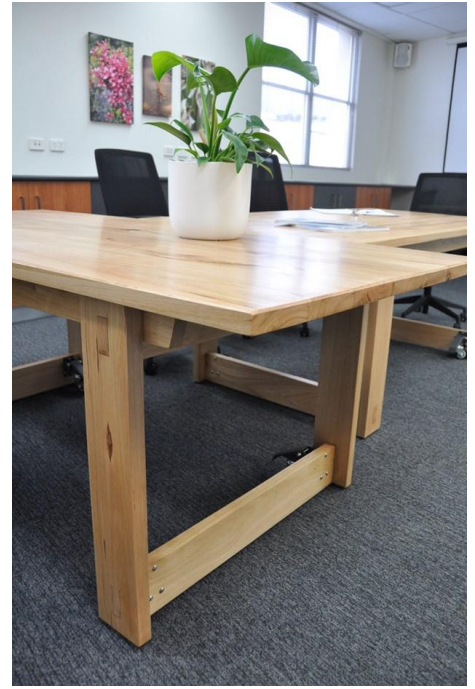
NRM South has made a contribution to the Community shed in appreciation of their efforts.

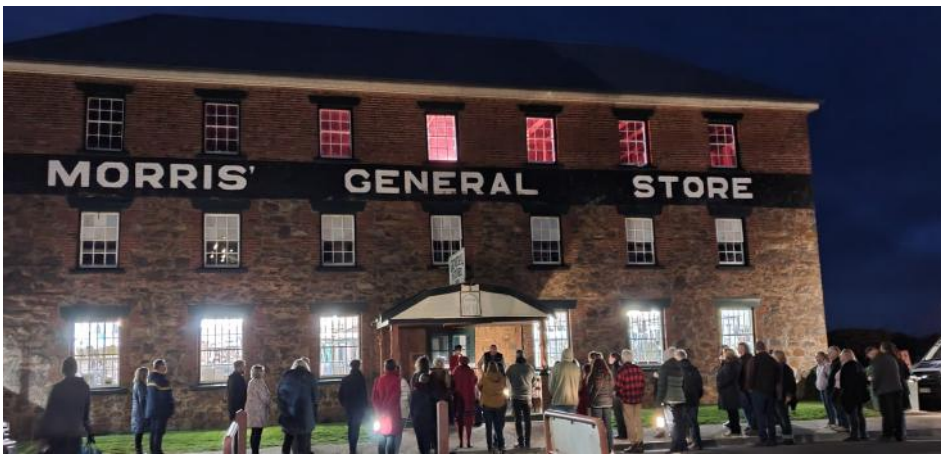

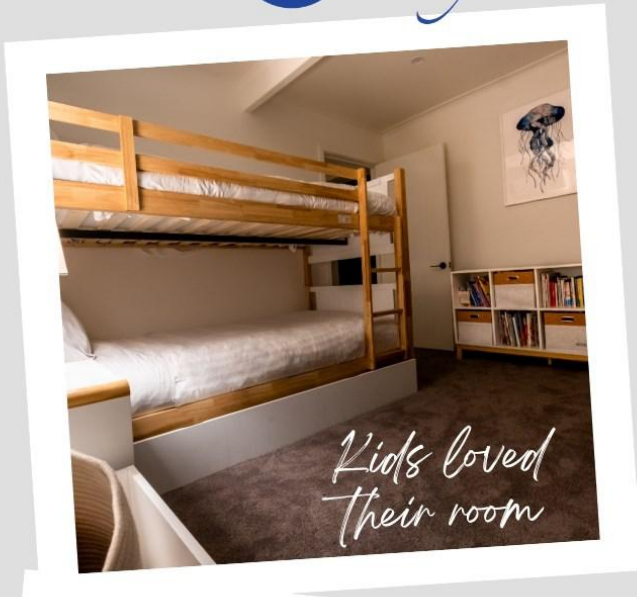

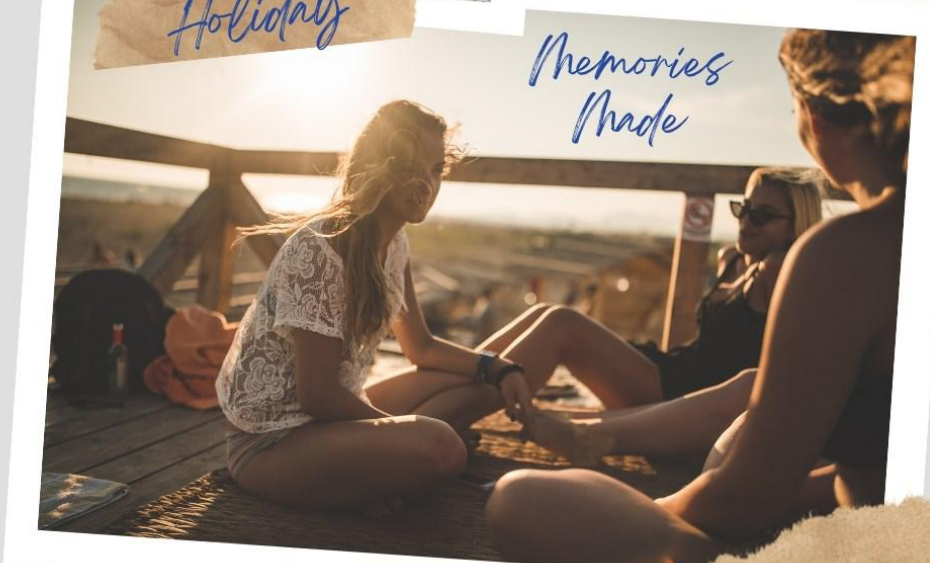
