June Mary Wynne Dowd

25th June 1914 - 5th July 2016

June Mary Wynne Dowd (nee Roberts) was born in 1914 at Highbury hospital, near St Ann's in Davey St, Hobart, the eldest daughter of Ronald and Mary Roberts.

Ron was a Master mariner, boatbuilder and fisherman. June's early years were at Orford where mother Mary ran the local shop, situated then at the northern end of the Orford bridge, near the entrance to the old convict road.

They lived there 'behind the shop', where Ron had his jetty on to the Prosser river and built his boats on the river bank. June recalled her early school days at Orford 'making dolls' hats and clothes with a Miss Price (?) who was not a teacher but a milliner. She later went to school at St Mark's in Bellerive, and then went on to become a Mothercraft nurse, living primarily at the Good Shepherd Home of Mercy in Midwood St, Newtown, and also working in this job as a live-in-nurse to farming families in country areas as far apart as Campbelltown in Tasmania to Goulburn, NSW. She married Douglas Dowd in 1941 at St Josephs Church Macquarie St. Hobart.

They lived briefly in Moonee Ponds, Melbourne, where Doug worked in munitions for about a year. Doug had been refused enlistment in the army because of a childhood injury which left him with a bent arm that could never be straightened, despite his attempts to pretend so in his army medical.

They returned to Hobart and bought a house at 169 Melville St where their two children Sandra and William (Bill) were born , and Doug worked as a motor mechanic at City Motors. Always keen campers, the family often spent Xmas camping at Spring Beach, as June's parents now lived at Double Creek near Triabunna.

At Spring Beach they subsequently built a two room shack which ultimately became the family home when they moved there permanently in about 1950.

Doug built and ran the Shell service station at Triabunna, where June did the accounts and sent out the bills, as well as cleaning the toilets and bathrooms of the embryonic caravan park which Doug later developed.

June was active in those days in both the CWA and the Triabunna hospital auxiliary, and as a volunteer in the Orford Library then situated in the doctor's rooms in Charles St, nearly opposite the current library.

After Doug's death in 1995, June remained living alone at Spring Beach, attending Probus and the Prosser House centre regularly. She was also a HACC volunteer driver for many years, only losing her licence at age 95, declaring afterwards that the test officer's report was "a tissue of lies!" ... a poetic statement bearing out her lifelong love of reading and crosswords.

Still fiercely independent, she remained there, relying on meals on wheels, Dorothy Wilson, and visits from Sandra and Bill, until a fall in 2011 which, despite not resulting in any broken bones, precipitated her move into care.

She chose to go into Queen Victoria Home in Lindisfarne rather than May Shaw in Swansea because of its proximity to Sandra and Bill who both live close by on the Eastern shore.

June spent four and a half years there, and died peacefully in her sleep on July 5th, just 10 days after her 102nd birthday on June 25th. On her birthday, aware of the fuss around her, she asked Bill: "Is it my birthday?" "Yes, Mum", he replied. "Oh. What should I be, then?" "102, Mum". Thoughtful pause. "No, that can't be right!" she exclaimed. A happy note to remember her on.




