
George Meredith (13 February 1777 – 1856) was the head of the Meredith family who, with the Amos family, were the first white settlers on the east coast of Tasmania, and settled and farmed near Swansea. Meredith's son was the politician, Charles Meredith and Charles' wife was the artist and author, Louisa Anne Meredith, whose books are also published by the History Society. A memorial to George Meredith can be found in All Saints churchyard, Swansea.

George carried on a torrid relationship with his young wife, Mary, which he described and amplified in a series of sometimes graphic letters to her during his absences from his farm.

Malcolm Ward is a Tasmanian historian, and Member of the Glamorgan Spring Bay Historical Society Inc., who completed a PhD on the colonial settler George Meredith in 2020. Malcolm is also Co-Author of another Society publication Houses & Estates of Old Glamorgan.

MITCHELL WELCOMES TASMAN HIGHWAY REOPENING, PRAISES WORKERS

Federal Member for Lyons Brian Mitchell MP has welcomed the announced reopening of Tasman Highway at Paradise Gorge from Thursday.

"This is terrific news for the east coast after six weeks of hard economic shock and inconvenience," Mr Mitchell said.

"That sound you can hear isn't the Roaring Forties, it's the collective sigh of relief up and down the entire east coast."

Mr Mitchell expressed thanks to the road crews and excavators who worked hard to achieve the earlier than expected reopening.

"When this started, we were told the road could be out for as long as 12 weeks or more, so to halve that is really something." Mr Mitchell called on motorists travelling Tasman Highway to be patient while remediation continued.

"There will be slower, controlled access for quite some time to come and I ask that everyone show some patience," he said.

"I also put out the call to everyone in Hobart to pencil in some visits to the east coast as soon as possible, and don't buy your petrol at home, buy it in Buckland or on the coast.

"Every single dollar you can put into east coast tills over the next few weeks will be very much appreciated."

Mr Mitchell asked the State Government to keep its promise to seal Wielangta Road.

"Don't take your foot off the pedal, don't become complacent. Start the work now to get this road sealed as soon as possible."

"Businesses and residents simply cannot afford to be cut off from the rest of the state like that again."

LETTERS TO THE EDITORIAL TEAM

Robin Hood (GSBC) steals from the rich, gives to the poor ...nop they just steal!

How could I be so silly and misinformed? Council "rates" aren't a fee for service they are a method of taxation as I discovered whilst digging into Council meeting Agendas.

I quote from GSBC June Agenda

- ". General in S.86A(1)
- (1) A council, in adopting policies and making decisions concerning the making or varying of rates, must take into account the principles that —
- (a) rates constitute taxation for the purposes of local government, rather than a fee for a service; and
- (b) the value of rateable land is an indicator of the capacity of the rate-payer in respect of that land to pay rates."

Good one council, next time you are going to quote legislation, or any other we mere morons don't have to waste our time trying to find the information to check if it is being quoted and used as intended. FYI readers **S.86A(1)** is drawn from the **LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1993**. Yes from last century (but still in force).

Time for state government to revisit that legislation and bring it into the current century. My issue is with council basing its decision, to alter the rating method, on antiquated legislation without considering if that legislation reflects the true and current (2021) state of play.

Clearly paragraph (b) in S.86A(1) is out of date and wrong (in my opinion). Blind Freddy could see that the capacity of a ratepayer to "pay" extra should not be based on the value of their "principal residence" but in actual fact that capacity should be placed on those ratepayers who hold investment properties ie land bought for investment (other than agricultural land), holiday shacks and (especially) those properties used for short term accommodation (Airbnb etc.) with the exception of genuine short term accommodation attached to a principle residence.

The State Revenue Office recognizes my Continued next page From previous page

thinking and acknowledges it as being correct by only charging LAND TAX on properties **NOT** deemed to be "Principal Residences". Maybe Council could do the same and only charge the "fixed annual component" of the rates without the "Cents in \$AAV "component for properties deemed "Principal Residences" by the SRO.

Lets' cut the bulsh*t out, Council, and be upfront with the ratepayers who employ and empower you. The reason you want to change the rating method is you know there is a Municipality property revaluation coming in soon and you know those property values are going to be vastly higher than those used at present so, by altering the rating method you will stand to rake in a fortune.

Council had the option to maintain our current rating system under "S 109A. Averaged area rates may be made for locality" of under the same 1993 act used by council. As a municipality, we changed to what was considered the fairest system (the current one) only in recent years -5years ago or so. What has changed? a new council management team trying to raise revenue to cover past mistakes? and allowed to make major decisions without consulting the ratepayers and seeking their approval. The buck stops with our elected representatives who were elected to seek our input and represent our interests not rule us from their citadel.

I note the decision to alter the rating method was not unanimous and I congratulate those councillors who voted against the change (Deputy Mayor Woods, Clr Arnol and Clr Symons). The other four should be ashamed – feel free to hand in your resignations

I am prepared to give our new DIRECTOR (of Finance and Communication LOL ..) a little more time to reconsider the above and fix the error ASAP. What I do want to know is who is pulling the strings in Council? the Councillors? The Council funded LGAT (with our rate money!)? or State Government?

Council please consider how may retirees live in GSBC and a lot are "self funded" retirees so not eligible for your concessions. Fix this by using the "Principal Residence" method suggested above ... I also query council's statement in the June Agenda where they list three "capital expenditure" projects seemingly as a reason for the rates increase. (Swansea Franklin St. footpath, Coles Bay foreshore walkway, Gulch upgrade at Bicheno). Aren't some of these funded by external Govt grants? if so then don't muddy the rates water

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

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
