Dear Editor

I have noticed on Facebook people are talking about writing to the GSBC General Manager. If people think their questions are in the public interest, then they could write their questions to Council as Questions on Notice. Council are required to print these on the Council meeting agenda and must provide an answer per the Local Government Act. Others can then see the questions posed and answers provided. This may be of great benefit to Council as they may end up answering less questions overall. This should only be seen as a good thing and not inflammatory under the current round of public discontent. It may also be useful to the GSBC residents and ratepayers to see the questions and answers.

Sometimes your answer will be held over to the next meeting, or "taken on notice", however an answer must be provided. You can repeat or clarify your question on the next agenda should you be dissatisfied with the answer provided, as I have done recently.

To write a Question on Notice, you need to state it is a question on notice and the meeting it is for. You need to state where your question starts. You need to

address your questions to the General Manager. Please note, despite there being no legislative limitation on the number of questions, Council chooses to limit individuals to 2 questions. You can have others sign their name to your questions or others can submit questions on the same topic. Email your question to the GM at <a href="mailto:general.manager@freycinet.tas.gov.au">general.manager@freycinet.tas.gov.au</a> and cc in admin at <a href="mailto:adin@freycinet.tas.gov.au">adin@freycinet.tas.gov.au</a>.

The dates for submitting questions on notice for Council meetings by for the rest of the year are:

- 13 August 2021 2pm,
- 17 September 2021 2pm
- 15 October 2021 2pm
- 12 November 2021 2pm
- 03 December 2021 2pm.

You can also submit a question without notice following the release of the Council meeting agenda until noon on the Monday before the Council meeting. The agenda is usually released the Thursday prior to the meeting. This way you can ask questions about issues in the current meeting agenda.

Something as simple as this will suffice.

"Dear General Manager

I am submitting a question on notice for X meeting of Council. My question on notice starts here.

Then pose your question. You can also write a preamble or explanatory piece to your question and have it printed if you state where your question starts. It is important to state where your question starts for clarity."

I hope this helps people considering writing questions on notice and that we see more questions from the public on our Council meeting agendas.

# DOG REGISTRATION AUDIT 1 SEPTEMBER 2021 – 31 NOVEMBER 2021

Glamorgan Spring Bay Council will be undertaking a municipal Dog Registration Audit between the months of September and November to encourage responsible pet ownership and help build a safer, happier community.

Any dogs found to be unregistered will result in an infringement of one (1) penalty unit per offence being issued, in accordance with the *Dog Control Act 2000*.

Under the *Dog Control Act 2000*, all dogs aged six months and over are required to be registered and microchipped by 30 June each year (this includes working dogs.) A Kennel Licence is required from Council if your property has more than two (2) domestic dogs, or more than four (4) working dogs aged six months and over.

Be a responsible pet owner by registering your dog with Council and ensure the tag provided is always worn. Registering your dog increases the likelihood of your pet returning should it become lost. Dogs registered with Glamorgan Spring Bay Council prior to 31 July 2021 will receive a discounted fee. Pension concession is available for one (1) dog, once the concession card has been sited and validated by a Council Officer.

If in the unfortunate situation that your dog is deceased or is no longer at your premises you are obligated to notify Council. Once notified, Officers will cancel the registration and you will not receive any further registration reminders.

Your COVID safety kit By Dr Scott McKeown Deputy Director of Public Health, Department of Health, Tasmania

Tasmanians have been keeping on top of COVID but we must remain aware of the ongoing threat. Other Australian states and territories have had to respond to recent new COVID-19 cases in their communities showing how quickly things can change. These responses include requiring the community to take extra precautions, such as wearing face masks, to protect themselves and others around them. By having a few items ready you can be prepared if further community restrictions are introduced in Tasmania to respond to cases in the community. The items in the kit can play an important role in daily life right now to help keep you safe. This means that the best time to prepare and start using your COVID safety kit is now. In addition to our COVID safe behaviours, having a COVID safety kit ready will help us continue to keep on top of COVID in Tasmania. There are four items each of us should have in a COVID safety kit.

#### Face masks

Keep some masks at home and one with you, e.g. you may like to keep one in your bag or with you at work. Face masks are mandatory (for all people aged 12 or older) at Tasmanian airports and on board all aircraft (including scenic flights). They are also required at the Spirit of Tasmania terminal and on board the

Masks may become mandatory in other public settings as part of community restrictions. If you haven't worn a mask before, get familiar with how to wear a mask now so that you are prepared. A face mask should be worn over both your nose and mouth.

Keep tissues at home and in other places you spend a lot time. Small tissue packets are great for carrying in your pocket or bag. Cover all coughs and sneezes and with a clean tissue. Dispose of used tissues in the bin straight after you use them, and wash your hands well with soap and warm running water (or use hand sanitiser if you don't have soap and water).

#### Hand sanitiser

Keep hand sanitiser with you when possible and some at home. Use it regularly on your hands when you don't have access to soap and warm water to wash them. A small bottle of hand sanitiser in your pocket or backpack is handy for many situations such as using public transport or when picking up a snack on your lunchbreak. It's also useful to have some at home should anyone in your household ever need to quarantine.

#### Check in TAS app


Check in by using the Check in TAS app when you visit most businesses, venues and events. Checking in is important so that contact tracers can quickly identify and contact impacted locations and people if there is a case in the community. Checking in is compulsory so be prepared and download the app to your phone. When you arrive at a location with a QR code displayed, simply scan the code to record your visit. If you don't have a smartphone another person in your group can check you in via their app, or staff at the premises can check you in.
