SCHOOLS PROGRAM

July 2023

The safety of all Tasmanians on the water is a key goal for MAST – including our State’s primary and high school aged children.

The MAST School Education Program is provided to all students participating in the Department for Education, Children & Young People’s Swimming and Water Safety Program (SWSP), around 15,000 students annually in grades 3 to 5. MAST and DECYP have an Agreement with MAST to be able to provide classroom sessions for students in grades 3 to 6.

The Boat Safety component of the SWSP has two parts. Stage 1 is conducted in the pool and uses one of the 15 dinghies that MAST has provided around the state to demonstrate the effect of overloading a boat and what to do if the boat tips over.

This allows MAST to demonstrate the need for wearing a life jacket correctly, what decisions can be taken prior to going on the water and what to do if you end up in cold water. Stage 1 is taught during the in-pool sessions by the swim teachers.

Stage 2 is MAST’s main involvement in the SWSP where classroom talks are provided by MAST staff to reinforce the lessons learned in the pool. Having a plan, telling someone where you are going and when you will return, checking the weather and most importantly making sure the boat is capable of making the journey you have planned.

Educational resources are available for classroom teachers to continue the learning experience and are provided by the MAST presenters. This program is unique within Australia and has delivered consistent results since its inception in 2009.

By giving MAST the opportunity to talk to primary school students, so far 50,674 since 2015, the Department has enhanced the value of the swimming program. Tas-

mania has the highest per capita boat owning population in the country and more coastline than Victoria and NSW combined so the chances of these students being on the water in some form of recreational vessel is very high.

To reinforce the primary school program MAST has developed a presentation for high school students. The concept of this program is around making good choices and sits within the grade 9 curriculum.

MAST knows from the data we collect on boating accidents that the most likely cause of a boating fatality is due to capsizing into cold water. Recently the Coroner has made mention of the poor decision making made by some people making the MAST high school program even more relevant. The two most vulnerable age groups, who are over-represented in the boating accident data, are males either 30 to 40 years or over 60 years.

The two educational programs are aimed at influencing these age groups with primary school age children talking to their grandparents and high school students given a reminder before heading into the work force.

It is vitally important that anyone heading out on the water makes good choices and by teaching our students these lifetime lessons MAST is looking to embed a safety culture into the future.

-The Volunteer Grants Program is now open to eligible not-for-profit community organisations across Lyons.

Grants of between \$1,000 and \$5,000 are available for projects such as equipment used by volunteers, contributing to volunteers fuel costs, training courses and activities to promote awareness in volunteering. Expressions of interest close Sunday 10th September 2023.

-Cooperative Research Centre Project (CRC-P) Grants applications are now open.

Small and medium Australian businesses are encouraged to apply for grants of up to \$3 million to support collaboration between industry, researchers, and innovators.

Applications close on 14th September.

-Saving Native Species Grants program sees the Albanese Government investing \$20 million in community grants to help protect and recover 110 species prioritised under our Threatened Species Action Plan as part of the Grants between \$20,000 to \$500,000 are available to local government, community groups, and First Nations organisations to help recover populations of threatened plants and animals.

Applications close on 7 September 2023.

-Tasmanian Men’s Shed Association Grants Program offers grants of up to \$7,000 for tools, equipment, men’s health, including mental health and wellbeing initiatives, members training and community initiatives. And grants of up to \$20,000 for capital works.

Applications close on 15th September.

-Tasmanian Community Fund 2023 Community Infrastructure Grants applications are now open to create or improve active infrastructure such as playground, walking tracks and skateparks. And to create or improve a community hubs. Under the program small grants of \$25,000 to \$70,000 and large grants \$70,001 to \$500,000 are available for community sporting infrastructure upgrades and construction.

Applications will close on 13th September 2023. I welcome all eligible community groups and businesses to make the most of these grants.

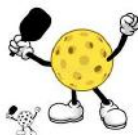

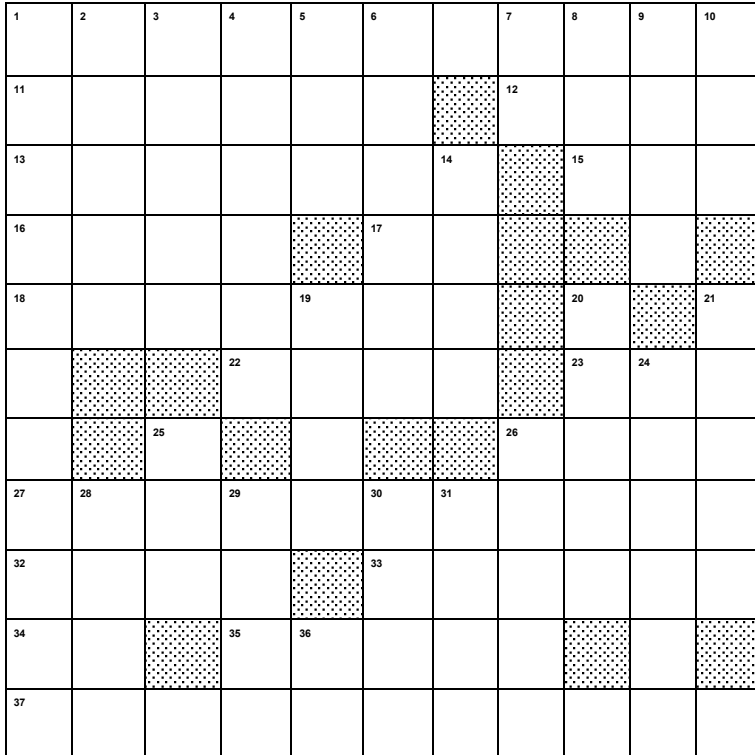

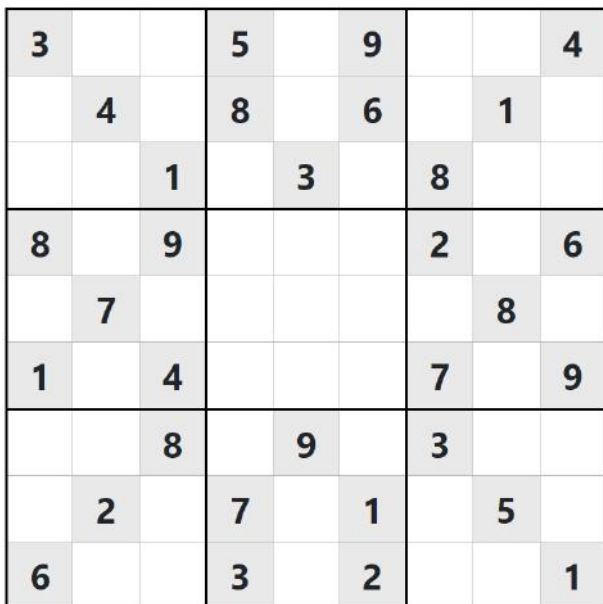
