TRIABUNNA RESERVES: FRIENDS AND PUBS CELEBRATE!

Triabunna has a number of Reserves where picnics, walks and bike rides can be enjoyed amongst remnant native vegetation, trees and wildlife. Pelican Walk on Esplanade West is popular for all these reasons. The track beside the estuary of Vicary's Rivulet provides a stunning view of coastal saltmarsh wetlands. This extensive area of saltmarsh acts as a giant carbon store that continually removes carbon from the atmosphere and integrates it into the marine food chain. How great is that for our fishing way of life!



The Friends of Triabunna Reserves recently launched a colourful interpretation sign that explains how important this area is, and the plants and wildlife to look out for while visiting.

The production of the sign was a huge team effort. A large number of experts, academics, artists and community members contributed to the research and presentation. It was funded by a grant from the Pop Up Book Stall (PUBS). A Big Thank You to you all.

LANDCARE: TASMANIA FERAL CATS

Last week I attended a cat information seminar hosted by Landcare Tasmania at the Richmond Hall. Richmond is considered a hotspot for feral cat activity and



the meeting was well attended. Several speakers- from Landcare, veterinary, cat management and cat trapping backgrounds spoke and a question & answer session followed. Here are some of the points that were discussed.

Cats are a major threat to Tasmanian wildlife: they have contributed to the extinction and decline of small native species due to predation, and transmit potentially deadly toxoplasmosis to a range of warm-blooded animals. How we manage our domestic cats can make a big difference to our wildlife. On the Tasmanian East coast, the drop in the devil population due to facial tumours, has created a niche for stray and feral cats.

sured that the community respects your valiant attempts (at voting down this abhorrent motion) and we would be honoured if you would consider standing as part of a new and revitalised council." My Response - We should all be honoured by any person willing to freely give years from their life to represent the rate-payers in what has become a very unpleasant job. I wouldn't apply.

I am not endorsing the above three councillors but merely thanking them for voting against the rating methodology change rip off and letting them know that their future service would be appreciated. Under the democratic principles of elections all candidates are subject to scrutiny by the electors and it is at that time any issues raised by past performance will be considered by those electors. To hold a "witch hunt" now may dissuade other candidates from joining the fray.

I would like to know where the information (Steve Barrett – letter GOBN two weeks ago) came from "AAV is the government's preferred policy"? Councillors are subject to gagging orders re. "special meetings" etc. and thus unable to confirm if that statement is from the financial consultant, the council staff/a councillor, a LGAT or a government representative. If we knew the source we would know who the puppet master is. And NO I am not a supporter of The Cambria Green development nor any Chinese investment developments whilst Premier Hoo Flung Dung continues to attack Australian agriculture and business with his unjust tariffs.

THE ISSUE is (in my opinion) :- An unfair and unequitable change being made by council with insufficient community consultation and no consideration as to whether the AAV/ wealth tax was/ is fairly defined in Legislation from last century. There was no apparent consideration for the community discord caused by the use of AAV as a "capacity to pay" taxation method, i.e. it has created a two speed taxation system without a fair and equitable basis for assessing that "capacity to pay".

It may be worth noting that, as stated by the Mayor, 27 out of 29 Tasmanian Councils use the AAV method. That does NOT mean WE need to change to AAV nor accept AAR as being invalid. WE had, and still do have, the right to use AAR but for whatever reason Councillors chose not to consider that fact and leapt into the AAV change. Why ?? a **Board of Inquiry** set up by The Minister for Local Govt. may answer that question along with many other – sign the petition requesting just that.

This is exaggerated by the fact Devils predated on kittens, and large feral cats will attack quolls. Feral cats have been found in the middle of World Heritage Areas. Small birds, native hens and bandicoots have been shown to return to areas where cats have been controlled.

Cats have a significant impact on Tasmanian agriculture: toxoplasmosis possibly causes a \$6m loss during lambing. 15 to 45% of ewes are affected, resulting in a 60% pregnancy reduction and still births. Goats, sows and horses are also susceptible. (A CSIRO study found that 50 to 62% of Tasmanians have been infected by the parasite, and although we rarely show symptoms, pregnant women risk miscarriage and a small percentage of newborns develop abnormalities). Sarcocystis is another parasite spread from cats to sheep, and is responsible for 12% of mutton carcasses being condemned- a \$400,000 loss. Well fed, vasectomy/ hysterectomy treated cats are preferred around farms. Good disposal of dead sheep and lambs is also essential.

Elsewhere, good cat ownership is key. From March, 2022, cats must be desexed and microchipped at the age of 4 months. A permit is required to keep more than 4 cats over 4 months old on a property. Don't feed stray cats- this increases numbers. If you know the owner talk to them, if they do nothing, inform the Council. Cat owners living near waste transfer stations need to be particularly vigilant. Appropriate cat ownership strategies have positive outcomes for cats, communities and wildlife.

Controlling cat populations should be done over a large area and combined with the strategies listed above. To find out further information, go on line to Landcare Tasmania's feral animal management resource, or TassieCat.

As your federal MP I am pleased to hear the State Government say it will finally seal Wielangta Road. This cannot happen fast enough.

I called for this to happen in February last year (see press clipping, above) but my plea was dismissed at the time by the Gutwein Government.

Over the past few weeks we have seen how important Wielangta Road is as an alternative east coast route, and how inadequate it is to service significant volumes of traffic, especially after poor weather.

The photo in this advertisement was taken near the bridge on Saturday June 12 after just a couple of days' rain, and it's not even the worst spot for potholes.

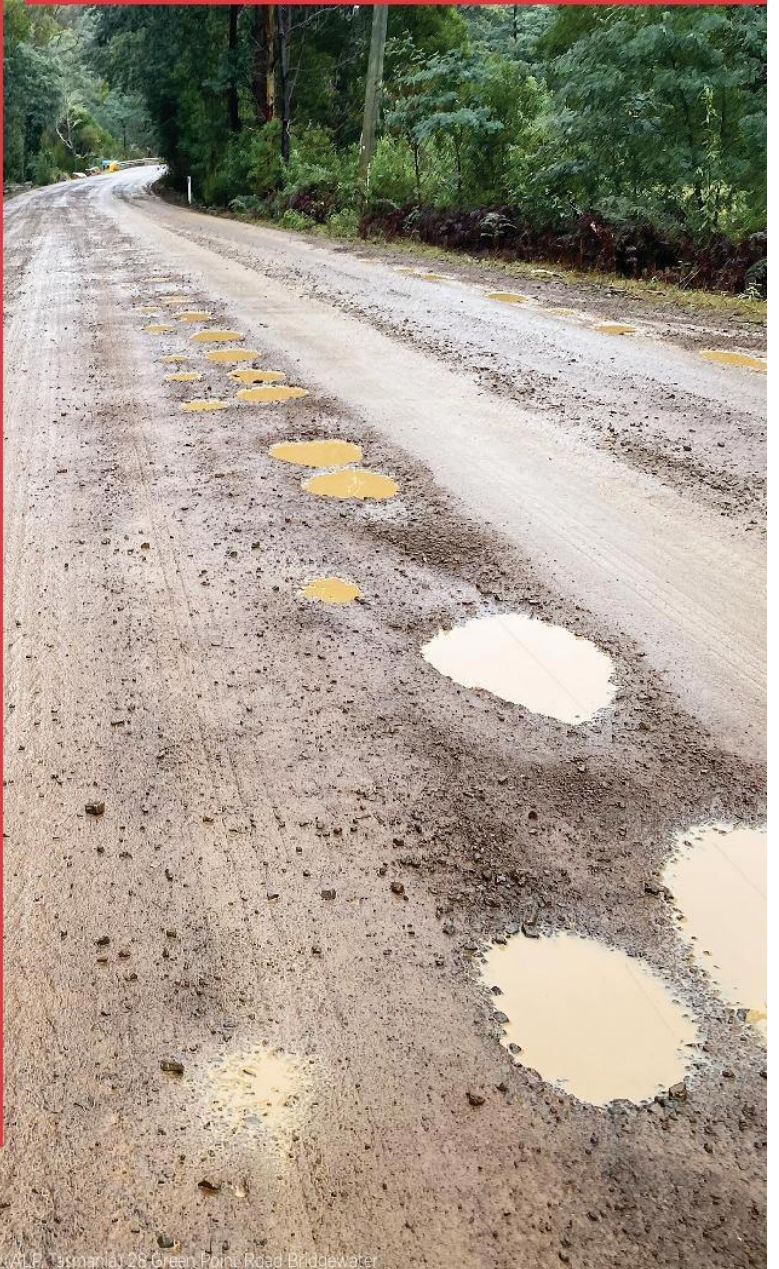
So I am pleased Wielangta Road will be upgraded, but now we are waiting on the Government to provide details.

Meanwhile, my thoughts continue to be with the people of the east coast who continue to suffer the economic pain caused by the closure of Tasman Highway at Orford.

In recent weeks I have visited a number of businesses and residents and it's clear the closure has had a major impact.

While I am pleased the Government listened to my pleas for a business support package to be established I am disappointed the support does not extend to employees, who have lost shifts and in some cases lost their jobs entirely. A short-term wage subsidy would have been most helpful, I think. It is a terrible oversight to ignore the pain being felt by east coast workers and their families.

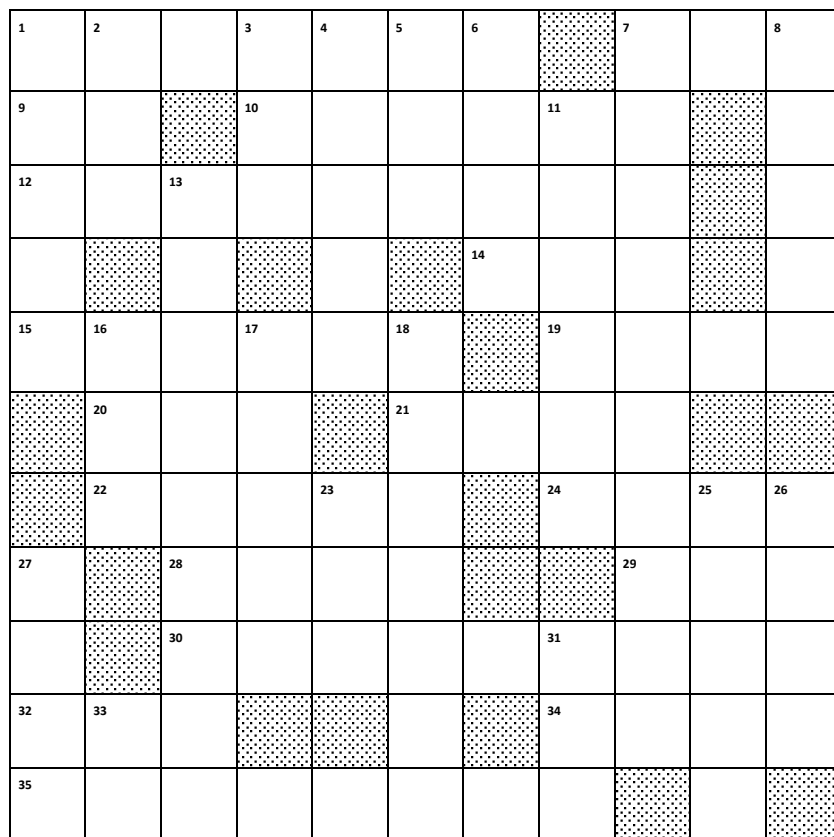

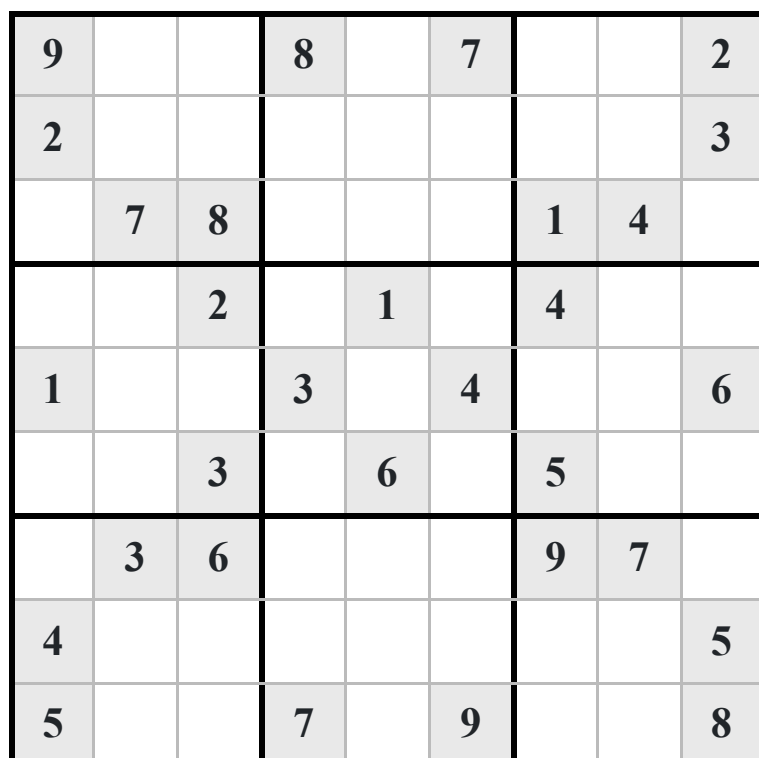
