





VIETNAM VETERANS' DAY ON THE 55TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BATTLE OF LONG TAN

On 18 August, we commemorate Vietnam Veterans' Day on the anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan in 1966.

We remember the sacrifices of those who died and say thank you to almost 60,000 Australians who served during the 10 years of our involvement in the Vietnam War.

The Vietnam War was Australia's longest military engagement of the 20th Century. The arrival of the Australian Army Training Team Vietnam in South Vietnam during July and August 1962 marked the start of Australia's involvement in the war.

By the time the war had come to an end, almost 60,000 Australians served during a decade of conflict between 1962 and 1972. Tragically, 521 of them died and 3000 were wounded.

The Battle of Long Tan was a significant moment in Australia's war in Vietnam. On 18 August 1966, in a rubber plantation near the village of Long Tan, Australian soldiers fought one of their fiercest battles of the war.

The men of Delta Company, 6th Battalion Royal Australian Regiment, faced a force of some 2000 North Vietnamese and Viet Cong troops. The battle was fought in wet and muddy conditions during a heavy tropical downpour.

By the end of the day, 17 Australians had been killed in action and 25 were wounded, one of whom died a few days later. This was the largest number of casualties in a single operation since the Australian Task Force had established its base at nearby Nui Dat the previous April.

On this day, we commemorate all the battles fought by Australians in Vietnam, from large-scale operations to platoon and section-level encounters. We remember the sailors of the Royal Australian Navy who supported land operations, and members of the Royal Australian Air Force who served in combat and transport roles. A day to say 'thank you'

On Vietnam Veterans' Day, we pause and reflect on the bravery, teamwork and endurance that Australians displayed throughout the war.

It's a day when we recognise all who served in Vietnam. We honour those veterans who:

- lost their lives during battle returned home wounded, ill or injured
- lost their lives in the years since they returned
- still carry the physical and emotional scars of their service

We also pause to reflect on the impact of service on our veterans' families.

Time for an update on Glamorgan Spring Bay Council and OUR rates:

On Weds. 11th August Minister Roger Jaensch and Lyons MP John Tucker met, here in Swansea, with a representative group of 20 concerned ratepayers from the four major districts of GSBC.

The meeting was to clearly point out the dysfunctional state of GSBC and the lack of good governance being demonstrated, despite GSBC operating under a Performance Improvement Directive from the director of Local Government.

We presented initial results from the petition requesting a Board of Inquiry be established and an investigation into the finances and performance of GSBC. 430 signatures have been collected in one week so thankyou fellow ratepayers and residents. The Petitions are still in your local towns for a few weeks more to give everyone a chance to have their democratic say.

An Online E-Petition to The Tasmanian Parliament is currently being set up and this will allow those absent owners/ shacks owners etc. an equal opportunity to sign the petition. We sincerely thank MP. John Tucker –Lyons for stepping up and sponsoring the E-Petition.

It should be noted that by absolute majority a show of hands indicated total support for a vote of No Confidence in GSBC - both management and Councillors . This was across all four districts represented but can only be symbolic at this stage as the meeting was by invite only ...

Minister Jaensch did put one Furphy to rest, and we thank him for his honesty: AAV is not the Government's preferred method of Rates/Local Government Taxation. The Government does not have a position on this as "The choice and implementation of a rating methodology is a matter solely between the Council and it's Ratepayers".

The AAR Certificate – or rather lack of the same that was used to stop us continuing on our merry way with AAR as we have been happily doing for 8 years with no known complaints: Neither Brighton Council, George Town Council or GSBC has had a Certificate issued annually for the last 8 Years – the Director of Local Govt. had not requested one. The same three Councils are also excluded under The Local Government Act 1993 from having to provide AAR calculations to the Director annually so BANG – another Furphy dead and dusted.

All we want is for the Minister to: Instruct GSBC to rescind the rates, instruct them to restore AAR for this years budget and reissue amended rates. Then instigate a Board of Inquiry into GSBC with the Terms of Reference provided by the Ratepayers of GSBC.

COUNCIL NOT UP TO IT

In July 2020 the then Minister for Local Government Mark Shelton issued a Performance Improvement Notice (PID) to the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council (GSBC).

The PID related to breaches of the Local Government Act 1993 regarding the failure by the GSBC to include all required matters specified in the Local Govern-

ment Act (Content of Plans and Strategies) Order of 2014. Specifically in relation to;

- * It's Long-term Financial Management Plan(LTFP) and;
- * it's Financial Management Strategy (FMS) and;
- * It's Long Term Strategic Asset Management Plan (LTSAMP) and;
- *It's Asset Management Policy (AMP) and;
- *It's Asset Management Strategy (AMS).

The PID also referred to a lack of review of the abovementioned plans and strategies.

The GSBC was required to report monthly on the progress on rectifying these breaches.

The GSBC was also required to make these progress reports available to the public on the Council's web site 14 days from the date they were provided to the Recipients.

The PID specifically required all progress reports to be submitted to the Minister and Director of Local Government and also be made available to the ratepayers of the GSBC.

There are no progress reports on the Council's web site only high level summaries with no contextual or supporting discussion documents to enable ratepayers to know and understand exactly what was being proposed, or which rate models were being looked at or were going to be "workshopped".

It is not clear whether the PID is completed

This lack of information, consultation and transparency about the debt owed by the GSBC and change to the rate model calls into question the validity of the PID Process. There was no mandate to change the rate model without consultation with the ratepayers that alone makes THE GSBC PID process null and void.

The Councillors and Management of the GSBC should be prepared to attend a Public meeting of ratepayers and explain their actions or lack thereof ASAP.

DOG REGISTRATION AUDIT 1 SEPTEMBER 2021 – 31 NOVEMBER 2021

Glamorgan Spring Bay Council will be undertaking a municipal Dog Registration Audit between the months of September and November to encourage responsible pet ownership and help build a safer, happier community.

Any dogs found to be unregistered will result in an infringement of one (1) penalty unit per offence being issued, in accordance with the *Dog Control Act 2000*. Under the *Dog Control Act 2000*, all dogs aged six months and over are required to be registered and microchipped by 30 June each year (this includes working dogs.) A Kennel Licence is required from Council if your property has more than two (2) domestic dogs, or more than four (4) working dogs aged six months and over. Be a responsible pet owner by registering your dog with Council and ensure the tag provided is always worn. Registering your dog increases the likelihood of your pet returning should it become lost. Dogs registered with Glamorgan Spring Bay Council prior to 31 July 2021 will receive a discounted fee. Pension concession is available for one (1) dog, once the concession card has been sited and validated by a Council Officer.

If in the unfortunate situation that your dog is deceased or is no longer at your premises you are obligated to notify Council. Once notified, Officers will cancel the registration and you will not receive any further registration reminders.






