MEREDITH RIVER BRIDGED PROPOSAL

I wonder why this community-based project never got off the ground.

As I understand it a small committee to investigate this project was established early in 2019. By the following year meetings had taken place with the then Council planner who conducted a site visit. Also in 2020 Crown Land Services (owners of a small strip on each river bank.) and ASIC (owners of the 20 metre reserve behind the Cambria Drive loop) advised that they had no issues with what was being proposed. All community groups, local doctor, fire service, parks, bicycle network and others were asked for and did provide letters of support.

An eco assessment was then prepared and paid for by means of a small grant. Committee members then met with the CEO of Bridge Pro to outline requirements. Consequently a suitable design was produced, incorporating the cost of a marinegrade stainless steel 2 metre + wide bridge, for \$1.5 million. This included an 80 year warranty. In the 2015 Strategic Plan it stated that a pedestrian bridge over the Meredith River would be good asset to join the communities of Swansea and Dolphin Sands

John Tucker, state Liberal MP believed it would be an asset for our area and the east coast, while Brian Mitchell Federal Labor MP for Lyons visited the site and was supportive, later approving a \$12,000 grant to remove some pine trees on part of the access to the 20 metre reserve. A local contractor provided a quote of \$150K for surfacing the pathways on each side of the river and a further quote for landscaping plants.

At the time there appears to have been few objections; the main one being the cost to council of depreciation. The five yearly asset re-evaluation would more than offset depreciation

At 80 year warranty depreciation would be 1.25%, the bridge value would increase by at least CPI. The council would actually show an overall increase. The second issue raised by the council was an

At this point, despite all the works and planning done the whole proposal seems to have died, whether through apathy or distractions is unclear. Surely, now is the time for a historically delinquent council to re-invigorate this project, throw its full support behind it and get it underway - at almost no cost to itself.

Clearly, things have deteriorated when we stoop to insult another culture and publicly attack and degrade a race of people. When the local editor/editorial team of the GOBCNews becomes complicit and prints such racism, we all suffer. This is a sadly a demonstration of playing the person and not the issue.






