LABOR WELCOMES SENATE INQUIRY INTO REGIONAL GP **SHORTAGE**

The acute GP shortage across Lyons will now be subject to a Senate Inquiry. Labor called for the inquiry in a bid to investigate the critical lack of doctors across outer metropolitan, rural and regional Australia.

Federal Member for Lyons Brian Mitchell MP welcomed the inquiry as "great news for the people of Lyons".

"Our primary health network is in crisis. Too many people are being forced to wait weeks to see a GP – if they can see a GP at all. And the problem is only getting worse," he said.

"COVID-19 has highlighted the holes and gaps in our health care system, and none are more obvious than the shortage of GPs and other health services across

"But this issue isn't new, people living in Lyons have been battling a critical lack of GPs for far too long.

"This inquiry will investigate why regions are particularly affected by a lack of GPs and put recommendations to the Government.

"The only reason this Labor inquiry is necessary is because the Liberal Government has dropped the ball for eight long years."

The Senate Inquiry will examine the Government's current classification system, the stronger Rural Health Strategy, GP training reforms, and the effects of the Medicare rebate freeze.

The Inquiry will also assess the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on doctor shortages in outer metropolitan, rural, and regional Australia.

"Thank you to the GPs who have been working tirelessly to support our communities and who also took time to meet with me and outline the issues affecting their practices and raise their concerns, Mr Mitchell said.

Dear Editorial team

I am writing regarding what our Mayor said in your last paper. He said, "I also understand a meeting was called in Swansea in late July for community leaders to meet with senior Labor party figures.

Two Councillors and a member of the community were barred from entering the meeting. Another lost opportunity for presenting the facts."

I was at that meeting. I accepted an invite as a Coles Bay volunteer. The community leader comment is from Jen Butlers media release and was obviously meant to provoke the Government. It was not an open invitation. There were no flyers nor Facebook posts. No meeting details were publicly released. The meeting was by invitation only to a representative group of ages, places and occupations. The meeting discussed more than rates, as rates isn't the only problem.

The people the Mayor said were barred from attending were simply not invited and were told this. What is wrong with that? It's completely legal and allowed. GSB Councillors can't go to my doctors appointment nor enter my home uninvited just because the buildings are in GSB. Equally, people meeting with MP's don't have to invite GSB Councillors if they don't want to. Councillors can organise their own meeting with MP's and invite who they want. Did I attend uninvited when Minister Jaensch met with the GM and Mayor and freely put forward my views? No I did not. I would never consider such poor, irrational and unprofessional behaviour, and of course if I tried to attend I would have been told I was not invited. Why would anyone think this is a one-sided right, and complain when the same standards are applied to them as would be to me? Aren't we an egalitarian society?

Following the meeting all one of the MP's could talk about was her perceptions of what she witnessed, having been approached outside the meeting room. That experience definitely left a lasting impression on her, and she asked many attendees about their experiences with the person who gave her cause for concern. I contacted the Government (DPAC) afterwards as I was very distressed by the entire situation that occurred prior to the meeting, which I will not detail, and I wanted assurance of my position having attended. "You are absolutely allowed to meet with MP's and invite who you want to, and no a Councillor has no right to attend uninvited." was said to me by DPAC, amongst other supporting comments.

If the Mayor and Councillors want to discuss with the community the rates increases then they need to urgently organise their own Q&A sessions in GSB towns, and actually allow Q&A to happen, as they should have already. That is how Council should be presenting the facts.

Response to Michael Tyquin re Meredith River pedestrian bridge proposal

Thank you Michael for advocating for this project. The DSRA believe that a cycling/walking connection that joins Swansea, Dolphin Sands and Freycinet has the potential to be extremely beneficial to our region, in particular the Swansea township. To that end, we've invested a lot of time and energy towards this project; we've attended numerous meetings with various advisors, stakeholders and community representatives, held fundraising events, organised reports and plans etc. We'd like to thank the community for all the support we've received.

In response to Michael's question about why the project has stalled, the answer is: Glamorgan Spring Bay Council. After lots of preliminary work, the next logical step for this project was to commission a feasibility study. This study would investigate all aspects of the project to enable an evidence-based decision about the best way forward. It would consider the pros and cons of various options to connect our towns—bridge, barge, punt or some other method—consult with the relevant communities and identify any 'red flags'.

After we found various grants that could be used to fund a feasibility study, we requested council, as the ultimate owner of the assets, to provide a letter of support for the grant application. Despite there being no cost to Council for the feasibility study, they refused. Their refusal flies in the face of their Swansea Structure Plan which provides a 'vision for future land use and development within Swansea to 2035'. Page 64 of the Plan recommends that council 'Investigate long term feasibility of cycle bridge across Meredith River and the Swan River to encourage cycle tourists'.

Our experience is just one more example of problems with our current council, such as council's failure to comply with their stated objectives and their lack of vision for our municipality.

I have just read (in GOBN issue 34) that

As to her concern re. the level of "misinformation" being spread, I ask her to present a detailed list, here, for us to read. My information is sourced from The Local Government Act 1993, GSBC website, Videos from GSBC live streaming of GSBC meetings, an independent qualified solicitor and from personally questioning The Hon. Roger Jaensch (Minister for Local Govt.)

All I want is for GSBC to hold an open public meeting, explain the full and truthful rationale behind their decision to change the rating methodology, rescind the rates for 2021/2022, restore AAR for that year and restore community faith by holding an honest open investigation into AAR versus AAV for the future. I believe admit the decision was made in haste and without due diligence. Fix the issue and let's move on George Town Council arranged for a private financial investigation into this very issue and the balance fell in favour of continuing AAR - that is open and honest governance. It's not too late for GSBC to admit the decision was made in haste and without due diligence. Fix the issue and let's move on .

Dear Editorial team.

It was with a great sense of irony I read Ms Stroud's and Mayor Young's Letter to the Editor last week.

While I absolutely agree with Ms Stroud's claim that "leadership should be about facilitating and... building community in a respectful and inclusive procss", she points the finger at active citizens, and accuses them of failing in that regard, while at the same time, completely overlooking the abject failure of those with a statutory obligation to do exactly that - our council. Perhaps she would prefer a great silence and forgetting to fall over this regime's history of the last nearly three

But very many in our community will not be silenced and haven't forgotten. The following are just some examples of deep grievances against our council: 1. The bloodletting involved in the resignations of two GM's; 2. The sackings, redundancies and resignations under duress of over 95% of management; 3. The closure of the Visitor Information Centres in a secret council meeting with no community consultation; 4. The top-down enforcement and closure of the Natural Resource Management section of council with no community consultation; 5. The systematic marginalisation and demoralisation of community groups all over the municipality and deliberate closing down of their amazing energy and imagination - the Meredith River Bridge project is a classic example, but certainly not the only one; 6. The dramatic hike in rates for a large section of the community with no community consultation; 7. The blow-out in council costs and yet the real itemised account of where this money is going remains deliberately obscured and rendered opaque to ratepayers seeking answers.

How are these actions "respectful" and "inclusive" when they are enforced on the community from on-high, with no grass roots consultation or inclusion?

And how does this history conform to the council's statutory obligation under Section 20 (1) c of The local Government

Act 1993: " to provide for the peace [and] order ... of the municipal area"?

Now if aggrieved members of the community want to exercise their democratic right, to freely organise political opposition and mobilise action against this appalling history, they are at liberty to do so without hindrance or harassment by infiltrators. I am not sure why active citizens seeking democratic justice are the ones who are condemned as being vexatious and divisive. I am appalled and disappointed that someone could make such a claim.

And Mayor Young writes last week about facts - that one must take facts into consideration regarding the rate rises and then we'll understand.

With all due respect, may I remind Mayor Young of one pertinent fact. That his council has a statutory obligation under Section 20 (2) of the Local Government Act 1993 when, "in performing its functions a council is to consult, involve and be accountable to the community" By all accounts, and the overwhelming impression in the community, is that your council failed to consult the community about the recent rate rises. In fact, just a week or so before the rate rises, you and your council attended 'Community Connect' sessions in Swansea, Bicheno and Coles Bay and remained silent about the dramatic decision you were intending to vote on - even though the sessions were the ideal forum and time to fulfill your statutory obligation under the Act.

Mayor Young, would you care to offer the community an explanation as to why you and the four councillors, who sprung these rate rises upon an unsuspecting community should not immediately resign, given what appears to be a failure to meet your obligation under the Act?

And if you refuse to resign, would you care to offer the community an explanation as to why the Minister for Local Government should not establish a Board of Inquiry into the financial and administrative affairs of what certainly appears to be a rogue Glamorgan Spring Bay Council?

WET AND WARM SPRING FOR EASTERN AUSTRALIA

Spring in Australia may see more rain than usual in the east and a dry outlook for parts of the west, Bureau of Meteorology climatologists say.

According to the latest seasonal outlook issued today by the Bureau, this spring is likely to bring above average rainfall for people living in the east of the country as well as cooler days and warmer nights.

The current outlook remains dry for those living in Western Australia and nights will be cooler than average for the south of the state, with spring days also tipped to be warmer for the Top End and Tasmania.

Bureau climatologist Dr Andrew Watkins said predictions for a wetter and warmer spring come after a particularly wet and warm winter.

"Nationally, we've seen the wettest winter since 2016," he said.

"Australia's average winter temperature is also expected to be one of the ten warmest on record, particularly in the tropical north."

Dr Watkins said the main reason behind the Bureau's prediction for a wetter than average spring was a climate driver called the Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD).

"We've currently got a negative IOD - a phenomenon which typically brings an increased chance of rainfall to southern and eastern Australia," he said.

"This negative IOD is expected to persist throughout spring but is currently weaker than the last negative IOD event we saw in 2016, which brought Australia's wettest May-October period on record."

Another relevant climate driver, known as the El Niño-Southern Oscillation (or EN-

SO), is likely to remain neutral with no declaration of a La Niña event expected in the coming months.

The latest outlooks are available on the Bureau's website.
