## WINTER BOAT MAINTENANCE

August 2023

September is the traditional time for football finals - and summer dreaming about the boating season ahead – as well as an excellent time for regular boat maintenance.

Many Tasmanian boaters stow their craft on trailers through the winter months. You should check your boat and its components to ensure they are in good order and operational.

In general:

- Inspect aluminium boats for cracked welds or electrolysis, delamination, rotting in fibreglass boats, cracks and general wear and tear
- Test your steering. Does it move freely? Check the cable or hydraulic line for leaks top up hydraulic fluid if necessary
- Ensure bung is in good condition and . not damaged. Does it seal off correctly?
- Charge the batteries and ensure they are secured
- Check wiring for cracking, loose wires and corrosion
- Ensure that bilges are clean and dry
- Check your fuel system inspect the tank for cracks and corrosion; replace old fuel with new after periods of inactivity; drain water and debris from fuel.
- This is also a good time to review all your safety gear, including:
- Have your inflatable life jackets been serviced in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

Are your flares in date; if they're out of date or close to it, consider purchasing a new Electronic Visual Distress Signal. If you choose to carry an EVDS make sure your vessel is fitted with a GPS enabled EPIRB and a working VHF radio in Sheltered Waters. EVDS are ineffective in daylight hours.

Test you VHF radio to ensure it is functioning correctly. Check your EPIRB expiry date and ensure the unit is registered with AMSA. Test any electrics operating from the battery such as radios and navigation lights; test that navigation lights and bilge pump work, if fitted.

Inspect anchor, shackles, chain and line for any sign of wear or corrosion. Make sure shackles are tight and moused (pin secured with wire).

Operate your auxiliary engine periodically to ensure it will work when required. Check your trailer. Replace deteriorated rollers and adjust their height for even distribution of load. Test the indicator and brake lights regularly; check tyre wear and pressure regularly.

Replace the trailer's tie down straps if frayed and replace the winch cable/strap if it has become frayed.

Make sure you have your outboard or diesel engine serviced. For regular servicing and advice on servicing intervals contact your local outboard or diesel engine dealer. Manufacturers usually recommend a service by a specialised workshop at least every 12 months.

All of this preparation means that the next time you go boating, you can be confident knowing that your boat has been serviced and is well-prepared.







#### NEW FACILITIES FOR SWANSEA PRIMARY SCHOOL

As you would know, Swansea Primary School is undergoing a \$488,000 upgrade of the library space, including new spaces for student support and visiting health professionals and construction of an outdoor learning area.

This is great news for our students, staff and the Swansea community, with the library servicing not only our school, but also the local community two days per week.

As part of the works, the Swansea Online Access Centre is to be integrated into the new library space to continue to offer a range of services to residents and visitors to the area.

With construction works already underway, the contractor now needs to undertake asbestos removal. The contractor, Batchelor Construction Group, will oversee this work in accordance with workplace standards for asbestos removal and there is a rigorous process for doing this on the school site. The removal plan must also be cleared by a third party to ensure it complies with these standards prior to commencement. We envisage for this to take place over 5 days, in early September.

The area undergoing this work is being securely cordoned off from the rest of the site to provide extra assurance for students, staff and the community.

DURING THIS TIME, SCHOOL DROP OFF AND PICK UP WILL BE VIA THE FRONT GATE ON THE TASMAN HIGHWAY. THE CAR PARK WILL BE CORDONED OFF AND CARS AND PEDESTRIANS WILL NOT BE PER-MITTED. #### SWANSEA ONLINE ACCESS CENTRE UPDATE FRIDAY 1<sup>ST</sup> SEPTEMBER 2023

As you can see from the article from the principal of Swansea Primary School, Kristy Hay, the renovations to the school, library and online centre are not a small "hammer, nail & a hunk of wood" type job.

You are also probably thinking, the project began on the 1<sup>st</sup> August and came to a standstill on the 4<sup>th</sup>. The reason for the temporary cessation was the discovery of asbestos in the walls and the floor tiles that were under the carpet. As a specialist removal team were required to remove the asbestos, together with Government regulations in relation to this material, a delay was encountered whilst specialist contractors were engaged. The contractors are anticipated to

be onsite over the next fortnight, after which the builders will return to resume the renos.


It is not known at this stage as to whether this delay will impact the completion of the works and consequently the reopening of the library & online centre which was originally expected to be the end of October beginning of November.



## MORE FUNDS FOR MEN'S SHEDS

Men's Sheds in Lyons will share in almost \$670,000 in Australian Government funding to continue supporting the health and wellbeing of their community.

The grants will help sheds with improving their facilities, buying tools and equipment, coordinating health-related training, and hosting events with a focus on men's health issues.

The Ross and Districts Community Shed will receive \$5000 for a kitchen upgrade and safety equipment.

Jordan River Services, which runs the Bridgewater Men's Shed, will receive \$4555 to pay for new equipment such as a bandsaw, orbital sander and an electric saw.

And the Swansea Men's Shed will re-

ceive \$2283 for the purchase and installation of a dust extraction ducting kit.

There are approximately 1300 Men's Sheds across Australia offering thousands of men of all ages a safe place to meet, socialise, connect, and engage in meaningful community work.

## **A BIOCHAR WORK-**SHOP was held in Swansea on Saturday 26th August.

It was hosted by Libby Wardlaw and attended by about 16 Swansea and Dolphin Sands residents, as well as Steve Barrett from Tasmanian Fire Service, and was a very informative experience.

The speakers were Christina Giudici an Agricultural Scientist for some 30 years, working on renewable energy and regeneration. Christina is interested in helping people grow their own food.

Frank Strie is originally from Germany, now a Bioenergy Consultant, he has been a Master Forester, trained forestry workers, and has worked in saw milling since 2007. He decide that Tasmania was the best place to live and raise his family.

BIOCHAR is a charcoal like substance made from burning organic material as in agricultural, forestry or garden waste. It is a controlled procedure, burnt in a specially designed container (Cone Kiln) or 'Pit'. Both of these were demonstrated on the day.

The fire is quenched and the burning interrupted at an appropriate time, which locks in the carbon. During this process little or no contaminating smoke or fumes are released. Biochar can be added to compost, directly to the soil, potting mixes and

crushed and mixed with your organic fertiliser. It adds porous substance to the soil where nutrients can attach and be used by the plants.






