

The imminent closure of the Westpac bank branch at Sorell is "yet another blow" to Tasmania's regional communities, says Federal Member for Lyons Brian Mitchell.

Westpac, which has seen share prices rise more than 70 per cent in the past financial year, announced today it will close the Sorell branch on Friday 15 October 2021.

"Once again, a big bank is showing complete disregard for its regional customers by shutting down a branch," Mr Mitchell said.

"If a bank can't figure out how to turn a profit in a fast-growing region like Sorell, what hope do other towns across regional Tasmania have of keeping their branches.

"This closure shows that the big banks are determined to close their regional branch networks, replacing them with online services and limited Australia Post banking."

"Just weeks ago, the Commonwealth abandoned St Marys and cut hours at Deloraine, Longford and St Helens," the MP said. "In recent years the ANZ and NAB have also cut their networks.

"We need to rebuild our regions and stop this continual hollowing out of essential services.'

Mr Mitchell urged Westpac customers in Sorell to show the bank the same loyalty it was showing them, and consider moving their business to a bank that supported the

LETTERS TO THE EDITORIAL TEAM

To the editorial team.

We own a property at Dolphin Sands, but are resident in NSW. In normal times we can enjoy our property 4-5 times a year. Otherwise, it is a holiday rental home requiring constant supervision. We know people around Swansea, employ local people and are members of the DSRA and ECA.

So, we have followed with interest the correspondence in your columns regarding the GSBC and the recent switch to an AAV rates base. Our rates have risen considerably as a result. But our NSW rates are calculated on this basis, so we are used to it. While there may be an equity argument for the AAR system, an AAV system is realistically more equitable and sustainable.

No one disputes the issues to do with governance at the GSBC in recent years. But new councillors and a new mayor were only recently elected and a new GM appointed to sort matters out and restore fiduciary accountability. It seems only reasonable to support Council in this endeavour, even if it involves potentially unpopular policies. These things cut both ways: while local government is accountable to the community, the community has a responsibility to support its elected representatives – short of demonstrable and significant malfeasance or misgovernance. The many recent letters on this matter are part of a necessary debate. However, such debates need to be civil, conducted in good faith, and be reasoned and evidencebased. Readers will judge for themselves which of your correspondents have met these criteria.

TASWATER WELCOMES NEW DRAFT 'FLUSHABILITY STANDARD'

TasWater welcomes the announcement that Standards Australia has released the draft standard, DR AS/NZS 5328 Flushable Products for public comment. The draft standard outlines the criteria for materials which are suitable for flushing down the toilet in Australia and New Zealand.

Service Delivery General Manager David Hughes-Owen said TasWater is pleased a standard has been released for public comment and hoped it will lead to clearer guidelines around what not to flush. "Items including wet wipes and paper towels, when flyshed, cause a build-up in our systems," Mr. Hughes-Owen said. "Flushing these items also risks blocking both the household pipes as well as Tas-Water's sewerage system and they remain a problem right up until we have to sift them out when they reach the sewage treatment plant."

"We hope that once the standard has been finalised, it will help lead to the reduction of items flushed which are not one of the three P's: pee, poo or toilet paper."

Water Services Association of Australia (WSAA) Executive Director Adam Lovell said the draft Australia and New Zealand Standard will be the first of its kind internationally, where both utilities and manufacturers have come together in its development.

"It outlines a framework, provides label-

ling guidance and requirements, and sets out methods for testing whether products are suitable for toilet flushing and compatible with wastewater systems and the environment', said Mr Lovell said. "It has been developed by a technical committee including manufacturers, water utilities, peak bodies and consumer groups and includes pass/fail criteria." TasWater and WSAA encourage comments on the standard, which is available through the Standards Australia Public Comment Portal for a 9-week period until 1 November 2021






