AGRICULTURE VISA WILL BE A BOON FOR TASMANIA

Farmers an primary producers in Tasmania are a step closer to benefitting from the Morrison Government's new Australian Agriculture Worker Visa.

The Government amended the Migration Regulations on 30 September 2021 to create the Australian Agriculture Worker Visa (Ag Visa) and continue along the pathway of providing an agriculture visa that will help secure the future of rural and regional Australia.

This historic announcement that the Ag Visa is now law ensures the visa will help secure the long-term labour force our Tasmanian farmers.

Assistant Minister for Forestry and Fisheries and Senator for Tasmania Jonno Duniam said the Agriculture Visa will also create a pathway to permanent residency for those workers who will help secure the future of our region.

"The Morrison Government promised this visa and here it is. The creation of the Ag visa under the Migration Regulations is a landmark moment for our farm, forestry and fisheries industries, and delivers on our promise to have it in place this year," Assistant Minister Duniam said.

"The visa will be available to seasonal workers, skilled and semiskilled workers.

"It will benefit not only farms, but also the fisheries, forestry and agricultural processing sectors, who will also get access to workers under this visa.

"Worker restrictions have always been a problem, but it has been taken to the next level with COVID and the subsequent international and internal borders.

"We now have a visa that will give Tasmania a long term, reliable workforce for our agricultural industries.

"The Morrison Government will always stand up for regional and rural Australia, and with this visa we have again delivered." Today's regulation provides a new Australian Agriculture Worker stream which will provide for the entry and temporary stay of workers across primary industries sectors.

This provides the pathway for workers to arrive with first worker arrivals once partner country negotiations are complete. Any workers will also need to meet necessary Federal and State quarantine requirements.



IS IT A MISSED OPPORTUNITY?

Has the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council missed a golden opportunity to commemorate Swansea's 200-year centenary by failing to support an application to build a pedestrian bridge across the Meredith River. Support by the council could have recognised the Meredith family's contribution to the settling of the area. When built the bridge will give those residents and holidaymakers from both sides of the river who wish to walk or cycle, 365 day a year access. Instead of cyclists having to use a dangerous section of the Tasman Highway and navigate the potholes on Swan River Road would give them safe access to and from Swansea.

The proposed bridge like the one recently constructed at St Helens (shown below during construction phase) will be manufactured from marine grade aluminium, precast concrete structure with FRP decking. Council's main concern has been centred around ongoing maintenance, but the structure has a 10-year guarantee against structural defects and an 80-year warranty. It is proposed to be built using federal and/ or state government funding options. There never seems to be any concern about maintenance on Swan River Road, they waste money filling potholes one week and the next week the potholes are back to where they were, bigger and deeper.

On a recent trip to Smithton, we decided to travel back over a few days via the northern coastline across to Gladstone down to St Helens and back to Dolphin Sands. There seems to be no concern by councils with maintenance across the North of the state as in most areas there are pathways. One outstanding pathway was from Latrobe's Bell's Parade to Ambleside near the bridge at Devonport. Around 4k long it is constructed along the edge of the Mersey River, has bridge sections, has filled

sections that venture out into the water and has a concrete top. Another pathway was at Tomahawk, it wandered alongside the road for about 1k from the shacks (about 10) to the shop at the caravan park. It has a gravel surface. No maintenance worries there and probably constructed with grant money. Our councillors need to travel to other council areas, see the valuable infrastructure, and vision they have for their

communities

I understand the council's financial predicament now, but they are not alone as there are a number of Tasmanian councils having the same problem, but many have vision beyond their financial predicament. Given the council should get back in the black in the future, not having to outlay any funding, only in principle support, the Meredith Bridge with its 80-year warranty, would be an infrastructure asset to Swansea. Where do our local councillors stand with this proposal and what is their vision for the area?





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTAND-ING TO SUPPORT AQUACULTURE FURTHER OFFSHORE

The Australian and Tasmanian governments have agreed to support a framework to deliver offshore aquaculture in Commonwealth waters off the coast of Tasmania.

Assistant Minister for Forestry and Fisheries and Senator for Tasmania Jonno Duniam and Tasmanian Minister for Primary Industries and Water Guy Barnett said the joint agreement between the Australian and Tasmanian governments will help examine the economic, environmental and operational feasibility of offshore aquaculture.

"Currently, aquaculture in Australia is operated in state or territory waters and by moving further offshore – more than three nautical miles – we can harness recent technological improvements and investigate the potential environmental and resource access benefits available from undertaking aquaculture in deeper waters," Senator Duniam said..

"In 2017, the Australian Government committed to developing arrangements for aquaculture in Commonwealth waters, and this is a significant step towards reaching that goal.

"The work will be led by the Blue Economy Cooperative Research Centre (CRC), an independent not-for-profit company funded under the Australian Government's CRC Program.

"The outcomes of this work won't just be about Tasmania. "This will provide valuable information on the potential for offshore aquaculture for all states and territories.

"Aquaculture is currently worth \$1.6 billion nationally and is growing both here and globally. By going offshore, the Australian Government is backing growth towards the \$100 billion Ag2030 goal.


"I couldn't be prouder to be working with the Tasmanian Government on this project."

Tasmanian Minister for Primary Industries and Water Guy Barnett said that Tasmania was an ideal state to develop aquaculture knowledge and equipment, given it is home to Australia's largest aquaculture sector.

"The Tasmanian aquaculture sector has been a national success story, with the industry growing steadily to provide world class products while also delivering jobs in regional Tasmania.

"In 2020, Tasmanian aquaculture gross value of production increased by over seven per cent to \$931 million and this MOU with the Commonwealth fits perfectly with our recently announced 10-Year Plan Salmon Plan," Minister Barnett said.

TASMANIAN SEAFARERS' MEMORIAL ANNUAL SERVICE SUNDAY 17TH OCTOBER 2021

The annual Tasmanian Seafarers' Memorial service will be held this year at Triabunna after a cancellation last year due to the pandemic. Organisers are hoping that, subject to continued positive health advice, the Service will bring together members of the state's maritime organisations for the Service and for the traditional Blessing of the Fleet.

There are now 129 plaques installed on the Memorial recording the loss of 1,560 souls in Tasmanian waters or Tasmanians lost at sea somewhere in the world. Three new plaques were added this year, recording the loss of two fishermen Walter Coulson of Dover in 1961, and Kevin (Bruce) Haigh of Orford who fished out of Triabunna.

The third plaque commemorates the loss in 1850 of the 'Lady Denison' with all those on board – 42 in total, which disappeared in rough weather on a voyage from South Australia to Hobart. It was felt that she had encountered rough weather after leaving Adelaide, but tales were spread at the time that the convicts on board had overwhelmed the crew and passengers, and had sailed for San Francisco. Wreckage identified as coming from the 'Lady Denison' was later found around the Cape Grim area.

The Service will be held at the Memorial, by the Triabunna Marina, on Sunday October 17th at 10.50 for 11.00 am.






