Finally Covid vaccination data for Glamorgan Spring Bay municipal area. This is an extract that takes in the two main postcodes which overlap GSB, unfortunately the Govt are unable to be more accurate as the commonwealth data does not take in our LGA on its own.

However this looks very positive, in fact Glamorgan Spring Bay is the highest level vaccination rate (second dose) in the State along with Hobart! Glamorgan Spring Bay may have been dragged down in first and second doses by Break O Day who overlap our 7215 post code. Break O Day are at 54% second dose.

As at yesterday seven Tasmanian Councils were below 50% double dosed.

Well done community, medical practitioners and in particular Council staff for their early initiative in getting the Triabunna State Gov clinic set up.
