GLAMORGAN SPRING BAY NATURAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT AND CLIMATE RESILIENCE STRATEGY

Over the past year the Landscape Recovery Foundation has been working with Glamorgan Spring Bay Council and the East Coast Catchments Steering Committee to develop the Glamorgan Spring Bay Natural Resources Management and Climate Resilience Strategy. Considered to be a "living" the strategy will be progressively developed as it is put into action. We invite you to take a look and get involved in putting the strategy into action. Your feedback is also welcome as we review and improve it as we go.

The strategy provides an overview of the Natural Resources of the Glamorgan Spring Bay municipality, the pressures on those resources and priority actions for their management. It provides a framework for cross-tenure collaboration and cooperative action over the next five years.

The strategy documents include the formal strategy, a summary version, and for the people who want a quick look at the actions an extract with the executive summary and the tables with objectives, goals, actions and measures of success.

Over the next 12 months comments and feedback will be consolidated for incorporation at the annual review. Each year the document with be evaluated against measures of success – it will be reviewed and improved. This approach uses the principles of action planning and agile project management, allowing the document to be able to adapt as new information about climate change and resource condition becomes available, to reflect community priorities and to ensure that the actions in the strategy are achieving the desired outcomes.

STADIUM PROPOSAL HAS BECOME A FARCE

It's farcical that the Premier is now talking about the Macquarie Point stadium having 40,000 seats when we have no designs for the project and won't for at least 12 months and his shonky business case earlier this year said it only needed 23,000 seats.

The Premier unveiled plans via Facebook last night to increase the seating capacity of the Macquarie Point Stadium from 23,000 to 40,000.

How on earth does he expect to stay within the \$715 million price tag for the stadium?

He's the only person in Tasmania that believes a 23,000-seat stadium can be built for \$715 million but now he's talking about it having twice as many seats.

The Premier is making this up as he goes along and it would have to be one of the worst planned infrastructure projects in the state's history.

Premier Rockliff has not revealed how he

is paying for the increased stadium cost but he also hasn't revealed how he'll pay for the other components of his precinct plan.

It is disappointing there will be so little detail available before Parliament is asked to consider Project of State Significance legislation.

It seems more and more likely that the POSS process might be the only way to actually get some truth and answers about this project.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT CONCERNED ABOUT PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE FIRE LEVY

Councils are concerned with the very significant increases for many households in the Fire Service levy proposed in the new Fire and Emergency Services Bill.

For example:

- <u>Brighton</u> -- Commercial properties currently paying a fire service rate of \$17,000 increasing to \$22,000.
- Many residential properties in their rural districts are seeing a doubling of the levy.
- <u>Kingborough</u> Commercial properties currently paying \$2,500, increasing to \$34,000.
- <u>Huon Valley</u> Commercial properties an average increase of \$1,119.
- Residential properties in the Huon Valley average increase of \$129.
- <u>St Helens</u> Residential properties in St Helens will see a doubling of the levy they pay.

Commercial properties up to six times what they are currently paying.

Some of the additional revenue generated is staggering, with approximately an extra \$3M collected in the Clarence municipality alone. Great Oyster Bay Community News



While there has been work occurring over some years, many of the details in the Bill have come as a complete surprise to local government, and with no prior consultation on the implications for councils or their communities.

LGAT President and Break O'Day Council Mayor Mick Tucker said that "councils are disappointed with lack of consultation with our sector, particularly given councils play a significant role in responding to emergencies.

"These significant changes to the cost for many households have not previously been discussed with the community and now we have been given only five weeks to digest the options and provide feedback," Mayor Tucker said.

To make matters worse, there are a lot of details not contained in the new Bill.

"This feels like a half-baked Bill, that has



been rushed out after the Government has gone slow over the past six years," Mayor Tucker said.

A range of national and global events over the past 18 months has placed significant upward stress on the supply chain, particularly the wholesale energy market. With wholesale costs accounting for 40 per cent of the electricity bill, these pressures have been a major driver for increased prices for consumers across Australia.

To help mitigate price increases, Aurora Energy worked alongside State and Federal Governments to establish new targeted bill relief for customers. Up to 140,000 households and around 35,000 small businesses in Tasmania will be eligible for the relief payments.

In addition, the Your Energy Support (YES) incentive program was extended, a range of community service organisations continued to be assisted and \$200,000 was provided to top up the Tasmanian Government's energy hardship fund to directly support customers experiencing financial vulnerability.

Within Aurora Energy, an ongoing emphasis on connection and employee wellbeing, supported by hybrid working, helped produce strong results across both culture and engagement measures.
