INTEGRITY COMMIS-SION LAUNCHES **NEW PROGRAM** & REPORTING **MECHANISM TO HOLD PUBLIC** SECTOR TO ACCOUNT

A new section of the Integrity Commission's website will allow the public to see which of its recommendations the Tasmanian public sector has adopted.

The recommendations are drawn from investigations, audits and research reports. Chief Commissioner Greg Melick said the website is part of the Commission's new Oversight and Compliance Program.

"The new pages set up a transparent mechanism that lets members of the public see the extent to which the public sector is acting on the Commission's advice," Chief Commissioner Melick said.

The page forms part of a larger section of the website which provides members of the public with detailed information about the Oversight and Compliance function.

"The Oversight and Compliance Team assists both our investigative and educational functions," Chief Commissioner Melick said.

"Their work helps us understand an organisation's processes and its capacity to manage misconduct matters.

"It informs how we educate and engage with organisations to help ensure misconduct is managed effectively. It also helps us understand misconduct risks and trends in the public sector.

"We want to help the public understand how the Commission deals with complaints.

"Our intention is that reporting via the new webpage will hold relevant organisations to account and ensure appropriate action is taken to manage misconduct in the public sector."

BOOST TO RFDS RURAL DENTAL SERVICES

The Rockliff Liberal Government has welcomed a new mobile dental truck to the Royal Flying Doctor Service's (RFDS), enhancing its ability to deliver dental services to rural and remote communities in Tasmania.

Minister for Health Guy Barnett said the Government has been a strong supporter of the RFDS for many years as part of its commitment to providing the best possible health outcomes for Tasmanians.

"Our regions are the lifeblood of Tasmania and this service will help increase access to dental care close to home," Minister Barnett said.

"We are investing \$300,000 into the RFDS to support the delivery of dental services in the West Coast, Huon Valley and Central Highlands local government areas.

"Our Government signed a new Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the RFDS last year, as part of a 10-year strategic partnership to strengthen the delivery of health services to rural and remote communities, including dental health services.

The Rockliff Liberal Government is doing what matters for Tasmanians by working closely with the Royal Flying Doctor Service to provide Tasmanians with the

healthcare they need and deserve.

"Supporting rural and regional communities to access quality healthcare is an important priority for our Government, which is why it is fantastic to see the Royal Flying Doctor Service further enhance their capability to deliver dental services to rural areas," Minister Barnett said.

"The new van will complement our Government's existing strategic partnership with the Royal Flying Doctor Service, which provides funding to deliver dental health services to some of Tasmania's most remote communities."

The Rockliff Liberal Government is delivering on its long-term plan for oral healthcare services across the State through our \$6.5 million commitment to deliver additional dental appointments.

"We have already exceeded our goal of delivering 25,350 additional dental appointments since the program began in April 2021," Minister Barnett said.





HAVE YOUR SAY ON PROPOSED REFORMS FOR COUNCILLORS

The Rockliff Liberal Government is committed to supporting and strengthening Tasmania's local government sector and ensuring councils are well equipped to serve their communities. The Office of Local Government has released a discussion paper outlining proposed reforms to the framework for managing councillors' conflicts of interest.

Minister for Local Government, Nic Street, said that the discussion paper has been developed in consultation with the Local Government Association of Tasmania and council representa-

"The Managing conflicts of interest of councillors - framework proposal discussion paper sets out a contemporary approach for identifying, managing, and mitigating councillors' personal interests and conflicts of interest," Minister Street said. "Elected representatives from local governments are expected

to conduct themselves with honesty, professionalism and dedication to their community.

"At times, situations have arisen that have highlighted a need to revise the way councillors declare and manage their personal interests when fulfilling their public duties.

"Having a strong framework to manage councillors' conflicts of interest is vital to protecting the integrity of councils to ensure the community can have confidence in the decisions they make."

The discussion paper proposes changing how conflicts of interest are classified and managed, broadening when councillors are required to disclose interests, requiring councillors to submit annual personal interest returns and making Tasmanian penalties proportionate to penalties in other States.

Submissions are open until 22 December 2023 and can be made via email to lgconsultation@dpac.tas.gov.au. Further information may be found on the Department of Premier and Cabinet website.

With the arrival of peak pollen season, increased risk of Thunderstorm Asthma and predictions of a hot summer with potential for bushfires and poor air quality, Asthma Australia is urging people with asthma to prepare their asthma plans now to proactively manage their condition.

With this triple whammy asthma season ahead, people with asthma who haven't already prepared or updated their asthma plans should act as soon as possible.

It's also important for people to control their asthma or hay fever symptoms with preventer medication. People with hay fever or allergic rhinitis are also being urged to visit their doctor to discuss treatment options as having hay fever worsens asthma control for many people with asthma.

This can be particularly bad during high pollen seasons, where the threat of thunderstorms can lead to severe asthma attacks

HYDRO TASMANIA IS **BUSHFIRE READY**

In the wake of the Flinders Island bushfires, and looking towards a hot, dry summer, Hydro Tasmania says it is bushfire ready, with plans in place to keep staff safe ly prepared for each bushfire season. and the lights on.

As Australia's largest renewable energy generator and largest water manager, Hydro Tasmania is responsible for the operation of 54 major dams and 30 hydropower stations across the state.

Many of these assets are in remote bush locations which means it's critical to have proactive and clear emergency plans in place.

Jesse Clark, Hydro Tasmania Executive General Manager of Assets and Infrastructure, said bushfire planning and mitigation measures are a major focus for the organisation coming into summer.

"We know a challenging fire season is ahead of us, which is why we've completed over hundreds of hectares of hazard reduction burns, created and maintained fire trails, prioritised our vegetation maintenance and reviewed fire management plans at all of our power stations.

"We call in the experts to fight fires when they arise – what we do well is being proactive and prepared before a fire happens," he said.

Australia's climate influences have shifted significantly since last spring, and the arrival of El Niño is expected to bring with it reduced rainfall, more temperature extremes, and a greater risk of bushfires.

Each power station has an individual fire management plan that examines the topography and elevation of each location, to ensure Hydro Tasmania sites are adequate-

"These include guidelines on vegetation management, and a fire mitigation program, to protect critical infrastructure like power stations, pump stations, pipelines and pen stocks," he said.

These measures are all done in consultation with a range of stakeholders, including the Tasmania Fire Service, Tasmania Parks and Wildlife, and TasNetworks, in accordance with best practice standards and legislation.

Mr Clark said that in the unlikely event a power station is forced offline due to fire it's unlikely to have an adverse impact on Tasmania's energy security.

"We've been preparing for El Niño for some time, and thanks to careful water management our storage levels are very healthy, providing great flexibility for our operations.

"We work very closely with TasNetworks on transmission and distribution to ensure

Tasmanians have a secure, reliable, and resilient electricity system," he said.

"We never want to test the bushfire plans we have developed, but Tasmanians should feel confident knowing that every effort has been made to ensure we're prepared should the worst happen."




