MELSHELL OYSTER FARM OFFICIAL RE-OPENING

The guests included Mr Brian Mitchell, Federal Member for Lyons; GSBC General Manager Greg Ingham; CEO Tasmanian Seafood Industry Council Julian Harrington; Colin Stephenson and Swansea Men's Shed Crew; Chris Clarkson, Rural Alive and Well program and representatives of State Growth, East Coast Tourism Tasmania, local businesses, friends, and valued wholesale customers of Melshell Oysters.

Cassie thanked Colin Stephenson and the



Men's Shed crew for the table & chair sets that they had made and assembled.

After the official duties were performed, Cassie and Ian invited the guests to sample the menu which included Ling and Feta Roulade; Pickled Tasmanian Octopus; Melshell Oyster Pate; Melshell Oysters shucked fresh at the event and Steamed Melshell Mussels. I recommend all of these tasty treats which are available at the Oyster Shack 7 days a week. The very tasty food was washed down by a glass or two of "The Bend" Riesling and "Gala Estate" Pinot two of the local wineries on the East Coast of Tasmania.

APOLOGY AS DIRECTED BY THE EQUAL OPPORTUNITY TRIBUNAL

It has come to my attention that there may be racism here in Swansea . A person wrote, in a letter printed in the Great Oyster Bay Community News, a disparaging name relating to a foreign national namely the Premier of China. That was my letter ... I am deeply offended that I have offended others and sincerely apologise . In my defence I was taking strong post-surgery pain medication and that may have left my “Moral Compass” settings somewhat off centre. Lesson learnt – Do not take drugs whilst writing letters. Or at least do not press SEND until the following day. Having read, in the press, many expressions such as “Orange Man” for ex. President Trump, “Little Rocket Man” for North Korean President Kim Jong-Un etc. I did not consider my use of the extension to the Premier's name as racist. I accept fully that some may see it as just that but again I did not intend to cause offence to any person of ethnic origins either here in Australia or anywhere else for that matter. I stand fully behind our farmers and businesses as they are being mercilessly targeted by the Chinese politically motivated tariffs etc. and that passion also affected my judgement. I am offended that the person who lodged the formal complaint, of racism, did not give me the chance to explain in person or by email or phone. I have known and worked for her for some six years and provided both physical work and support since she moved to Tasmania. I cannot help but feel that this complaint, whilst totally justified, is not an attempt to bully me and intimidate me into ceasing to write letters to the newspaper regarding the recent Council rating issues. I will continue to question Council and others until the Council Rates issue is resolved. I apologise to the staff of the Great Oyster Bay Community News for involving them with the above complaint. I cannot help but feel that including them in this complaint is a further attempt to “gag” communications within the community and to attack a volunteer run newspaper is a questionable response to a grievance against me. 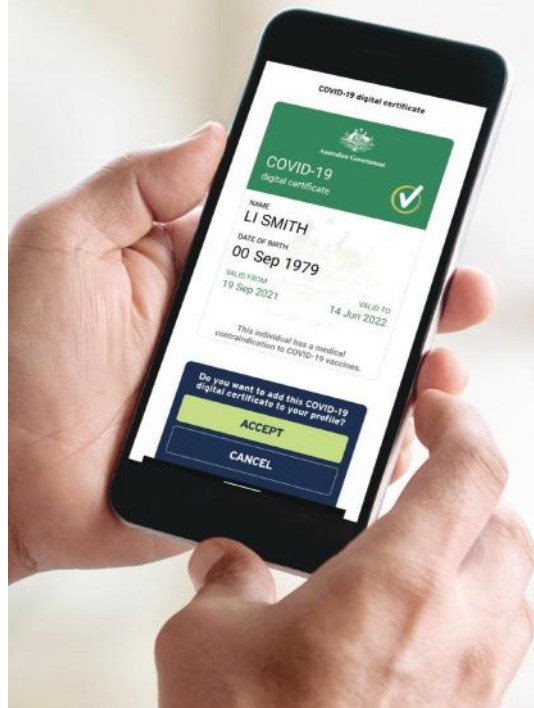

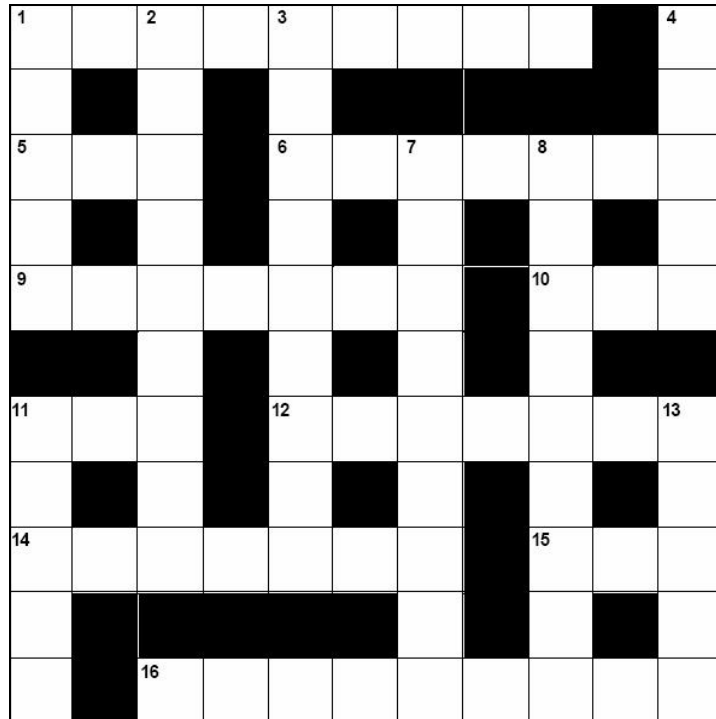
