FAT CATS GET MORE WHILE HARDWORK-ING TASMANIANS DO IT TOUGH

If Tasmanians needed any reminder that they were getting a raw deal on electricity costs, today's Aurora GBE scrutiny hearing solidified the fact.

The committee heard that across the last financial year, the number of <u>Tasmanians repaying</u> an energy debt rose by 3,000 to over 14,500.

The amount owed by Aurora customers has increased to over \$15m – a rise of nearly \$5m in a year, and 13,397 customers had their payment plan cancelled for non-payment.

Fifty concession customers – likely to be pensioners and the state's most vulnerable – had their power disconnected.

While Tasmanians are doing it tougher than ever before, Aurora's top executives are being looked after, with executive remuneration rising by 40 per cent.

The total reported remuneration for the CEO position rose by \$80,000 – roughly an average wage of a hard-working Tasmanian who might be having trouble paying their bills in a cost of living crisis.

Aurora's former CEO also received a payout of close to \$225,000, after she decided she didn't want to renew her contract.

When asked what he thought the 50 Tasmanian concession customers who have had their power disconnected over the past year would think of the massive payout, the Minister could only deflect to Aurora.

The Minister was also without an answer when asked why Tasmanians were receiving the state/federal energy bill relief scheme more slowly than anywhere else in the nation.

Tasmanians clearly need more help with the power bills, but it seems fat cat executives are being prioritised after 10 years of a Liberal government.

A Labor Government would cap power price increases at 2.5 per cent a year for Tasmanian households and small businesses so that Tasmanians truly pay a Tasmanian price for Tasmanian power. We would legislate to achieve that

within 100 days of taking office.

COMMUNITY SURVEY REVEALS CRUCIAL INSIGHTS INTO LOCAL HEALTHCARE NEEDS

A survey of people living in Glamorgan Spring Bay Council region has found that wait time for appointments is the greatest barrier to accessing health care, followed by cost, both of which lead many people to seek health services outside of their local area.

A lack of transport was the third most reported barrier to accessing healthcare for residents of GSBC.

cohealth, the not-for-profit health service that recently took over management of the Triabunna and Bicheno medical practices, conducted the survey to better understand what health services locals currently access, what's missing and how health services could be improved.

The anonymous survey was completed by nearly 200 people from the East Coast community, and is part of a consultation process that also includes face-to-face meetings with community groups and interviews with local services.

cohealth said the survey showed that many people travel out of the region to access health services such as dental, optometry, medical specialists, x-rays and allied health, when these should be available as needed close to home.

The survey, combined with insights being collected through kitchen table conversations will help cohealth to design health services that are tailored to the needs of this unique community.

Eighty-six per cent of respondents felt that there needed to be more government action to improve health services.

"The community health model of care is part of the solution to improving access to healthcare in the region, because it takes a team-based approach, in which GPs are part of a team that

also includes nurses, allied health, mental health and alcohol and drug services," said Carlo Demaio, cohealth Executive Lead, Strate-

gy Impact and Development.

"When high-quality, accessible health services are not available locally, people's health problems can snowball, leading to more serious issues down the track," he said.

"Bringing a range of health services into the community, rather than waiting for the community to find the services will help us to manage chronic health conditions, improve access for people who face the greatest barriers to care, and keep people out of hospital," said Mr Demaio.

Among the ideas suggested by survey respondents to improve healthcare in the region were more frequent visiting specialists, hiring more GPs and nurses, and increasing incentives for medical practitioners to move to the area for work.

cohealth thanks all those who took the time to participate.

In 2024 cohealth will move to the co-design phase in which communities will be invited to participate in workshops to discuss ideas for improving primary health care services in Glamorgan Spring Bay Council region.

Key takeouts of the survey of Glamorgan Spring Bay residents:

- 44% of respondents: Timeliness of appointment was frequently or very frequently a barrier to accessing health services
- 21% of respondents: Cost of appointment was frequently or very frequently a barrier to accessing health services
- 16% of respondents: Transport was frequently or very frequently a barrier to accessing health services
- 95% of respondents see a GP locally, but only 49% see a nurse locally
- 86% of respondents Agreed or Strongly Agreed that "the Government needs to act to improve health services"



Tasmania Fire Service works closely with communities, local government, service providers and other government agencies to create *Community Bushfire Protection Plans* and implement bushfire risk management strategies.

Community Bushfire Protection Plans are tailored to individual communities at risk of being impacted by bushfire, to help people in these areas to prepare their own Bushfire Plan.

Tasmania Fire Service Acting Director Community Fire Safety, Chris Collins, said it was important for people to be prepared for when a bushfire threatens their community, regardless of whether they choose to stay and defend their homes, or leave early.

"Understanding the risks of bushfire and taking steps to mitigate these risks is important for everyone, but especially those living in bushfire prone areas," he

"We want to make sure people are informed, prepared and ready for when a bushfire threatens."

There are currently 139 Community Bush-fire Protection Plans in place across Tasmania, with five new plans recently developed for the areas of Smithton, Ridgley, Irishtown and Edith Creek, Geilston Bay – Mornington and Primrose Sands. Additionally, nine existing plans have been updated in the areas of Rosebery, Lady Barron, Derwent Bridge, Nubeena, Margate, Sandfly, Middleton, Molesworth and Cradle Valley.



BOATING ALONE & OLDER

With summer now here, all boaties across Tasmania are looking forward to Christmas and beyond.

Fishing, diving, water-skiing or just cruising the wonderful and world-renowned offshore waters around Tasmania.

Many of these activities we do with family and friends, but many of us – myself included – still love to jump into the boat and head off alone.

And that is where people can get into trouble unless they plan properly and are well-prepared when on the water.

The sad reality is that since 2001, Tasmania has recorded 18 fatalities – all men aged over 70 who have all been boating alone.

Coroner's report after coroner's report have noted repeated failings and errors by people boating alone.

Again, we want to make it very clear that MAST does not believe boatie3s should not go out alone.

But we all need to follow the basic rules of staying safe:

- Wear a life jacket that you know has been serviced and will operate properly; you can self-check it each and every time you go out.
- Also, use a kill-cord when operating a powered vessel on your own.

Since 2001, when the compulsory wearing of life jackets was introduced, we have seen 63 recreational boating fatalities.

That amounts to some 2.7 deaths per year over more than two decades – obviously way too many and just like on our State's roads, we need to continue to drive this figure to zero.

In Tasmania, 94% of the boating public wear their life jackets, which is a world-leading statistic.

Before their compulsory introduction, in the 22 years before lost 146 people - 6.5

per year – so life jackets do save lives. Statistically, that's 90 lives that have possibly been saved since 2001.

The safety culture with Tassie's boating public has changed for the better, but we always need to be thinking ahead when on the water".

MAST has the sad and ongoing task of analysing coroners' reports, looking for ways to continue to educate Tasmanians in boating safety.

Comments like these from Coroners reports,

"I make particular note of the fact that none of three men were wearing personal flotation devices."

"Weather and sea conditions – the decision to proceed out in those conditions was obviously wade by some or all of the occupants and must be said, in retrospect, to have been an error of judgement."

"Safety equipment such EPIRBs and flares must be carried in such a way as to be easily accessible."

"The actions of all involved were foolhardy and reckless and showed a lack of basic boating knowledge and skill.".

"I also comment that it is essential that all paddlers have the proper equipment."

MAST wants everyone who goes boating this summer to come home safely but at the same time enjoy their time on the water.

Do the basics:

- Check the weather if it's not good or it's going to turn rough, don't go out
- Check your life jackets
- Check that your safety equipment is up to date and accessible
- Tell some one where you are going and when you expect to be back
- Turn your radio on to channel 16

For the summer of 2023-24: "Be Boatwise – Don't make your next trip your last."


