TASMANIAN COMMUNITY FUND SUPPORTS COMMUNITY WELLBEING THROUGH \$1.159M WORTH OF COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE GRANTS

The Tasmanian Community Fund (TCF) has provided \$1.159 million worth of funding to seven projects that improve wellbeing through community infrastructure throughout Tasmania.

Projects included in the funding are a new bike track at Rokeby Primary School for community use, an upgraded playground at the Launceston Women's Shelter, and the safe expansion of Wyndarra Support Services for the most vulnerable in the Circular Head community.

The establishment of a skate and wheel park in Bicheno, a community garden greenhouse in the Great Lake area, construction of a workshop for locomotives to improve skills and employment prospects in the Derwent Valley, and the installation of accessible toilet amenities at the Willow Court Barracks building to unlock the potential for the site to be used as a community arts precinct are also included in the project funding.

TCF Chair Sally Darke said the community infrastructure grant projects were focused on improving the wellbeing of rural, regional and disadvantaged communities.

"Our communities are evolving and it is important that we are able to meet the needs of our communities," she said. "These infrastructure projects were identified as helping communities facing barriers to positive community wellbeing, whether that was through location or circumstance, and would provide major benefits to the wellbeing of the people in those communities."

The Bicheno Community Development Association received a \$300,000 grant to develop a Skate and Wheel Park for skateboards, scooters and bikes.

Set to begin construction in March 2022, the Skate and Wheel Park will provide the younger residents in Bicheno with the opportunity to participate in more sport and recreational activities.

"There are numerous places here for adults like the golf club, bowls club, petanque and tennis, but there is nothing specifically aimed for the kids," Bicheno Community Development Association Committee Member/Convenor Pamela Troode said.

"The Skate and Wheel Park will be a great investment for the future of the town, especially during the Summer months when many shack owners and tourists visit."

Being a focal point for stopovers for trips up the East Coast, it's hoped visitors using the facility will spend locally, which will provide flow-on benefits to the town. "In the future, we envisage the second stages of development to include barbecues to turn it into a recreational park for families and visitors alike," Ms Troode said.

Community fundraising efforts also raised more than \$57,000 towards the skate park through sausage sizzles and raffles organised by volunteers, parents and their children, with 818 signatures of support gained.

"The community seemed to be very generous because they strongly supported the skate park and we had many unsolicited cash donations," Ms Troode said.

The Tasmanian Community Fund was established in 1999 following the sale of the Trust Bank.
