

SWANSEA COMMUNITY HUB FUNDS BENEFITTING THE COMMUNITY

The Swansea Community Hub, comprising the Community & Men's Shed and the Re-Use Shoppe, is very grateful to all the people who donate their unwanted items which would otherwise go to the waste transfer station (WTS). The Re-Use Shoppe gives them a second chance at a new home. Items which need some TLC make their way to the Community & Men's Shed for refurbishment, and then into the shop for sale.

The Community & Men's Shed members focus on special projects that they have been asked to work on. School students also utilise this space to learn about woodworking. The Community & Men's Shed is a space for men and women to work on projects and to share friendship.

The Swansea Community Hub has a fully equipped kitchen and a 'community room' with meeting room tables and chairs. These spaces are available for hire through the Swansea Community Hub on 0432415516.

We also seek to clarify the arrangement between the Re-Use Shoppe in Arnol Street (run by volunteers) and the waste transfer station (WTS) in Maria Street (run by Council). Furniture and items taken to the shed at the WTS are the responsibility of the Re-Use Shoppe, and recyclable items at the WTS can be purchased through the Re-Use Shoppe. Council employees at the WTS cannot take money for items housed at the WTS. If you are interested in purchasing an item from the shed utilised by the Community & Men's Shed at the WTS, you must first pay for the item at the Re-Use Shoppe and collect a receipt. The receipt must be presented to the Council employee at the WTS to collect your purchase. Ideally, we would like the Re-Use Shoppe to be open to match the hours of the WTS, to simplify the payment and collection process, but we are lacking volunteers. If you would like us to extend the Re-Use Shoppe's opening hours, we would like to hear from you in relation to volunteering.

Funds raised through the above methods are shared in so many ways into our community. Recent donations have been made to May Shaw Emergency Ward for electric beds; to May Shaw Nursing Home for a ride on lawn mower to maintain the grounds; and contribution to the beach wheelchairs. Some other recipients are the Swansea Primary School for the 5/6 class education adventure to Canberra; the Swansea TAS Community Garden group who plan to breathe new life into the garden; and the Swansea Christmas Parade.

We appreciate your membership, donations and patronage of our Community Hub.



Due to the short timeframe between meetings, there were no planning matters to be considered. Following an extensive review of the budget by staff, Councillors supported a proposed revised budget to provide certainty to some projects and infrastructure work.

At the meeting we adopted a Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy that is one of the first steps in becoming a child safe organisation in accordance with the newly introduced Tasmanian Child and Youth Safe Organisations Act 2023. Over coming months, Council officers will be reviewing internal policies and procedures to align them with this new policy and ensuring that we embed child and youth safe practices and culture across all aspects of the organisation. It will not be an easy task and one that will require whole of local government sector support through the Local Government Association of Tasmania, but Council is committed to continuing this journey.

Councillors and staff were very pleased to receive the Audit Panel's report on the year. We were delighted to note the positive comments of our Audit Panel on the journey of renewal that we have undertaken so far.

Council positively supported the notice of motion from Clr Neil Edwards to have further water quality testing done in the Coles Bay area.

By the time you read this, the Bicheno Skate and Wheel Park will have been officially opened. This has been a 20-year journey for the Bicheno community that started when a group of young people fronted up to a Council meeting in the Bicheno Hall and requested Council's support for a skatepark. It is wonderful to see it now come to fruition and something for the young, and perhaps not so young, skateboarders and wheel riders to enjoy for years to come.

2024 is shaping up to be another busy year across the local government sector and in Glamorgan Spring Bay. All our staff are committed to doing the very best they can for our communities and as elected members the Councillors will support them in every way we can.

On behalf of the Deputy Mayor, Councillors, General Manager and all staff, I take this opportunity to wish everyone a very merry Christmas and a safe and happy New Year. As the General Manager regularly says, it's onwards and upwards for Glamorgan Spring Bay in 2024!


SWANSEA SERVICE STATION PUMPING AGAIN



CRACKING CRYPTIC CROSSWORDS

When I tell people that I've been setting cryptic crosswords for some community magazines, I quite often get a comment like "I don't do cryptics" along with a peculiar look and some awkward foot-shuffling that tells me I should change the subject. I'll say here and now that few satisfactions outshine the delight of cracking a good cryptic clue, even more a whole crossword. Sure, they're something of an acquired taste, but once you even begin to get the idea they're a whole lot more fun and satisfying than the so-called "quick" or "easy" crosswords, many of which are neither quick nor easy. So here's a hopefully quick and easy guide to solving crosswords of the cryptic type.

The thing most people may not realise is that with cryptic clues you get *two* clues for the price of one, which surely has to be good value! As well as the definition or synonym that you get in a 'straight' clue (almost always at the beginning or the end of the cryptic clue), you also get coded instructions for assembling the right answer from its constituent letters. These instructions can be in the form of anagrams (letter jumbles), charades (like the party game), double meanings, homophones (words spoken similarly but spelt differently), hidden words (embedded in other words or phrases), first and/or last letters of words as well as lots of bits and pieces like Roman numerals, compass points, chemical symbols (like AU for gold), abbreviations (like 'L' for left, 'ET' for alien) etc.

Good cryptic clues rely on lateral as well as literal thinking, so if you get stuck think about how else you might interpret the information presented in the clue. Some puzzles have a theme that might help with solving. It is Christmas, after all! So have a go, and enjoy those little moments of insight that a good cryptic puzzle can offer!


